ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION : NIGHT-WORK OF WOMEN
AND YOUNG PERSONS.

Vollzugsanweisung des Staatsamtes für soziale Verwaltung vom 6. März, 1920, St. G. Bl. Nr. 108, über die Verwendung von Frauen und Jugendlichen im Gast- und Schankgewerbe zur Nachtzeit. (Amtliche Nachrichten II, S. 243.)

Administrative Instruction of the State Department for Social Welfare respecting the employment of women and young persons at night in inns and public-houses. Dated 6th March, 1920.

1. (1) Young persons, irrespective of sex, who have not completed their 16th year of age may be employed in inns and public-houses until 10 p.m., provided that their night's rest amounts to not less than 9 consecutive hours, and that they are allowed an uninterrupted rest period of not less than 2 hours in the course of the day.

(2) Women and male young persons who have completed their 16th year of age shall be exempt from the provisions of the Act* if their maximum working hours are fixed by collective agreement, or if they are allowed a rest period of not less than 9 consecutive hours.

2. This Administrative Instruction shall come into force a fortnight after the date of its publication.
