Clinic Sessions

The most important development of the work during the year has been the attempt to deal with the ever increasing numbers by decentralising the sessions. It was thought impracticable to hold more sessions in North Kensington itself, and as a great many patients come from outlying parts of London, the experiment has been tried of *travelling Clinics*. A doctor, nurse and lay worker, taking all the equipment with them from North Kensington, have been paying regular visits to three outer districts, Edgware, Hayes and Hounslow. Premises have been hired in each district. The number of new patients as well as the return visits of old patients from Telford Road, have fully justified the experiment. In fact in Hounslow the demand is so overwhelming that it has been decided to acquire permanent premises there, and to establish a Branch Clinic on a permanent basis.

The following are the particulars of these travelling Clinics to date :—

EDGWARE was opened in the Watling L.C.C. Estate at the Community Centre, Orange Hill Road, in November, 1937. Medical Officer : Dr. Greta Graff. One session a month was held until July 1938 (the period covered by this report) since when there are two sessions monthly, and there were :

32 new patients ; 61 return visits ; total 93 visits.

HAYES was opened in February 1938, at Unity House, Morgan's Lane. Medical Officer : Dr. Glenna Coventry. Two sessions a month were held from the start. For the period February 1st to July 31st there were :

98 new patients ; 120 return visits ; total 218 visits.

HOUNSLOW was opened in November 1937, and is now held at the Labour Hall, 20 Heath Road, Hounslow. Medical Officer : Dr. Mary Day. Only one session a month was held here, in spite of the necessity for more, because until now premises were not available for a second session. For the period November 1st to July 31st there were :

95 new patients ; 108 return visits ; total 203 visits.

Note : These figures do not include as *new* patients those old North Kensington patients who, as they live in or near these districts, now return to the branch Clinics. They are however in the return figures given for these branch sessions and not in the North Kensington figures quoted at the head of this report.

The Committee warmly thank Dr. Graff, Dr. Coventry and Mrs. Farley (the nurse) as they gave their services gratuitously until the use of the Branch Clinics was tested and proved.

The return visits continue to be very encouraging. Last year they had reached 90 per cent of the patients, and they are now 93 per cent. The gynaecological numbers have taken a sudden leap during the year, which is a welcome sign that the work, which is to a great extent pioneer, has at last been recognised as an essential service, not only for working mothers but for their daughters. A very satisfactory aspect of this side of the work is the increasing number of patients who come for advice on sterility. Very many of these are now mothers.

Talks to Women and Girls on General and Sex Physiology

There has been rapid development of this side of the work. Last year it was reported that these talks were held at the Clinic and were very much appreciated. But it was found difficult to get *new* audiences to come to the Clinic. The collecting of an audience entailed a visit or visits to factories, clubs, Women's Co-operative Guilds, &c., &c., and it was therefore decided to send speakers to such organisations, instead of attempting to get the members to come to the Clinic. Mrs. Cumming, who has done a great deal of speaking and organising, and is a trained nurse, was appointed on a half-time basis to arrange these talks, and to explain in a preliminary talk their object and general content. The main talks are given by women doctors of whom a panel has now been formed. The doctors are paid an honorarium for each talk.

Between February 16th and July 31st, 33 talks were given, to audiences of between 15 and 40 women. They were held at such institutions as Nursery Schools; Y.W.C.A. Girls Clubs and Women's Clubs; Women's Co-operative Guilds; Mission Clubs. A short syllabus has been prepared and the talks are given either singly or as a series. There is little doubt as to the value of these talks and if readers of this report can suggest other institutions to which the lecturers might be sent, their help would be much appreciated.

Literature

The development of the talks emphasized a need which had long been felt at the Clinic, for simple literature which could be read in connection with the lectures, by listeners and by patients who wanted more detailed information. A small *ad hoc* committee was formed to draw up a list of requirements, to search existing literature for suitable short pamphlets, which could be bought cheaply and distributed to listeners and patients, and to arrange for the writing and publication of leaflets on subjects which had not yet been adequately dealt with in this way.

The following report was submitted :

Birth Control

A leaflet has been written in consultation with some members of the Medical Staff, under the heading *What Birth Control Is*. This has been published by the N.B.C.A. and is on sale to all Clinics. It is now being widely distributed at the North Kensington Centre. A new paragraph will be incorporated in this leaflet giving some explanation of Clinic procedure, from the patient's point of view.

Marital Difficulties

Dr. Malleson has written and published four pamphlets dealing with various aspects of this subject. These are in use at the Clinic.

Physiology

The Committee recommend a booklet published by the British Social Hygiene Council, *Yourself and Your Body*, by Violet Swaisland. This is on sale to patients at the Clinic.

Children and Sex Teaching

The Committee recommend a booklet by Percy Lee, *The Child and Parents' Attitude to Sex*—also published by the British Social Hygiene Council. This too is on sale at the Clinic.

The National Birth Control Association

The Clinic has worked in close co-operation throughout the year with the N.B.C.A. An interesting experiment is being tried with a new case card designed by Dr. Blacker, with the object of facilitating the compilation of statistics. It is hoped that in time all Clinics will use a uniform type of case card.

The Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting was held at the Clinic itself for the first time. It gave a welcome opportunity to subscribers and their friends to see the premises and discuss the arrangement of the work. The Chairman addressed the meeting on the development of the Talks scheme.

Executive Committee

The Committee has met six times during the year, and has been greatly helped in its work by a fortnightly meeting of the officers and certain workers at the Clinic, who have been able to deal with those matters which need immediate attention but which tended previously to take up too much time at the Executive meetings.

Mrs. Pain, has replaced Mrs. Paterson as the representative of the Paddington Borough Council Maternity and Child Welfare Committee. Dr. Pasmore, who practises in North Kensington, has also joined the Committee. The Committee have accepted with regret the resignation of Mrs. Rubinstein through ill-health, of Lady Gater and Mrs. Wilson because of their inability to attend meetings, and of Mrs. Paterson because she felt that Paddington was adequately represented by Mrs. Pain. It is hoped to fill these vacancies by representatives from districts of the Branch Clinics, though no appointments have yet been made.

Medical Committee and Medical Staff

Dr. Marjory Edwards has resigned her chairmanship of the Medical Committee, as she offered her services to the Chinese Medical Mission and sailed for China in August. The Clinic will miss her extremely able help and advice, but all her fellow workers and the Executive Committee admire her public spirit and wish her well in her arduous undertaking.

Her place on the Committee has been filled by Dr. Rorke, who is most warmly welcomed back. It will be remembered that Dr. Rorke was the first gynaecological officer of the Clinic, and the initial success of the gynaecological work is largely due to her wise guidance and skill in its early days, when there were many difficulties to be overcome.

The two new medical officers at Hounslow and Hayes, Dr. Mary Day and Dr. Glenna Coventry, have joined the Medical Committee.

It has been decided, on the recommendation of the Medical Committee to appoint a Medical Registrar, whose position will be comparable with that of a Registrar at any of the London teaching hospitals, and whose function would be the supervision of the medical records and the compilation of statistical data from them.

Thanks

The Committee cordially thank all those who have helped with the work of the Clinic during the past year.

Finance

The year now under review has presented the Committee with a new type of problem. For the first time the possibilities of expansion, which have always existed and which still exist, have been limited not by financial considerations as in the past, but by lack of accommodation at the existing premises. The Committee therefore have felt justified in making the experiment of extending the Clinic's activities over a wider area, by hiring additional premises in other parts of London. This is an ambitious venture both in finance and administration, but the Committee have long realized that there are many potential patients who are quite unable to make the journey to North Kensington, either for economic or domestic reasons, and who would welcome the services of the Clinic in their own district.

An earlier section of this report has described the success of this experiment and told of the decision to acquire permanent premises for one of the Branch Clinics. This development, though it will absorb existing resources, can be expanded at a relatively low cost. How far it will be desirable to retain the management of such branches in the hands of the central organisation remains to be seen; but it will certainly be the object to form local committees as far as possible, and so to arouse a local sense of responsibility for the work. It must however be remembered that all the three districts at present covered by this scheme are working-class, and it is very unlikely that they would ever be self-supporting or able to dispense with a large subsidy from central funds.

The Executive Committee hope that their action in expanding the work of the Clinic geographically will meet with the approval of subscribers. Their generosity has in the past encouraged a bold financial policy, which has been amply justified by its success; and the Committee now rely on supporters to maintain the advance which has been made.

Finally, the Committee wish to express sincere thanks to all supporters, whether private subscribers, cinemas who make grants out of the proceeds of Sunday performances, or Local Authorities. Special thanks are given to those private

subscribers who have entered into covenants for the payment of their subscriptions, thus giving additional help to the Clinic without any further expense to themselves. In the hope that others will follow their example, a short description of the working of this system of paying subscription is given below.

Any subscriber who enters into a covenant to pay his subscription for a period of seven years (though without imposing any liability on his executors if he should die within this period) assists the Clinic in the following way. The covenant is to pay the gross amount which, after deduction of income tax at the current rate, equals the subscription usually paid. The subscriber thus pays the same amount as before (being entitled to deduct income tax on payments made under such a covenant) and the Clinic as a charity recovers the income tax. Forms of covenant can be obtained from the Clinic Superintendent.
