ANNUAL REPORT.

YOUR Committee have great satisfaction in presenting their Report on this the first meeting of your Society since the amalgamation of the two London Committees, namely, the Central and Western Society for Women's Suffrage and the Central and East of England Society for Women's Suffrage, under the present title of the Central Society for Women's Suffrage.

Notwithstanding the harmonious working of the two Committees, it was felt that the position of the Women's Suffrage movement would be greatly strengthened if the two Committees were to join and form one Central Society.

It was also felt that this step would very much simplify the work of organisation, and would remove any impression that might prevail as to any difference in policy existing between the two Societies.

Your Society is now represented on the Committee of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies by the four following representatives:—The Lady Frances Balfour, Mrs. Broadley Reid, Mrs. Henry Fawcett, LL.D., and Mrs. Russell Cooke.

The efforts made to bring forward the Women's Suffrage question in Parliament this Session were unsuccessful. Those Members who balloted for a Women's Suffrage Bill did not obtain a place in the ballot. The next step taken by the friends of the movement in the House of Commons was to

ballot for a resolution. Lieut.-General Laurie and Mr. T. C. Taylor were successful in obtaining third and fourth place respectively, and the resolutions were set down for Tuesday, March the 19th. On March 6th it was announced that the Government would take all the Tuesdays up to Easter, and therefore the resolution could not be brought forward. Later in the Session Mr. Brynmôr Jones was successful in obtaining first place for a resolution, and it was put down for Tuesday, June 4th. The Government, however, adjourned for Whitsuntide over that date, and no further opportunity occurred during the Session of bringing the question forward again. A fuller account of the Parliamentary proceedings will appear in the Report of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies in February, 1902.

The work of re-organisation, consequent on the fusion of the two Societies, has necessarily entailed some suspension in the outside work during the early part of the year, but the enrolling of members and associates has been proceeding steadily.

One hundred and nineteen members have joined through the local organisation work since December, 1900, and Honorary Secretaries have this year been appointed in Croydon, Hammersmith, and in the Reigate and Wimbledon divisions of Surrey.

A debate on Women's Suffrage was held by the Hardwicke Society, at the Middle Temple Hall, in June. The Hon. W. P. Reeves, Agent-General for New Zealand, opened. Mr. Rufus Isaacs, K.C., Miss Whitehead, Mrs. Corrie Grant, Mrs. Russell Cooke, Mr. Justice Darling and Mr. Allen Upward took part in the debate.

A resolution in favour of Women's Suffrage was carried by a large majority.

On September 25th, 1901, the Women's Franchise Bill in New South Wales was rejected, on a Third Reading in the Legislative Council, by the small majority of five votes.

The Bill had passed Second Reading in the Legislative Assembly on August 22nd by 51 votes to 7, and the Third Reading was carried by 56 to 18.

According to the *Sydney Mail* the defeat of the Bill in the Upper House was caused by the amendment making women eligible to sit in Parliament.

This amendment had been moved in the Legislative Assembly by the opponents of the measure with the object of wrecking the Bill in the Legislative Council.

On September 30th it was announced that the Premier, Mr. Lee, had declared his intention to reintroduce the Bill at the beginning of next Session, and that he is determined to secure the passing of the measure before the expiration of the present Parliament.

On June 21st a Memorial from workers for Women's Suffrage was presented to Mr. Balfour.

The Memorial had been prepared for presentation in the previous Parliament, but was withheld owing to extra pressure of political questions of Imperial concern.

The following is the text of the Memorial :—

TO THE RIGHT HON. A. J. BALFOUR, M.P., First Lord of the Treasury.

THE MEMORIAL OF WORKERS FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE,

RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH :—

That your Memorialists are persons who have worked, many of them during a long series of years, to procure the removal of the Electoral Disabilities of Women.

That they see with pain that the claims of women to representation, which were affirmed by the present Parliament on February 3rd, 1897, have been again set aside and the day for their further consideration absorbed by Government business. They submit that such action increases the sense of injustice already widely felt by women, and that it is contrary to public policy to subject an intelligent and law-abiding section of the population to the stigma of entire exclusion from Parliamentary representation.

Your Memorialists therefore pray that the Government will give facilities to a measure for placing duly qualified women on the Parliamentary register.

The above was signed by eleven hundred and sixty-eight workers, namely, of those who began to work in—

The Memorial differs in character from previous Petitions, Memorials or Appeals to the Legislature on this question, in that its signatories are not from the wide outer class of sympathisers, but from the inner circle of workers who by active deeds have contributed to the movement through a long series of years.

The signatures have been arranged in the order of the years in which each joined the movement, so that the whole forms a record of the continuity and cumulative growth of the movement, and the Memorial, as a whole, bears witness to the

persistence and consistency of the claim for direct representation of women, and that protection of the vote which is the sole guarantee of liberty, and beside which all questions of public office or service sink to nothingness.

Mr. Balfour sent the following acknowledgment of the Memorial:—

DEAR MADAM,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of the Memorial on the subject of Women's Suffrage, signed by those who for more than a generation have been personally engaged in promoting the cause.

The document is certainly a most remarkable one and of great historic interest to those concerned in the movement.

Your Committee grieve to record the death, on April 8th, of one of their former leaders in the House of Commons. Mr. William Woodall's leadership will be always memorable in the annals of the movement for the strong stand he made in moving the addition of a Women's Suffrage Clause to Mr. Gladstone's Reform Bill of 1884, notwithstanding the heavy pressure brought to bear against him by the Government of the day.

With a brief interval, during which he held office in 1886, Mr. Woodall continued to hold the leadership of the Suffrage question until he again took office in 1892. At the General Election of last October he retired from Parliamentary life.

They have also to lament the loss, in the House of Commons, of the Hon. W. B. Beach, one of the steadiest voters for their measures—the only member left in the Parliament of 1901 who had voted in every Parliament since the movement began.

In Miss Arabella Shore, who passed away on January 9th, at the age of 78, their cause has lost a keen supporter, one whose enthusiasm did not cool, even after advancing years and ill-health prevented the active part she had long taken, more especially in connection with the Women's Liberal Federation.

The Dowager Lady Westbury, whose loss is deeply deplored by the Primrose League, for which she was a devoted worker, is also the loss of a valued sympathiser in the work of your Committee, to which she rendered much support at the time of the Special Appeal in 1893-94.

Your Committee desire to call attention to the fact that legislation on questions which concern women has, during the Session, again come up for discussion in the House of Commons, and to the practical illustration it affords of the need for the political enfranchisement of women, if they are to have a voice in matters which most closely concern them.

The Bill entitled "Marriage with a Deceased Wife's Sister" was debated this Session in the House of Commons, and in the course of the debate members stated what they believed to be the opinion of the women of this country on this question.

Mr. Griffith-Boscawen (Kent, Tunbridge Wells) asserted that, "The women of this country, as a whole, are almost unanimously opposed to this measure."

Mr. Eugene Wason (Clackmannan and Kinross), on the other hand, stated "that the whole of the womanhood of this country was in favour of the measure."

Whatever may be the opinion the majority of women may hold on this subject, it is evident that, unless they have

the power of expressing their wishes in the only constitutional and direct way, namely by the vote, no one can claim to speak on their behalf.

Earl Percy (South Kensington) put the position of women in its true light with regard not only to this particular measure, but also with regard to all measures affecting women, when he said, in the course of his speech in the House, "We are now asked to pass this change, which, whether it be good or bad, will vitally affect the life and happiness of every woman, married and unmarried, in this country, without asking the opinion of women, or allowing them to be heard in a House in which they are not represented. No one is a stronger opponent than I am of the proposal to grant the Parliamentary suffrage to women, but if we pass such a proposal as this, then the demand for the enfranchisement of women becomes absolutely unanswerable."

This testimony as to the need of the franchise for women, when at any time measures affecting them vitally may be passed without even their knowledge, comes with double weight from one who is opposed to the principle of Women's Suffrage.

The Factory and Workshops Act was amended and consolidated this Session. A measure which, for good or evil, will have far-reaching effects on the condition of women's work. Your Committee wish also to remind you that, in the previous Parliament, women were excluded from the Borough Councils Bill and rendered ineligible to sit on those Councils. They were thereby deprived of a right they had formerly possessed under the old Vestries.

Such exclusion gives another practical example of the difficulty which a large section of the population have in retaining any privilege extended to them, where not directly represented.

Your Committee would therefore, in bringing these instances before you, urge upon all the friends of the

movement the importance of pressing forward the claim of women to direct representation as the one means of ensuring that their opinion be made known on all those measures which year by year come forward dealing with social and industrial questions, and also as the only means of securing to them the possession of those rights and privileges they already enjoy.

CENTRAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S
SUFFRAGE.

The object of the Society is to obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for Women on the same conditions as it is, or may be, granted to men.

R U L E S .

- I.—The Society shall consist of Members and Associates.
- II.—Members shall be—
 - (a) Annual subscribers ;
 - (b) Donors during the current year of £1 and upwards ;
 - (c) Honorary officers.

Associates shall be those who have signified in writing their approval of the object of the Society.

III.—A General Meeting of the Society shall be held once a year to elect the Executive Committee, to receive the Annual Report and Financial Statement, and to transact any other business which may arise.

IV.—No person shall be proposed at the Annual Meeting for election on the Executive Committee, except on the requisition of six Members of the Society, addressed to the Executive Committee fourteen days before the Annual Meeting.

V.—A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called by the Executive Committee at any time ; or by the Secretary, on the written request of not less than twenty-five

Members of the Society. A Special General Meeting shall discuss only such matters as are mentioned in the notice calling such meeting.

VI.—Eight days' notice shall be given of all General Meetings to all persons qualified to vote.

VII.—All Members shall be entitled to vote at General Meetings of the Society, provided they have been Members for not less than three months previous to the time of voting.

VIII.—The Executive Committee shall consist of not more than twenty-four Members, exclusive of Members of Parliament to be elected at the Annual General Meeting.

IX.—The Executive Committee shall, at its first meeting, elect the Central Honorary Officers from among their number, appoint their Secretary or Secretaries and their local Honorary Secretaries. Vice-Presidents shall be elected by the Executive Committee from time to time.

X.—The ordinary meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held monthly. A special meeting can be called at any time at the request of not less than four Members of Committee.

XI.—The above Rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting of Members of the Society. Not less than fourteen days' notice of the meeting to consider the proposed alteration must be given to the Executive Committee, who must give an additional fourteen days' notice to the Members of the Society. The nature of the proposed change must be stated in the notice calling the meeting.

XII.—The Executive Committee shall have power to make or amend Bye-Laws.

BYE-LAWS.

1. Five shall form a quorum of the Executive Committee.
2. In preparing the list of persons to be nominated for Election on the Executive Committee, at the Annual Meeting, the number of attendances during the past year shall be an element of consideration.
3. Vice-Presidents shall be elected from past Members of Committee, from Members of Parliament, and from persons who have in various ways rendered useful service.
4. Honorary officers of Provincial Committees, who had formerly served as members of the Executive Committee, shall, on becoming Vice-Presidents, be entitled to attend the meetings of Committee as visitors.
5. Notice of not less than fourteen days shall be given of any proposed change in the Bye-Laws.

ANNUAL REPORT.

ALTHOUGH there has been no opportunity of taking the sense of the House of Commons this year on the claims of women to direct representation, your Committee have much pleasure in reporting that there have been unmistakeable signs of progress made in public opinion on the question of the Parliamentary enfranchisement of women.

The usual conference of Members of Parliament, friendly to Women's Suffrage, was held at the opening of the Session, on January 17th. The following Members of Parliament were present:—Sir C. McLaren, Bt., in the Chair, Mr. W. J. Galloway, Mr. J. D. Hope, Mr. Rigg, Mr. V. Davies, Mr. D. A. Thomas, General Laurie, Mr. W. Johnstone, Mr. Trevelyan, Sir W. Allan (Gateshead), Mr. Firbank, Mr. Reid, Mr. T. W. Russell, Mr. Plummer, Mr. Barratt, Mr. Grant, and Mr. Thomson.

A Sessional Committee was formed of the Members present; Sir Charles McLaren, Bt., was appointed Chairman and Mr. W. J. Galloway and Mr. Richard Rigg, Hon. Secs. The Members who balloted for a Woman's Suffrage Bill were unsuccessful in obtaining a place, and the Bill did not come before the House this Session.

On February 18th a Petition was presented to Parliament from women textile workers in Yorkshire and Cheshire, and keen interest was roused among the women workers of the two counties. The Yorkshire Petition bore the signatures of 33,184, and the Cheshire Petition 4,292 factory women.

The Yorkshire Petition was presented to the House by Mr. George Whiteley, M.P., and that from Cheshire by Mr. W. Bromley-Davenport, M.P.

THE TEXT OF PETITION IS AS FOLLOWS:—

“That in the opinion of your Petitioners the continued denial of the Franchise to Women is unjust and inexpedient.

“In the home their position is lowered by such an exclusion from the responsibilities of national life.

“In the factory their unrepresented condition places the regulation of their work in the hands of men who are often their rivals as well as their fellow workers.

“In Parliament it causes their interests to be neglected.

“Wherefore your Petitioners humbly pray that your Honourable House will pass a measure extending the Franchise to all qualified women.”

A meeting was arranged by this Society to welcome the members of the deputation of women textile workers on the evening of February 18th, at the Chelsea Town Hall. Mr. Richard Bell, M.P., presided. Six members of the deputation addressed the meeting.

The following resolutions were put to the meeting, and carried with enthusiasm:—

Resolution I.

“That this meeting offers its cordial welcome to the deputation of women textile workers from Lancashire, Yorkshire and Cheshire, and expresses its strong satisfaction at their zealous work for the enfranchisement of women, and the encouragement it gives to all those who are working for the same cause.

“*Moved by Mr. Keir Hardie, M.P.*

“*Seconded by Mrs. Arthur Francis (Central Society for Women's Suffrage)*”.

Resolution II.

"That this deputation, representing 66,800 women textile factory workers in Lancashire, Yorkshire and Cheshire, hereby declare their conviction and call on this meeting to resolve that the immediate possession of the franchise is of vital importance to women engaged in the industrial struggle for existence. They therefore urge the Members of Parliament and the trade unions to take immediate steps to secure the enfranchisement of the women workers of the country, who are suffering under the disability which inevitably keeps down their wages, and lowers their position in the labour market.

"*Moved by* Miss Reddish (Member of the Bolton School Board).

"*Seconded by* Mrs. Ellis (Bradford).

"*Supported by* Mrs. Winbolt (Stockport, Cheshire).
Miss Agnes Close (Leeds).
Miss Silcock (President of the Weavers' Union, Wigan).
Miss Heginbotham (Hyde, Cheshire)."

The position of women in the textile trades, from the point of view of numbers and of skill, is so unusual that their demand for enfranchisement comes with special force. There are in the three counties 311,000 women and only 217,000 men employed in these factories, while the skill of the women weavers is recognised as even exceeding that of the men.

Similar petitions are being signed by women working in the small trades of Lancashire. There is no doubt that the question is one which appeals to women workers from an economic standpoint, and that they have come to feel the necessity for the protection and power of a vote in the struggle of their industrial lives.

On March 20th a deputation of women graduates of the Universities of Great Britain and Ireland, which admit women to take degrees, presented a petition signed by 750 women graduates asking for the extension of the Parliamentary Franchise to women.

This deputation was received in a committee room of the House of Commons by Sir R. U. Penrose Fitzgerald, the Hon. John Talbot, Mr. Lecky, Mr. Campbell and Sir John Batty Tuke. The text of the petition is as follows:—

"To the Honourable the Commons of Great Britain and Ireland in Parliament assembled.

"The HUMBLE PETITION of the undersigned Women Graduates of the Universities of London, Victoria, Durham, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Aberdeen, and St. Andrew's; the University of Wales, and the Royal University of Ireland,

"Sheweth—

"That your Petitioners, being Graduates of Universities in the United Kingdom—many of them actually qualified to be registered as voters for the representation of their University—are of opinion that lack of political status causes serious detriment to women in matters affecting their work and influence in education.

"They submit—

"(A) That the needs of girls and women for technical education have met with very inadequate recognition;

"(B) That in the secondary schools the claims of girls to a fair share of educational endowments are not recognised;

"(C) That in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge, women who have passed all the qualifying examinations are not admitted to degrees.

"Further your Petitioners regard with alarm any proposals to create local educational authorities for primary and secondary schools to which women would not be eligible for election.

"They submit that the education of the children of the country is largely in the hands of women, who are nevertheless at serious economic disadvantage in their profession, owing to their exclusion from the franchise, and that the only permanent safeguard to the present and future interests of women in all matters of education is the recognition of their claim to be registered as Parliamentary electors.

"Wherefore your Petitioners humbly pray your Honourable House to pass a measure enfranchising those women who have the qualifications entitling men to vote."

At the meeting of the Trades Union Congress this year, in London, the following Resolution was brought forward by Mr. Allan Gee (Huddersfield):—

"That the time has now arrived when in the economic interests of women, the franchise should be extended to them on the same terms as it is or may be to men."

The Resolution was opposed by Mr. Freak (Leicester) and was lost by 6 votes, 103 voting for, 109 against. A great deal of active help in the work of promoting petitions from the Women Textile Workers has been given by Members of Trades Unions. A Petition has also been largely signed by officials of Trades Unions and Trades Councils including Birmingham Trades and Labour Councils, representing 28,000 members; Manchester Trade Council, 21,450; and the Leicester and Swansea Trades Council, each representing 20,000 members.

At the Council Meeting of the National Union of Women Workers, held at Edinburgh on Thursday, October 30th, the following Resolution, sent up by the Committee of the National

Union of Women's Suffrage Societies, was brought before the meeting and carried with only four dissentients.

Resolution—

"That without the firm foundation of the Parliamentary franchise for women, there is no security for any advance gained by them."

The Resolution was moved by Miss Louisa Stevenson (Edinburgh), and seconded by Mrs. Arthur Francis (London). The Resolution was carried with four dissentients.

At the meeting of the Annual Council of the Women's Liberal Federation on May 6th, at Westbourne Park Chapel, Lady Aberdeen in the chair, the following Resolution was moved on behalf of the Cambridge Women's Liberal Association by Lady Carlisle, seconded by Mrs. Bamford Slack, and carried.

"This Council records its conviction that the assistance given by Liberal Women to candidates of Parliament who will, if elected, vote against the enfranchisement of women, often produces on politicians the impression that women are not in earnest in demanding their enfranchisement. This Council, therefore, instructs the Executive that the official organiser of the Federation be sent to help those candidates only who would support Women's Suffrage in the House of Commons."

By the death of Mr. W. Johnston, M.P. (Belfast, South), in July, the cause of just legislation for women has lost one of its truest friends in the House of Commons.

Your Committee desire here to record their remembrance of the earnest support received from Mr. Johnston from the date of his first vote in favour of Mr. Jacob Bright's Bill in 1871 to the end of his life.

Your Committee deeply regret to record the death of Miss Rosamund Davenport Hill, which took place on August 5th. The work amongst neglected children and for Industrial Schools which she had made pre-eminently her own, long before as well as during her eighteen years' service on the London School Board, may seem removed from the province of Suffrage work, but services such as she rendered to the Commonwealth gave added force to her zealous upholding of the claim of women to citizenship. From the days when Miss Davenport Hill worked in the pioneer group who carried out the first Petition in favour of the Parliamentary franchise for women until her death the Suffrage cause had her steady support whenever occasion arose.

The presence of the Premiers of Australia and New Zealand in London for the Coronation afforded your Committee

an opportunity for approaching Sir Edmund Barton and Mr. Seddon with congratulatory addresses on the enfranchisement of women in Australasia.

In reply to a request from your Committee, Sir Edmund Barton appointed to receive a deputation on July 31st, at the Hotel Cecil. The deputation was introduced by Lady Onslow, and consisted of the following ladies:—Mrs. Ayrton, M.I.E.E., the Lady Frances Balfour, Miss Blackburn, Miss Annie Leigh Browne, Mrs. Russell Cooke, Miss Cons, Miss Rodger Cunliffe, Mrs. Henry Fawcett, LL.D., Miss Gurney, the Hon. Mrs. A. T. Lyttelton, Miss Edith Palliser, Miss Rosalind Paget, Miss Stone, the Lady Henry Somerset and Mrs. Donohoe, of New South Wales.

Mrs. Fawcett read the following address:—

“Sir,—We venture to express to you, the official representative of the Commonwealth of Australia, the interest and gratification with which we have noted the recent adoption of Women’s Suffrage as part of the electoral system of the Federated Parliament of this important group of States.

“Several of us have for many years worked in support of the principle of Women’s Suffrage in the United Kingdom. We claim that wherever it has been adopted it has worked well, that former opponents have been converted by experience into supporters, and that none of the evils confidently predicted of it before its adoption have attended its actual working. We shall be glad to learn your experience on these points.

“We have naturally watched with peculiar interest the gradually increasing strength of the principle of Women’s Suffrage in Britain beyond the seas. Its adoption in New Zealand in 1893, South Australia in 1894, Western Australia in 1899, now followed within the last few weeks in the Commonwealth of Australia, affords us the greatest and most practical

encouragement we have yet received, and materially strengthens our demand for Women’s Suffrage in this country, for it cannot be maintained that the women of the United Kingdom are unworthy to share in privileges which have been entrusted, with the almost unanimous approval of the whole community, to their sisters in the Colonies.

“We take this opportunity of your presence among us to thank you for the lead given to the old country by your example, to ask you for any information you may possess as to the prospects of Women’s Suffrage in such of the Australian States as have not yet adopted it (*i.e.*, Victoria, New South Wales, Tasmania and Queensland), and to request you to extend your sympathy and support to us in our efforts to secure a similar reform in the United Kingdom.”

Similarly Mr. Seddon, having appointed August 7th to receive a deputation, and the following ladies waited upon him at the Hotel Cecil:—Mrs. Percy Bunting, the Honourable Mrs. F. C. Colborne, Mrs. Henry Fawcett, LL.D., Lady Penrose FitzGerald, Mrs. Charles Greenwood, Miss Gurney, Miss Lidgett, Miss Lile and Miss Edith Palliser.

The following address was handed to Mr. Seddon:—

“Sir,

“We venture to address to you, as the official representative of New Zealand on the occasion of the Coronation of our King, the interest and gratification with which the successful working of Women’s Suffrage in your Colony has been watched by those who, like ourselves, have for many years advocated its adoption in the Mother Country.

“We also wish to express to you our gratitude for the manner in which you have repeatedly called the attention of the English public to the successful practical working of

Women's Suffrage. You have been able to state from your own experience that it has worked well and that none of the evils at one time confidently predicted of it have been found to attend its actual operation. This has been of peculiar value to the movement, for our countrymen are more apt to be impressed by practical experience than by merely theoretical arguments.

"We cannot forget that New Zealand was the first British Colony to adopt Women's Suffrage, and that its example was quickly followed by South Australia, Western Australia, and more recently by the Federal Parliament of the Australian Commonwealth. The growing feeling of kinship between the Mother Country and the Colonies cannot but make us hope that one of the results of drawing closer the bonds which unite us together will be the adoption at home, of the principle to the soundness of which you are able to testify, that the representative assembly of the nation ought to represent the whole and not one-half only of its citizens."

The replies of Sir Edmund Barton and Mr. Seddon to the foregoing addresses were of a most impressive and encouraging character; they are among the most useful of the Society's recent publications. They confidently predicted the adoption of Women's Suffrage in New South Wales and Victoria—a prophecy which, as regards the former Colony, was almost immediately fulfilled, for on August 13th a Bill, granting full suffrage to the women of New South Wales, passed its final stage.*

The following resolution was sent to Miss Rose Scott, Hon. Sec. of the New South Wales Womanhood Franchise League:—

"Resolution.—That the Executive Council of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies send their

hearty congratulations to Miss Rose Scott and the New South Wales Womanhood Franchise League on the victory which has crowned their efforts in the cause of the Parliamentary enfranchisement of the women of New South Wales."

South Australia, Western Australia and New South Wales have now accepted Women's Suffrage, and full Women's Suffrage is likewise established in the election of both Houses of the Federal Parliament of the Australian Commonwealth.

Reference was made in our last year's Report to the legislative measures affecting women which yearly come up for consideration in the House of Commons, and this year the debate in the House on the Education Bill has once more called attention to the fact that women are constantly in danger of losing the rights and privileges they already possess, because they are unrepresented.

It has fallen to the opponents of Women's Suffrage to point out the anomalous position in which women are placed owing to their having no voice in the making of the laws by which they are governed. Last year it was Earl Percy who pleaded the injustice of passing a measure vitally affecting all women on which their opinion had not been ascertained, and this year Mr. James Bryce, in speaking on the Education Bill at a meeting convened by the Women's Local Government Society in April last, said that "women ought not to trust to the mere casual benevolence of men to do what was necessary for them, and ought to use what influence they possessed to endeavour to see that their views were carried out."—(*Times* report, April 24th, 1902.)

On November 7th, speaking in the House of Commons on the debate on the Education Bill, Mr. Bryce said that "those who like himself had never been able to vote for giving

the Parliamentary Franchise to women, and had asked women to be content with the good will of Parliament, and the care which Parliament showed for their interests must feel that this was an occasion on which they were bound to show that goodwill and care." (*Times* report, November 8th). Most people would not, however, be able to distinguish between the "goodwill of Parliament" and "the mere casual benevolence of men"; especially after the object lesson afforded them by the exclusion of women from the Borough Councils Bill, thereby depriving them of the privileges they formerly enjoyed under the old vestries. On that occasion Members of both Houses, those who were in favour of as well as those who were opposed to the inclusion of women in the Bill, gave their unanimous testimony to the good work done by women on the vestries, but the final result of the debate was that the public was deprived of their services. Here then the practical result of "using the influence women already possessed to see that their views were carried out" was not such as to inspire the unrepresented with confidence that their interests could be safely left to the "goodwill and care of Parliament."

Those who recognise the value of the work done by women, but who are opposed to granting them political rights, have lately shown some anxiety lest the object lessons afforded by the debates on legislative measures affecting women should have the effect of strengthening their claim to representation. There is no doubt that this anxiety is justified. Year by year the work contributed by women to the State increases, and year by year this work is rendered increasingly difficult owing to the artificial disqualifications and restrictions which hamper women in the performance of their duties. They are beginning to realise the force of the statement with regard to indirect influence, once made by Mr. George Wyndham, namely, "that in politics as in mechanics the more indirect the action the greater the friction."

The recent legislative measures have had a very educative effect in rousing the attention of women to the insecure position they occupy as the unrepresented part of the community, and have done more to gain adherents to the movement for the Parliamentary enfranchisement of women than all the arguments advanced in its support from the platform or the press.

CENTRAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

The object of the Society is to obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for Women on the same conditions as it is, or may be, granted to men.

RULES.

I.—The Society shall consist of Members and Associates.

II.—Members shall be—

- (a) Annual subscribers ;
- (b) Donors during the current year of £1 and upwards ;
- (c) Honorary officers.

Associates shall be those who have signified in writing their approval of the object of the Society.

III.—A General Meeting of the Society shall be held once a year to elect the Executive Committee, to receive the Annual Report and Financial Statement, and to transact any other business which may arise.

IV.—No person shall be proposed at the Annual Meeting for election on the Executive Committee, except on the requisition of six Members of the Society, addressed to the Executive Committee fourteen days before the Annual Meeting.

V.—A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called by the Executive Committee at any time ; or by the Secretary, on the written request of not less than twenty-five

Members of the Society. A Special General Meeting shall discuss only such matters as are mentioned in the notice calling such meeting.

VI.—Eight days' notice shall be given of all General Meetings to all persons qualified to vote.

VII.—All Members shall be entitled to vote at General Meetings of the Society, provided they have been Members for not less than three months previous to the time of voting.

VIII.—The Executive Committee shall consist of not more than twenty-four Members, exclusive of Members of Parliament, to be elected at the Annual General Meeting.

IX.—The Executive Committee shall, at its first meeting, elect the Central Honorary Officers from among their number, appoint their Secretary or Secretaries and their local Honorary Secretaries. Vice-Presidents shall be elected by the Executive Committee from time to time.

X.—The ordinary meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held monthly. A special meeting can be called at any time at the request of not less than four Members of Committee.

XI.—The above Rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting of Members of the Society. Not less than fourteen days' notice of the meeting to consider the proposed alteration must be given to the Executive Committee, who must give an additional fourteen days' notice to the Members of the Society. The nature of the proposed change must be stated in the notice calling the meeting.

XII.—The Executive Committee shall have power to make or amend Bye-Laws.

BYE-LAWS.

1. Five shall form a quorum of the Executive Committee.
2. In preparing the list of persons to be nominated for election on the Executive Committee, the number of attendances during the past year shall be an element of consideration.
3. Vice-Presidents shall be elected from past Members of Committee, from M.P.'s, and from persons who have in various ways rendered useful service.
4. Hon. Officers of Provincial Committees who had formerly served as Members of Executive Committee shall, on becoming Vice-Presidents, be entitled to attend the meetings of Committee as visitors.
5. Notice of not less than fourteen days shall be given of any proposed change in the Bye-Laws.
6. That a copy of Rule IV. be sent out to all Members three weeks before the date of the Annual Meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT.

YOUR Committee are unable to report any progress made in Parliament this Session. Those Members who balloted for a Women's Suffrage Bill or Resolution were unsuccessful in obtaining a day for a debate and division on the question.

At the opening of the Session, the usual Sessional Committee met for a Conference in the House of Commons, Mr. Galloway (Hon. Secretary of the Committee) presiding in place of Sir Charles McLaren, who was absent.

(Newcastle and District), Miss Emily Hornby (Liverpool) and Miss Edith Palliser, Secretary.

Sir Charles McLaren, M.P., was re-appointed Chairman, and Mr. Galloway and Mr. Richard Rigg, Hon. Secretaries of the Sessional Committee. It was decided to ballot with a view to a Bill and a motion.

Petitions asking for the extension of the Parliamentary franchise to women have this year been presented to Parliament by Mr. John Burns, signed by 8,600 tailoresses in the West Riding of Yorks; by Mr. Shackleton, from 71 Trade and Labour Councils and 62 Trade Unions, representing over 100,000 working men; and by Mr. Keir Hardie from the Independent Labour Party.

By the kind help of the North of England Society, which placed at your Committee's disposal the services of Miss Rowton as organiser, they were enabled during six months (February to July) to promote a Women's Suffrage Petition among the women working in the Potteries in Staffordshire. Canvassers, one of whom was herself a pottery worker, have canvassed Burslem, Cobridge, Hanley, Longton, Stoke and Tunstall. In many of these districts meetings were held daily in the rooms and yards of the factories where the masters gave permission to the canvassers to address the workers.

The most valuable part of this work has been the meetings, which roused much interest among the women in the question of the vote and its bearing on their industrial life. As soon as the work has been completed a list of expenditure will be issued to your society. Two labour candidates are standing for the constituencies of Hanley and Stoke, and Mr. John Ward, the candidate for Stoke, has promised, should he be returned, not only to vote for Women's Suffrage but actively to work in its support.

Your Committee take this opportunity of thanking all those who kindly contributed to the fund for promoting the Women's Suffrage Petition in Staffordshire.

CAXTON HALL MEETING.

A large Public Meeting was held by your society at the Caxton Hall, Westminster, on November 24th last, its purpose being to show the relation and importance of Women's Suffrage to philanthropic, social and temperance work. The speakers—all prominent workers in one of these directions—spoke from their own point of view, it being understood that the Women's Suffrage Society was in no way bound by their opinions on their own special work (either as to its objects or methods).

In the absence of the late Bishop of Southampton (who was prevented by illness from fulfilling his promise to attend) the Chair was taken by the Rev. Prebendary Ridgway, the other speakers being Mrs. Bryant, D.Sc.; Mrs. Arthur Philp, Miss Blanche Leppington, Rev. H. Russell Wakefield, Lord Kinnaid, Mrs. Allan Bright, Mrs. Henry Fawcett and Miss Sheepshanks. Among many important and interesting letters from workers unable to attend was one from the Rev. H. Price

Hughes, who had passed away only a day or two before the Meeting.

The Chairman dwelt upon the influence of the Women's Suffrage question on the great social problems of the day, reminding all interested therein that the suffrage is wanted not as a right only, but for the sake of their work.

Mrs. Bryant, D.Sc., proposed the resolution:—

“That there is no security for the permanence of any improvements in the legal and civic position of women, as long as they are without the firm foundation of the Parliamentary franchise; moreover, that work done by women for the commonweal is rendered less effective and more difficult of accomplishment while women have no direct share in the election of Members of Parliament.”

Mrs. Bryant insisted particularly on the need of a vote for the *working woman*,—more especially in Educational matters,—seeing that the Franchise alone could secure them those benefits, which they now hold only in dependence on a chivalrous sentiment.

Mrs. Arthur Philp, who seconded the resolution, pointed out the need of women's influence in promoting a better legislation, especially with regard to laws affecting women and children.

Lord Kinnaird protested against the objection that, if women had the vote, rates and taxes would be much increased, by showing that, on Committees, he had always found women most helpful and practical in financial matters. He thought only those who, from personal considerations, were interested in opposing much needed reforms in the great

problems, for instance, of temperance or the Housing of the Poor, could wish to refuse the Parliamentary franchise to women.

Miss Blanche Leppington, in a speech, heartily supporting the resolution, dealt with the suffrage, whether for men or for women, from two points of view:

- (1.) The claim of the Individual upon the State.
- (2.) The claim of the State upon the Individual.*

The Rev. H. Russell Wakefield put forward the uplifting and idealistic tendency of women's work in public life: “If we had a little of that higher tone given to the voting of this country, it would be a good thing.”

After a speech from Mrs. Allan Bright (President of the Women's Settlement in Liverpool), in which she urged that if manhood suffrage passed into law before the claim of women had been recognized, their enfranchisement would be swept back for generations—possibly for ever; the resolution was carried unanimously, as was also a vote of thanks to the Chairman, moved by Mrs. Henry Fawcett, and seconded by Miss Sheepshanks (Vice-Principal of the Samuel Morley Memorial College).

BRISTOL CONVENTION.

Instead of the Annual Meeting, the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies held a Convention at Bristol on May 21st and 22nd, attended by the following delegates from the Central Society:—Mrs. Sterling, Miss Palliser, and Miss F. Sterling. Mrs. St. George Reid was prevented by illness, at the last moment, from attending. The Convention opened with a large Public Meeting in the big hall of the Victoria Rooms,

Clifton, when the platform was crowded with an influential gathering of supporters of every shade of political opinion, all united by their zeal for the cause of Women's Suffrage. Lady Bective gave an interesting address, and Mr. Whiteley moved the (only) resolution:—"That there is no security for the permanence of any improvement in the legal and civic position of women, as long as they are without the firm foundation of the Parliamentary franchise, and that work done by women for the commonweal is rendered less effective and more difficult of accomplishment, while women have no direct share in the election of members of Parliament. This meeting, therefore, pledges itself to do all in its power to press forward the claims of women to the Parliamentary franchise." The resolution was carried unanimously. Among other speakers were the following:—The Hon. W. P. Reeves (Agent-General for New Zealand), Mr. W. H. Meredyth (Conservative Agent for the West of England), Mrs. Dickinson (textile worker and Trades Union Secretary from the North of England), Miss I. O. Ford (a member of the Independent Labour Party) and Miss Gertrude Kingston (Actor-Manager.)

On the morning of the second day (May 22nd) there was an interesting three hours' Conference at the offices of the Bristol Women's Suffrage Society, 5, Berkeley Square, at which the Rev. Alfred Steinthal presided. And the same afternoon the Convention closed with a reception given by the Bristol Women's Suffrage Society to the delegates from the various branches of the National Union, at 45, Royal York Crescent. After a welcome from Mrs. Nicholetts, on behalf of the Ladies' Club (which had kindly lent its rooms for the reception), Mrs. Ashworth Hallett gave a short address, and the following resolution was moved by Miss Florence Davenport Hill:—"That, in the opinion of this meeting, women should work only for those candidates for Parliament who will pledge themselves to support the Parliamentary

Enfranchisement of Women." Miss Sterling seconded. The resolution was carried unanimously. The following also spoke: Mrs. Sterling, Mrs. Gronow Davies and Mrs. Nicholetts.

Meanwhile an impromptu overflow gathering had been addressed downstairs by the Rev. Alfred Steinthal and Mrs. Arthur Francis, when the same resolution was passed with the same unanimity.

MEETINGS INDIRECTLY ORGANISED BY THE SOCIETY TO WHICH SPEAKERS WERE SENT.

Battersea, Jan. 19th, 1903—Miss Emily Hill addressed a meeting of members of the Battersea *Women's Liberal Association*, at which six members and five Associates joined the Suffrage Society.

Battersea, 1903, March 17th—A public meeting in favour of Women's Suffrage was held in the Lower Town Hall by the Battersea *Women's Liberal Association*. Mr. William Sanders presided, and Miss Emily Hill, Mr. P. H. Thomas, and Mrs. Despard, P.L.G., spoke.

Croydon (Local Hon Sec., Mrs. St. George Reid, Brigstock House, London Road, Thornton Heath), 1903, March 17th.—At a meeting of the Edridge Habitation of the *Primrose League*, held at Thornton Heath, about 100 being present, Mrs. Arthur Francis attended on behalf of the Central W. S. Soc., and gave an address on Women's Suffrage, which aroused great interest, and many joined the Society after the meeting.

A meeting of the Croydon *Women's Liberal Association* was held at Thornton Heath, February 17th, when Miss Emily Hill gave an address on Women's Suffrage.

Croydon.—At a meeting of the Grantham Habitation of the *Primrose League*, the Dame President in the chair, Miss F. Sterling attended on behalf of the Central Society and gave an address. There were 150 present.

Ealing (Local Hon. Sec.: Miss Byham, 14, Hartington Road, West Ealing), 1902, Dec. 4th.—*The Ealing Women's Association* held a meeting in the Municipal Buildings. Miss F. Sterling gave an address on Women's Suffrage. After a good discussion many joined this Society.

Fulham (Local Hon. Sec.: Miss Jenner, 39, Addison Road, Kensington, W.)—At a meeting of the *Fulham Women's Liberal Association*, Lady Cecilia Roberts and Miss Jenner attended, and spoke on Women's Suffrage.

East Hertfordshire, 1903, February 5th.—The Bishop's Stortford *Women's Liberal Association* gave a well-attended afternoon discussion on Women's Suffrage at the Wesleyan Chapel School-room. Miss F. Sterling attended on behalf of this society and gave an address. The meeting was strongly in favour of extending the franchise to women.

Kensington—Miss Emily Hill addressed a meeting of the *Kensington Liberal Association* at the house of Mr. Wiles (who presided), 5, Aubrey Road. The Resolution was carried unanimously.

Lambeth, Kennington Divison, 1902, April 2nd.—The *Women's Liberal Association of Kennington* held its annual meeting at the house of Mrs. Hatch, 132, South Lambeth Road. At the conclusion of the business, Miss F. Sterling, who attended on behalf of this society, gave an address on Women's Suffrage, which was followed by an interesting discussion.

Lambeth North.—At a large meeting of the *North Lambeth Labour and Progressive Association*, held in June, two ladies gave addresses on Political Organization. Mrs. Somerville, in the course of her speech, dwelt at some length on the claims of women to the franchise. Mr. Naoroji, in proposing a vote of thanks to the ladies, said that he had always advocated the recognition of the right of women to a voice in the government of the country.

Lambeth (North), 1903, March 10th.—The *North Lambeth Women's Liberal Association* held an evening discussion on Women's Suffrage at St. Thomas' Mansions, by permission of Mrs. Leon. Miss F. Sterling attended from the Central W. S. Society, and gave the opening address, and afterwards the whole company joined the W. S. Society.

Since the close of the financial year a National Convention in Defence of the Civic Rights of Women was held on October 16th and 17th, in London, to promote a special Women's Suffrage Campaign at the next General Election. A special report of this Convention will be published shortly.

OBITUARY.

OUR Annual Meeting of 1902 was the first for many years which had been held without the presence and ever active help of our beloved friend and colleague, Helen Blackburn. She was then ill, but her interest in our cause was unclouded by physical suffering, and a few of our members were able to go straight from the meeting to her bedside to report to her all that had been said and done. She never rallied from that illness, and on the 11th January, 1903, she died, deeply mourned by her fellow-workers and sorely missed, as a tried and trusted leader of the Women's Suffrage Movement. Her knowledge of every detail connected with the subject was unique; but it was equalled by her generosity to her fellow-

workers. She was absolutely without self-seeking, was ever ready to place at the disposal of her colleagues anything which would aid them in their work, and the younger workers could always rely on her for every sort of aid and sympathy. "Single hearted devotion," "generous wisdom," "one of the best women I ever knew," are phrases taken from letters received about her immediately after her death. They find a spontaneous echo in the heart of every one who knew her.

Resolutions of sympathy on the death of Miss Blackburn were received from the Executive Committee of the Women's Liberal Federation, from the Women's Progressive Association, New South Wales, Educational League of New South Wales, and from the Melbourne Women's Political Association; and letters of sympathy from a large number of members of Women's Suffrage Societies throughout the country were also received. The Women's Suffrage Cause has sustained a loss in the death of Lord Salisbury. He was a consistent and firm supporter, believing that if the vote were given to women they would prove themselves as good citizens as any other class of voters.

Speaking in the year 1888, Lord Salisbury, while stating that he could only speak for himself, expressed his hope "that the day was not far distant when women also will bear their share in voting for Members of Parliament, and in determining the policy of the country."

One chief reason for his advocacy was that he realised their influence in politics, and always dreaded influence without responsibility. He saw no reason to fear the exercise of power by women, and if no legislation was attempted in this direction during the time he was Prime Minister, it may be attributed to the difficulties of the position, which stood in the way of the carrying out of his settled convictions. He

must ever be held in respectful remembrance by those who have the cause at heart.

Sir Joshua Fitch, the well-known expert in educational matters, and one of the oldest leaders of the movement for the higher education of women, was also a firm supporter of the cause of Women's Suffrage. On many occasions, in recent years, he showed his sympathy by speaking or taking the chair at meetings. He died on the 14th of July, aged 79.

The Bishop of Southampton (The Hon. Arthur Temple Lyttelton), who died last February at the age of 51, was a firm and most valued friend of the cause. Though he did little that can be recorded in a few words, his opinion had all the weight due to his high character and intellect. It was with him so absolute and fundamental a conviction that women should have the same powers and responsibilities as men, that (even in the midst of the endless work entailed by his position) he constantly bore the question of Women's Suffrage in mind, and was often able, by a well-placed word or piece of sound advice, to give valuable help to the movement.

The approach of a General Election gives occasion to your Committee to impress upon the friends of the movement the great need for organising and preparing for active combined effort during the coming winter.

The future fiscal policy of the nation will no doubt be decided at the coming election, and the fiscal question is one which deeply concerns women.

Mr. Chamberlain, when speaking at Tynemouth on October 20th, stated that the fiscal question was one upon which the people should not be asked to give a decision until they had considered its full effect upon each one of them—every trade, every interest, every man and every woman. Yet

it will be a question on which no woman in the kingdom will be in a position to give effect by vote to her convictions.

Mr. John Morley, speaking at Nottingham, on November 3rd instant, made an appeal to women to help in the coming fiscal contest. "There never was," said Mr. Morley, "an occasion which so called upon every man and every woman to buckle to and to take a part in the struggle."

It is hoped that during the coming election women will earnestly strive to obtain the Parliamentary franchise as by far the most effectual instrument for helping forward the various questions they have at heart.

It may probably be alleged against the carrying through of a measure for the enfranchisement of women that the question has not been before the electors. It is suggested, as one method of meeting this argument, that candidates for Parliamentary election be induced to state their views on the subject in their election addresses.

The time has come for the most strenuous effort, and it is hoped that no means will be neglected for placing this question in its true position of fundamental importance to the welfare of the State.

A special General Meeting of the Society was held at the Caxton Hall, at 2.30 p.m., to consider a requisition by members of the Society to amend Rules IV. and VIII.

Mrs. Fawcett presided.

Miss Jenner proposed that Rule IV. be replaced by the following:—

“Any person may be proposed at the Annual Meeting for election or re-election on the Executive Committee, on the nomination of two members of the Society, to be sent to the Secretary fourteen days before the Annual Meeting.”

This was seconded by Miss Reinherz.

Mrs. Meyerstein moved the following amendment:—

After the word “Society” to insert “to whom the candidates are personally known.”

Mrs. Amos seconded the amendment, which was carried.

The Rule, amended as follows, was then put to the meeting and carried:—

“Rule IV.—Any person may be proposed at the Annual Meeting for election or re-election on the Executive Committee on the nomination of two members of the Society, to whom the candidates are personally known, to be sent to the Secretary fourteen days before the Annual Meeting.”

Lady Strachey proposed that Rule VIII. be replaced by the following:—

“That the Executive Committee shall consist of not more than twenty-four members, exclusive of M.P.s, to be elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting.”

This was seconded by Mrs. Stanbury.

The following amendment was moved by Miss Emily Davies :—

“To insert after the word ‘shall’ the words ‘for this year.’ To omit the words ‘not more than’ and ‘exclusive of Members of Parliament.’ To add after ‘annual meeting’ the words ‘immediately ensuing.’”

The amendment was seconded by Miss Davenport Hill, and supported by Miss Annie Leigh Browne, Miss Alford, Miss Kilgour and Miss Ommanney.

Mrs. Broadley Reid moved the following amendment to Miss Emily Davies’ amendment :—

“That the words ‘for this year’ be omitted.”

Mrs. Eva McLaren seconded the amendment.

After some discussion Miss Emily Davies withdrew the words “for this year.”

Rule VIII., amended as follows, was then put to the Meeting, and carried :—

“That the Executive Committee shall consist of twenty-four Members to be elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting immediately ensuing.”

Mrs. Arthur Francis moved the following resolution :—

“That it be an instruction to the Executive Committee to appoint a Sub-Committee to revise the Rules and Bye-Laws of the Society, and that the Executive Committee shall submit the revised Rules to a Special General Meeting of the Society not later than July next.”

This was seconded by Miss Ommanney, and carried.

CENTRAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

The object of the Society is to obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for Women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men.

RULES.

I.—The Society shall consist of Members and Associates.

II.—Members shall be—

- (a) Annual subscribers ;
- (b) Donors during the current year of £1 and upwards ;
- (c) Honorary officers.

Associates shall be those who have signified in writing their approval of the object of the Society.

III.—A General Meeting of the Society shall be held once a year to elect the Executive Committee, to receive the Annual Report and Financial Statement, and to transact any other business which may arise.

IV.—Any person may be proposed at the Annual Meeting for election or re-election on the Executive Committee, on the nomination of two Members of the Society, to whom the Candidates are personally known, to be sent to the Secretary fourteen days before the Annual Meeting.

V.—A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called by the Executive Committee at any time, or by the Secretary, on the written request of not less than twenty-five

Members of the Society. A Special General Meeting shall discuss only such matters as are mentioned in the notice calling such meeting.

VI.—Eight days' notice shall be given of all General Meetings to all persons qualified to vote.

VII.—All Members shall be entitled to vote at General Meetings of the Society, provided they have been Members for not less than three months previous to the time of voting.

VIII.—The Executive Committee shall consist of twenty-four Members, to be elected by ballot at the Annual General Meeting immediately ensuing.

IX.—The Executive Committee shall, at its first meeting, elect the Central Honorary Officers from among their number, appoint their Secretary or Secretaries and their local Honorary Secretaries. Vice-Presidents shall be elected by the Executive Committee from time to time.

X.—The ordinary meetings of the Executive Committee shall be held monthly. A special meeting can be called at any time at the request of not less than four Members of Committee.

XI.—The above Rules shall not be altered except at a General Meeting of Members of the Society. Not less than fourteen days' notice of the meeting to consider the proposed alteration must be given to the Executive Committee, who must give an additional fourteen days' notice to the Members of the Society. The nature of the proposed change must be stated in the notice calling the meeting.

XII.—The Executive Committee shall have power to make or amend Bye-Laws.

BYE-LAWS.

1. Five shall form a quorum of the Executive Committee.
2. In preparing the list of persons to be nominated for election on the Executive Committee, the number of attendances during the past year shall be an element of consideration.
3. Vice-Presidents shall be elected from past Members of Committee, from M.P.'s, and from persons who have in various ways rendered useful service.
4. Hon. Officers of Provincial Committees who had formerly served as Members of Executive Committee shall, on becoming Vice-Presidents, be entitled to attend the meetings of Committee as visitors.
5. Notice of not less than fourteen days shall be given of any proposed change in the Bye-Laws.
6. That a copy of Rule IV. be sent out to all Members three weeks before the date of the Annual Meeting.

How to help :—

1. By joining the Society :—
Every person who joins is by that act alone helping the Society to answer two objections which are constantly urged by the opponents of Women's Suffrage :—
 - i. That women don't want it.
 - ii. That most men are opposed to it.
 Remember that the world in general assumes that those who are not with us are against us.
2. By subscribing :—
The expenses of organisation, meetings, printing, postage, etc., are very heavy. More paid workers are essential. An additional £300 a year is urgently needed for these purposes. Those who cannot give time and service can at least help to provide more paid and skilled work.
3. By lending drawing-rooms or other suitable rooms for meetings.
4. By promoting discussions among your friends or at Clubs or Institutions to which you may have access. (Assistance is given by the Central Office and Local Hon. Secretaries in providing speakers.)
5. By securing fresh Members and Associates and by making the objects of the Society known among your friends.
6. By sending in names of persons likely to be interested who reside in your own constituency or in any other part of the country, and by supplying information about other districts not yet organised.
7. By occasionally assisting your Local Hon. Secretary with Clerical work, the organising of Meetings, distribution of Literature, etc., at times of pressure, and by giving her the benefit of your local knowledge.
8. By giving immediate information to your Local Hon. Secretary when you move. **A change of address not promptly reported leads to endless unnecessary trouble, expense and confusion, both to Secretaries and to Members or Associates.**

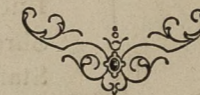

ANNUAL REPORT, 1904.

Your Committee have great satisfaction in recording the advance gained by the Women's Suffrage movement in Parliament this year.

For the first time since 1897 an opportunity was afforded of taking the opinion of the House of Commons on the question of the extension of the Parliamentary franchise to women, with the result that the verdict of 1897 in favour of the extension was reaffirmed by a much larger majority than before, thus pointing to the fact that the movement had gained ground considerably during the last six years. This success shows the effect of steady persistent work in educating public opinion, and must be a great encouragement to the friends of the movement throughout the country, for, as on each successive occasion, the House of Commons again and again affirms its belief in the principle of Women's Suffrage, the claim on the Government of the day to carry through this just and reasonable reform becomes stronger and less easy to set aside.

The usual steps were taken at the beginning of the Session to promote the introduction of a Bill. On February 3rd, a conference of members of Parliament was held in one of the Committee Rooms of the House of Commons. Sir Charles McLaren, Chairman of the Sessional Committee, presided. Among the members present were the following:— Mr. Jacoby, Mr. Keir Hardie, Mr. Plummer, Mr. Vaughan Davies, Mr. Pike Pease, Mr. Emmott, Captain C. B. Balfour, Mr. J. H. Johnstone, Mr. Hunter Craig, Mr. Arthur Henderson, Mr. Renwick; and Mr. Galloway and

Mr. Rigg, Hon. Secs. of the Sessional Committee. The following attended on behalf of the National Union Committee:—Miss F. Sterling, Dr. Stanton Coit (Central Society), Rev. S. Alfred Steinthal (North of England Society), Mrs. Ashworth Hallett (Bristol and West of England Society), Mrs. Gray Heald (Leeds Society), Miss Allan (Glasgow and West of Scotland Society), Miss Pickard (Mansfield Society), Miss Roger-Cunliffe (Leicester Society), Mrs. Leese (Southport Society), and Miss Edith Palliser, Sec. National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies. Lady McLaren and Mrs. Renwick were also present. On the motion of Mr. Emmott, seconded by Mr. H. Pike Pease, it was agreed that the Committee be empowered to add to their number. In accordance with the desire of the Committee, several members balloted for a Bill, but they were unsuccessful in obtaining a day, and it was therefore decided to ballot for a Resolution. Sir Charles McLaren was fortunate in securing first place for a motion on the evening of March 16th. Notice was given, and the following letter was sent to members of Parliament, in support of the Motion:—

March 14th, 1904.

Sir,

Sir Charles McLaren having given notice of a Resolution, to be brought before the House of Commons on Wednesday, the 16th inst., to the following effect:—

“That the disabilities of women in respect of the Parliamentary franchise ought to be removed by legislation;”

we venture to ask the favour of your attendance on the occasion, and to express the earnest hope that you may see fit to give the Resolution the advantage of your strong support.

The Resolution was moved by Sir Charles McLaren and seconded by Colonel Denny. Mr. Atherley-Jones, Mr. Emmott, Sir J. Rolleston, Mr. William Redmond and Dr. Shipman spoke in support; Mr. Cremer, Mr. Labouchere and Mr. Bond opposed. There voted for the motion:—63 Conservatives, 11 Unionists, 81 Liberals, 27 Nationalists; against the motion, 43 Conservatives, 8 Unionists, 8 Liberals, 9 Nationalists—majority in favour, 114.*

Towards the close of the Session a Bill was presented to the House by Mr. W. Crooks. This Bill was to have been presented earlier in the Session by Mr. Keir Hardie, at the

request of the women in the Labour movement; but Mr. Keir Hardie was detained by an election contest, and was not able to be present.

The text of the Bill is as follows:—

1. In all Acts relating to the qualifications and registration of voters or persons entitled or claiming to be registered and to vote in the election of members of Parliament, wherever words occur which import the masculine gender the same shall be held to include women for all purposes connected with and having reference to the right to be registered as voters and to vote in such election, any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.

2. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and five, and may be cited as the Women's Enfranchisement Act, 1904.

The Bill was supported by Mr. Shackleton, Mr. Bell, Mr. Arthur Henderson, Sir Albert Rollit and Mr. Keir Hardie.

Petitions praying for the extension of the franchise to women were presented to the House from 10,408 members of the British Women's Temperance Association; 2,500 nail and chain makers, Cradley Heath; 4,250 women workers in the potteries of Staffordshire; 2,760 women working in the hosiery factories, Leicester; 1,530 women workers in the textile factories, Dunfermline, and also petitions from Liverpool, Bootle, Wolverhampton, Bristol and Draycott.

Your Committee have pleasure in reporting that they have been enabled to considerably extend the work of organization in their area by means of grants from the Special Campaign Fund, which was opened last October at the National Convention called by the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies. This fund was formed to

provide the necessary pecuniary support for a scheme of work adopted by the the National Union, having for its object to form a non-party committee in every Borough, County and Riding in the United Kingdom, and ultimately, if possible, in every County Constituency, every means of public agitation and private representation being also used to press the consideration of the Suffrage question upon the constituencies and candidates.

The work of forming committees was begun by the Central Society in the middle of February, when Mrs. Stocker was engaged as organizer; and further extended in June, when Miss M. L. Manning, of New South Wales, was engaged as additional organizer. Your Committee were also given the occasional services of Miss Calthrop and Miss Mildred Watson, National Union organizers. The result of this work has been very encouraging. Prejudice has been overcome, and interest has been aroused. In some constituencies it was not possible to form a committee on the organizer's first visit; but it is hoped that the interest awakened may grow, and that later the original purpose of your Committee may be carried out. Miss Bonner, the canvasser for your Society, has helped to form local committees in some divisions in London, and has also given valuable assistance in organizing meetings. This work she has combined with canvassing in the constituencies of Battersea, Kennington and Chelsea.

Through the kindness of a member of your Committee, who has placed at their disposal the services of Miss E. A. Bompas, a number of constituencies in London have been worked, and Miss Bompas has also given effective help as a speaker at meetings. Local committees or societies have been formed in the following divisions and boroughs:

Metropolitan.—Local Committees have been formed in Kensington (North and South), Chairman—Lady Onslow; Marylebone (East and West), Chairman—Miss Emily Davies, LL.D.; Westminster, Chairman—Lady Penrose Fitzgerald; and also in Battersea, Chelsea, Hackney (South), Haggerston, and Wandsworth.

One of the new Committees—that of Marylebone—has adopted the plan of forming a list of persons resident or holding property in the constituency, who sign a statement declaring themselves in favour of the extension of the Parliamentary franchise to women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men. The same plan has been successfully adopted in Westminster, and will be tried elsewhere. It is proposed to bring these lists to the notice of candidates for Parliamentary election and their leading supporters, with a view to bringing to light the latent sympathy with the movement which is believed to exist to an extent not generally recognized.

A new departure has been taken in the way of arranging for small drawing-room meetings, consisting of from half-a-dozen to twelve or fifteen persons, at which, after a few words from a representative of the Society, the discussion is of an entirely conversational nature. Such informal gatherings are found to be of great use in removing misapprehensions and enlisting new adherents. Friends who do not feel able to organize public demonstrations on a large scale, may do valuable service by arranging for these small meetings, which

may be made the more effective if they can be followed up by some simple form of organization, where such does not already exist in the constituency.

Your Society's work of organizing the women workers in the Potteries of Staffordshire was completed this year by the formation of small local committees.

Some valuable additions have been made to the literature of the Society, and many thousands of leaflets and pamphlets, supplied from the office, have been circulated by Local Committees, Debating Societies, and other agencies.

On May 16th a Special General Meeting of Members of this Society was called to consider a draft scheme of new Rules, submitted by your Committee; these Rules, with some amendments, were approved and adopted.

An International Women's Suffrage Conference was held in Berlin on June 3rd and 4th, when an International Women's Suffrage Alliance was formed. Mrs. Stanton Coit, Miss Edith Palliser and Miss Rodger-Cunliffe were appointed by the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies to represent England at the Conference. Mrs. Fawcett, LL.D., was elected Second Vice-President, and Miss Rodger-Cunliffe Treasurer of the International Women's Suffrage Alliance.*

On July 16th your Committee were, through the kindness of Miss Holland, afforded the opportunity of receiving Miss Susan B. Anthony (Hon. President of the International Women's Suffrage Alliance), Mrs. Chapman Catt (President) and Miss Anna Shaw, delegates from America to the Berlin Congress, and of introducing them to the members of this Society. The Lady Frances Balfour presided and speeches were delivered by the American Delegates which were listened to with the deepest interest. Mrs. Fawcett moved a vote of thanks to the American Delegates for speaking and to the hostess, Miss Holland.

It is with deep regret that your Committee record the great loss sustained this year by the death of two of the early pioneers of the Women's Suffrage movement: Miss Frances Power Cobbe and Mr. J. P. Thomasson.

The following Resolutions from the National Union Committee and the Central Society for Women's Suffrage were forwarded to the families of Miss Cobbe and Mr. Thomasson, respectively:—

“The National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies desire to express their deep sense of the loss which the Women's Suffrage movement has sustained by the death of Miss Frances Power Cobbe

“Her name will ever be held in respectful and affectionate remembrance by all those who have had the privilege of knowing her, and to the younger generation her life and example will prove an incentive to continued efforts on behalf of the advancement of women, and thereby for the benefit of the whole human race.

“They also wish to convey to Miss Conway Cobbe, and the other members of Miss Cobbe's family, their sincere sympathy in the loss they have sustained.”

“The Executive Committee of the Central Society for Women's Suffrage desire to express their deep sympathy with Mrs. Thomasson and Mr. Franklin Thomasson in the bereavement they have recently sustained.

“The loss to the cause of Women's Suffrage by the death of Mr. J. P. Thomasson will be deeply felt in the ranks of its supporters throughout the

country, and especially by the members of the older Societies, which have had the opportunity of profiting by his example, wisdom, and generous support, for so great a number of years. His memory will be cherished by all alike as that of one who did honour to a great cause.”

It is gratifying to be able to note an accession of adherents to the extent of over 300 additional members of this Society. The progress made is an encouragement to further effort in adding to the resources of the Society; but while not, forgetting the importance of this essential part of the work, the Committee would specially call attention to the urgent need, at the present moment, of continuing and perfecting, as far as possible, the organization of the constituencies, in order to bring the question of Women's Suffrage prominently forward at the next General Election. Supporters in the different constituencies are invited to send up the names of prospective candidates for the next General Election, as this information is most useful and often difficult to obtain. Help may also be given by forwarding the names and addresses of persons likely to help in forming committees or societies.

The coming year must be one of strenuous endeavour on the part of the Women's Suffrage Societies, if the movement is to gain increased support in the new Parliament. It is not enough to accept from candidates a mere verbal statement that they are in favour of Women's Suffrage. They should be invited to declare themselves definitely in its support in their election addresses, and the question, “Are you in favour of Women's Suffrage?” should be followed by “Will you, if returned, support a Bill or Resolution in the House of Commons?” Candidates may thus be brought to realize that just as they themselves would care little for the favourable opinion of those who decline

either to work or to vote for them, a mere pious opinion in favour of Women's Suffrage (apart from effort on its behalf) cannot be accepted as entitling them to claim the active support of its advocates.

There are many encouraging signs that this long-delayed reform has gained ground in public opinion; and it may be hoped that the time has at last come when, in the words of the Prime Minister, "it will not be possible for Parliament to set Women's Suffrage aside as a mere speculative plan advocated by a body of faddists," but that it will receive the serious consideration due to its deep and far-reaching importance.

RULES.

- I.—The title of this Society is "THE CENTRAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE."
- II.—The object of the Society is to obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men.
- III.—The Society shall consist of all persons who have signified in writing their approval of its objects, or their desire to join—
- (A) Annual subscribers of any amount not less than a shilling shall be Members, and entitled to vote.
- (B) Non-subscribers shall be Associates.
- IV.—The officers of the Society shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Chairman of Committee, Local Hon. Secretaries, and a Secretary.
- V.—The current business of the Society shall be conducted by an Executive Committee, consisting of the President and Treasurer of the Society, and eighteen other persons elected by ballot at the annual meeting. The Committee shall elect its Hon. Officers, the Vice-Presidents, and the Local Hon. Secretaries of the Society annually at its first meeting. It shall also appoint its paid officers.

VI.—The Ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held monthly, on a fixed day, to be determined at its first meeting, which shall be called by the Secretary, as soon as convenient, after the annual meeting of the Society.

Special meetings shall be called at the request of not less than four members. Five shall form a quorum at all meetings.

VII.—The ballot papers for the election of the President, Treasurer, and other Members of the Executive Committee shall be given to each Member of the Society, in exchange for the counterfoil of his or her ticket of admission to annual meeting, at a polling station within the precincts of the hall. The voters will be required to mark their ballot papers, when they receive them, inside the polling station, and to place them at once in one of the sealed ballot boxes provided. The polling station shall be open from 3 to 8 p.m. on the day of the annual business meeting.

VIII.—Any person may be proposed for election or re-election as President, Treasurer, or Member of Committee, on the nomination of two Members of the Society, to whom the Candidate is personally known, such nomination to reach the Secretary at least twenty-one days before the annual meeting. Lists of nominations of President and Treasurer and Members of the Executive Committee of the Society, together with names of proposers and seconders and a table of attendances of Members standing for re-election, shall be sent to each Member of the Society at least fourteen days before the annual meeting.

IX.—An annual general meeting of the Society shall be held as soon as convenient after September 30th in each year:—

- (1) To receive the report, and the financial statement, which shall be duly audited.
- (2) To elect the President and Treasurer of the Society and the Executive Committee.
- (3) To appoint the returning officer and tellers for the ballot voting.

Not less than twenty-eight days' (preliminary) notice of the meeting shall be given to each Member.

X.—Special general meetings of the Society may be called at any time by the Executive Committee, and shall be called by the Secretary within twenty-eight days, on the requisition of not less than twenty-five members of the Society. A special general meeting shall discuss only such matters as are mentioned in the notice calling such meeting. Fourteen days' notice shall be given of general meetings to all Members.

XI.—The Rules shall not be altered except at a general meeting of the Members of the Society. The nature of the proposed alterations must be stated in the notice calling the meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1905.

Your Committee have satisfaction in reporting the steady progress made during the past year in the work of organisation, and in recording the increased amount of support given to the movement for the Parliamentary Enfranchisement of Women.

The usual Conference of Members of Parliament in favour of Women's Suffrage was held at the opening of the Session, on February 15th, in the House of Commons. Colonel Denny presided. The following Members were present:—Mr. J. T. Agg-Gardner, Mr. C. B. Balfour, Sir M. M. Bhowndegree, Mr. Channing, Mr. Chapman, Mr. Cameron Corbett, Mr. Alfred Emmott, Sir Michael Foster, Mr. W. Jones, Mr. Herbert Lewis, Dr. Macnamara, Captain Cecil Norton, Sir John Rolleston, Mr. James G. Weir and Mr. John Wilson (Glasgow, St. Rollox).

Mr. Bamford Slack was successful in obtaining a place in the ballot, and the Women's Suffrage Bill was set down for May 12th. That the Bill had found a place was so far encouraging, but as it had only second place on the orders of the day there was not much hope of its reaching a division. The Bill was introduced by Mr. Bamford Slack, seconded by Sir John Rolleston, and backed by Colonel Denny, Mr. Emmott, Mr. J. Keir Hardie, Sir Albert Rollit, Mr. Nannetti, Mr. D. Shackleton and Mr. George Whiteley.

Mr. Labouchere and Mr. T. Herbert Robertson opposed.

Owing to the facility offered by the procedure of the House of Commons for a few opponents to prevent a measure from reaching a division, the debate was adjourned without arriving at a definite issue.

The text of the Bill is as follows:—

“ In all Acts relating to the qualifications and registration of voters or persons entitled or claiming to be registered and to vote in the election of Members of Parliament, wherever words occur which import the masculine gender the same shall be held to include women for all purposes connected with and having reference to the right to be registered as voters and to vote in such election, any law or usage to the contrary notwithstanding.”

The work of organisation has been begun in North Hackney, where a local Hon. Secretary has been appointed, while some of the Committees formed in the preceding year have been strengthened, and their work extended. Eighty-five meetings have been held, *i.e.*, October (7), November (9), December (2), January (3), February (22), March (14), April (3), May (9), June (14), July (2), August (2).

In the course of the year 598 new members have joined the Society, while 95 have been lost through death or other causes. There has therefore been a net increase of no less than 503, bringing up the total membership to 1,714. The

Committee desire to acknowledge much zealous service on the part of members of Local Committees, Local Hon. Secretaries and Branch Societies, without which, such results could not have been obtained.

Owing to lack of funds, the Committee have been obliged, since January, to dispense with the services of one of the two organisers previously employed, one only being retained up to the end of July, with occasional help from the organisers of the National Union. The increase of membership has not resulted in a corresponding increase of funds, as the additional amount received in subscriptions was counterbalanced by a falling off in donations. This was the more to be regretted, as extended work entails increased expenditure, and during the past year there has also been an unprecedented demand for literature, which has been a considerable tax on the funds of the Society.

An active part was taken by the Society in promoting a Parliamentary Demonstration, organised by the National Union, held in the Queen's Hall, London, on March 14th, supported by 90 Members of Parliament. Two meetings were held simultaneously, one in the large hall and an overflow meeting in the small hall. Mr. Leonard Courtney presided in the large hall, and Mr. Cameron Corbett, M.P., and Mr. Yoxall, M.P., took the chair successively at the overflow meeting. The speakers included Sir R. C. Jebb, M.P.; Mr. J. Bamford Slack, M.P.; Sir Charles McLaren, Bart., M.P.; Mr. D. Brynmôr Jones, M.P.; Sir Wilfrid Lawson, Bart., M.P.; Dr. J. G. Shipman, M.P., and Mr. C. P. Trevelyan, M.P. Letters were read from Mr. John Morley, M.P., and Mr. R. C. Haldane, M.P., expressing sympathy and regret for their absence.

Your Committee have to record with deep regret the loss sustained by the death of Miss F. A. Manning and Miss Flora Stevenson, LL.D., Vice-Presidents of the Society, who were both earnest and steadfast supporters of the Enfran-

chisement of Women. Miss E. A. Manning, who passed away on August 10th, had been a strenuous worker on behalf of the advancement of women, both in England and India, especially in regard to their education. Miss F. Stevenson, who died on September 28th, was also well known for her brilliant services to the cause of education. These earnest and devoted advocates of Women's Suffrage themselves gave, by their beneficent work, striking examples of the advantage accruing to the State from the exercise by women of their powers in public service.

In view of the near approach of the General Election your Committee desire to call the attention of members of the Society to the large field for active effort which lies before them. A glance at the area of work of the Central Society (*see p. 2*) and the list of Branch Societies and Local Committees (*see p. 54*) will show how much remains to be done in organising support in the constituencies for which this Society is specially responsible, if the question of Women's Suffrage is to be brought before candidates with urgency and effect. Your Committee would again call attention to the importance of inducing candidates to state their views on the subject in their Election Addresses, in order to anticipate the argument, which in the absence of such statements may not unreasonably be brought forward by opponents, that the question has not been before the country, and that the new Parliament has no mandate to deal with it.

As the General Election will certainly take place at no distant date, there is no time to be lost; and it should be remembered that the occasion of an election affords the most effective opportunity for carrying this great reform into the region of practical politics, and thus leading on to a near realisation of our hopes and aims.

Seconded by Miss DIMOCK and carried.

3. CONSTITUTION OF COUNTY COMMITTEES.

The following scheme, recommended by the Executive Committee, was submitted to the Meeting:—

Committees outside the Metropolitan area shall become Branches, one year after their formation.

PRIVILEGES.

(a) **Affiliation.**—Any Branch having 25 Members shall be affiliated.

(b) **Delegates.**—Each Branch shall have a right to send Delegates to vote at all General Meetings of the Society in the following proportion:—

Twenty-five to 100 Members, 1 Delegate.

Each additional 100 or part of 100, 1 additional Delegate.

(c) **Rules and Work of Branches.**—Subject to the limitations stated below, each Branch shall be free to make its own rules as to Membership, number and mode of Election of Officers and Committees, propaganda carried on, and all other matters.

- (d) **Funds.**—Each Branch shall be free to collect and administer its own Funds (subject to affiliation fee.)
- (e) All subscriptions of less than 5s. received by the Central Society from the area of a Branch, shall be paid intact into the Funds of that Branch, and not into the Central Fund.
- (f) The names of all Subscribers to the Central Society residing in the area of a Branch shall be supplied to the Secretary of that Branch, it being understood that no effort will be made to induce such subscribers to withdraw Subscriptions from the Central in favour of the Branch.
- (g) **Literature.**—The Central Society shall allow a special Discount on all literature sold to Branches.
- (h) **Speaker, free.**—The Central Society shall supply each Branch with a speaker, once a year, free of all cost for fee or travelling expenses, the Branch offering hospitality.
- (i) The Central Office shall, as far as possible, supply information as to methods, state of the movement, &c., give lists of speakers, and any suggestions required from time to time to enable Branches to keep in touch with the Centre and with each other.

RESPONSIBILITIES.

- (a) The sole "Object" of Branches shall be the same as that of the Central Society.
- (b) Branches shall affiliate to no other Society but the Central Society, while working in harmony and co-operation with other bodies of persons, for the promotion of the Society's object.
- (c) Branches shall retain their non-party basis and *as a branch* make Women's Suffrage their only "Test question."
- (d) Each branch shall pay each year an affiliation fee of 20 per cent. on their receipts (as shown in their last published statement of accounts), with a minimum fee of 5/-.

- (e) All expenses incurred by a Branch shall be paid by that Branch out of its own Funds (the Central Society having no responsibility beyond those mentioned in privileges G and H).

Mr. WALTER McLAREN moved that the words—

"Unless the Subscriber should object" be inserted after the words "shall" in Clause E—Privileges. Miss KILGOUR seconded and it was carried.

Miss F. STERLING proposed—

"That the scheme be adopted provisionally for one year, any rules to the contrary notwithstanding."

Seconded by Mrs. BROADLEY REID and carried.

A vote of thanks to Mrs. FAWCETT for presiding was moved by Lady STRACHEY and carried.

A ballot for the election of members of the Executive Committee for the ensuing year took place.

RULES.

I.—The title of this Society is “THE CENTRAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN’S SUFFRAGE.”

II.—The object of the Society is to obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men.

III.—The Society shall consist of all persons who have signified in writing their approval of its objects, or their desire to join—

(A) Annual subscribers of any amount not less than a shilling shall be Members, and entitled to vote.

(B) Non-subscribers shall be Associates.

IV.—The officers of the Society shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Chairman of Committee, Local Hon. Secretaries, and a Secretary.

V.—The current business of the Society shall be conducted by an Executive Committee, consisting of the President and Treasurer of the Society, and eighteen other persons elected by ballot at the annual meeting. The Committee shall elect its Hon. Officers, the Vice-Presidents, and the Local Hon. Secretaries of the Society annually at its first meeting. It shall also appoint its paid officers.

VI.—The Ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held monthly, on a fixed day, to be determined at its first meeting, which shall be called by the Secretary, as soon as convenient, after the annual meeting of the Society.

Special meetings shall be called at the request of not less than four members. Five shall form a quorum at all meetings.

VII.—The ballot papers for the election of the President, Treasurer, and other Members of the Executive Committee shall be given to each Member of the Society, in exchange for the counterfoil of his or her ticket of admission to annual meeting, at a polling station within the precincts of the hall. The voters will be required to mark their ballot papers, when they receive them, inside the polling station, and to place them at once in one of the sealed ballot boxes provided. The polling station shall be open from 3 to 8 p.m. on the day of the annual business meeting.

VIII.—Any person may be proposed for election or re-election as President, Treasurer, or Member of Committee, on the nomination of two Members of the Society, to whom the Candidate is personally known, such nomination to reach the Secretary at least twenty-one days before the annual meeting. Lists of nominations of President and Treasurer and Members of the Executive Committee of the Society, together with names of proposers and seconders and a table of attendances of Members standing for re-election, shall be sent to each Member of the Society at least fourteen days before the annual meeting.

IX.—An annual general meeting of the Society shall be held as soon as convenient after September 30th in each year:—

- (1) To receive the report, and the financial statement, which shall be duly audited.
- (2) To elect the President and Treasurer of the Society and the Executive Committee.
- (3) To appoint the returning officer and tellers for the ballot voting.

Not less than twenty-eight days' (preliminary) notice of the meeting shall be given to each Member.

X.—Special general meetings of the Society may be called at any time by the Executive Committee, and shall be called by the Secretary within twenty-eight days, on the requisition of not less than twenty-five members of the Society. A special general meeting shall discuss only such matters as are mentioned in the notice calling such meeting. Fourteen days' notice shall be given of general meetings to all Members.

XI.—The Rules shall not be altered except at a general meeting of the Members of the Society. The nature of the proposed alterations must be stated in the notice calling the meeting.

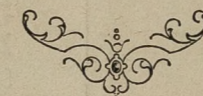

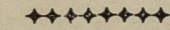

ANNUAL REPORT.



In presenting their Report, your Committee have pleasure in recording the great advance made by the Women's Suffrage movement during the past year. Although they are unable to point to progress in Parliament, they feel that the steady, persistent work carried on by this and other Societies in bringing the question before the constituencies has had encouraging results. During the General Election in January, 1906, a larger number of candidates than on any former occasion announced their support of Women's Suffrage in their election addresses, and the number of supporters in the present House of Commons is known to exceed 400.

On February 14th a Conference was held at the House of Commons. Forty-nine Members of Parliament were present and forty representatives of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies. The forty-nine Members constituted themselves a Parliamentary Committee for Women's Suffrage. Sir Charles McLaren was appointed Chairman and Mr. Cameron Corbett, Mr. Geoffrey Howard, and Mr. Philip Snowden, Secretaries. Subsequently, sixteen Members of Parliament balloted for a Women's Suffrage Bill, but no place was obtained.

Among those who balloted later for a Women's Suffrage resolution, Mr. Keir Hardie secured the best place, and the resolution was set down in the second place for April 25th. The following is the text of the resolution, which was seconded by Mr. Eugene Wason:—

“That in the opinion of this House it is desirable that sex should cease to be a bar to the exercise of the Parliamentary Franchise.”

The motion preceding that of the Women's Suffrage resolution had reference to vaccination, and was down in

the name of Mr. Arnold Lupton. It had been hoped that in accordance with the usual rules of procedure in the House of Commons, Mr. Arnold Lupton's resolution would have been ruled out of order, as there was a Bill down on the notice paper dealing with the same subject; but the Speaker ruled that it was in order, as the Bill dealt with a different phase of the vaccination question. Mr. Lupton being in favour of Women's Suffrage, consented to shorten the discussion on his motion. Mr. R. W. Cremer and Mr. S. Evans spoke against it. Mr. Herbert Gladstone expressed his intention of voting for it. The House of Commons appeared in thorough sympathy with the motion, but the division was not reached owing to a disturbance created in the Ladies' Gallery during Mr. Evans' speech.

Mr. Cameron Corbett, Sir William Bull, Mr. Snowden, and Mr. Wedgwood, Members representing all parties in the House of Commons, have put down notices of motion on the Plural Voting Bill, which will be dealt with during the autumn Session. The text of the motion is as follows:—

“That it be an instruction to the Committee that they have power to deal with the question of the disqualification of sex.”

A deputation on Women's Suffrage was received by the Prime Minister on May 19th, and Miss Emily Davies spoke on behalf of the Women's Suffrage Societies. The report of the proceedings has already been distributed among the Members of the Society. It is sufficient here to point out that more than twenty different Societies besides those forming the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies took part in the deputation; thus adding greatly to its representative character. Immediately after the deputation a public meeting was held in Exeter Hall, to receive the members of the deputation and hear their account of the proceedings. The work of organising this meeting was carried out by this Society, with the co-

operation of the Women's Co-operative Guild, the Lancashire and Cheshire Women Textile and other Workers' Representation Committee, the Manchester and Salford Women's Trade and Labour Council, the Women's Liberal Federation, and others who had taken part in the deputation.

The Executive Committee of the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies called a special meeting as soon as possible after the deputation, at which it was decided to raise a fund to carry on special work in the constituencies represented by prominent opponents of Women's Suffrage. Work has been already set in hand in the selected constituencies within the area of this Society, and will absorb all the energies, time, and money at its command.

During the General Election a small band of canvassers was sent to assist candidates who had declared themselves in favour of Women's Suffrage, and had allowed their names to be printed in the list of favourable candidates issued by your Society and placed in their Committee Rooms. The help thus offered during the election was quite irrespective of party.

An Organising Secretary of this Society visited a constituency in which a vacancy arose since the General Election, and was successful in arranging an effective deputation to the candidate, and in arousing interest on the spot.

Your Committee have been asked to help the Lancashire and Cheshire Women Textile and other Workers' Representation Committee and the Manchester and Salford Women's Trade and Labour Council to organise the skilled women workers in London, with a view to enlisting their support in the cause of women's suffrage, and a grant has been made for this purpose.

Your Committee are endeavouring to establish a network of organisations in the area of which the Central Society is in charge. Such work is necessarily slow, but it is essential to the success of the movement. It is only through the con-

stituencies that pressure can be brought to bear on Parliament, and the present passive adherence given to the movement by a large number of Members of Parliament converted into an active effort to urge the reform upon the Government.

Local Committees have been formed in Brighton and St. Pancras, and the Local Committee in Southampton has been formed into a Branch Society.

It would not be possible here to mention individually all those who have so kindly given their services in arranging for meetings, speaking, or helping in other directions the work of the Society—but your Committee desire to record their appreciation of their work for the movement.

Efforts will be made in the next Session to promote the introduction of a Women's Suffrage Bill, and no opportunity will be neglected of bringing the question forward. It is hoped that between this time and the opening of the new Session the Members of this Society and other supporters will urge Members of Parliament to ballot for a Women's Suffrage Bill or Resolution. Though your Committee are aware that the chances of a private Member's Bill passing into law are slight, yet a debate and division on the question are of the greatest value. Every verdict given by the House of Commons in favour of the extension of the Parliamentary Franchise to women brings it nearer realisation, for no Government can ignore repeated expressions of the opinion of the House of Commons. It is suggested that deputations may with advantage be organised, before Parliament opens next year, to wait upon friendly Members, urging them to ballot for a Bill or Resolution.

The Committee greatly deplore the loss through death during the year of some of the most valued and constant of the friends and supporters of Women's Suffrage. At the opposite

poles, as far as politics were concerned, Sir Richard Jebb, M.P., and Sir Wilfrid Lawson, M.P., were alike in the courage and tenacity with which they urged the justice of the claim of women to representation. They were ever ready to speak and work for the movement, and the rare distinction of style which marked every utterance of Sir Richard Jebb was never more apparent than when he was advocating Women's Suffrage. In the death of Dr. Evelyn Shuckburgh, of Cambridge, the movement lost a valued and constant friend. The Dowager Countess of Portsmouth, during the early years of the Women's Suffrage agitation, gave it the great support of her singularly winning and powerful personality. Mrs. William Grey, the founder of the Girls' Public Day School Company, was a life-long supporter of Women's Suffrage. The loss of Mrs. Sterling, who for so many years acted as the Treasurer of the Central Society, is a personal grief to all who knew and appreciated, as the Committee could not fail to do, her deep devotion to the cause of Women's Suffrage, and the unfailing and self-sacrificing spirit in which she devoted herself to all work for its promotion.

PROCEEDINGS.

CHAIRMAN . . . THE LADY FRANCES BALFOUR.

Mrs. FAWCETT moved the following resolution:—

“That the members of the Central Society for Women’s Suffrage here assembled desire to express their deep sense of the loss incurred by the death of Mrs. Sterling, and their high appreciation of her unflinching support during many years of faithful service.” Persistent in effort, undaunted by discouragement, her zeal never flagged. While in the foremost ranks of the advocates of Women’s Suffrage, she was at all times ready to take part in any necessary work for the cause, however humble. Those who are conversant with the inner working of the Society know how much it has owed to her unwearying devotion. Her removal creates a gap which can hardly be filled. The members of the Society desire further to express their sincere sympathy with the family of Mrs. Sterling under the heavy blow which has befallen them.”

Mrs. FAWCETT said that those who worked with Mrs. Sterling on the Committee knew—and perhaps no one else could quite know—her whole-hearted devotion and spirit of self-sacrifice while working for Women’s Suffrage.

The resolution was adopted, all those present rising.

Mrs. FAWCETT then moved the following resolution:—

“That the best thanks of this meeting be offered to Miss Dimock for her valuable services as Acting Treasurer during the last four months.”

This was seconded by Miss EMILY DAVIES, and carried.

The Report and Balance Sheet was moved from the Chair, and adopted.

BRANCH SOCIETIES.

Proposed by Miss EMILY DAVIES:—

“That the scheme comprising regulations *re* Branch Societies, adopted provisionally at the Annual Meeting held on December 6th, be continued, subject to the omission of the preamble: ‘Committees outside the Metropolitan area shall become Branches one year after their formation.’”

Seconded by Mrs. FAWCETT, and carried.

Mrs. CONNAH was re-appointed Auditor.

Resolution moved by Mr. W. McLAREN:—

“That this meeting protests against the delay in granting the Parliamentary Franchise to women, having regard to the fact that for 40 years, in constantly growing numbers, women have shown by every constitutional means their desire and their fitness for the Franchise.

“That while the question has long been ripe for settlement, the declarations of the Prime Minister and other members of the Government, and the pledges of a large majority of the House of Commons in favour of Women’s Suffrage, have brought the movement still more clearly into the region of practical politics, and this meeting urges on members of Parliament the necessity of fulfilling their pledges without further delay.

“This meeting cannot accept the Prime Minister’s recommendation to exercise patience, the time for which is long past; it recognises the zeal shown by those women who have not hesitated to go to prison in support of their convictions, and calls upon this Society and upon all women to show an equal zeal in furthering, by every constitutional method, the cause to which they are devoted.”

Seconded by Mrs. FAWCETT, supported by MR. SNOWDEN, M.P., and carried.

MR. CAMERON CORBETT, M.P., moved a vote of thanks to the Chairman and the meeting then terminated.

RULES.

- I.—The title of this Society is “THE CENTRAL SOCIETY FOR WOMEN’S SUFFRAGE.”
- II.—The object of the Society is to obtain the Parliamentary Franchise for women on the same terms as it is, or may be, granted to men.
- III.—The Society shall consist of all persons who have signified in writing their approval of its objects, or their desire to join—
- (A) Annual subscribers of any amount not less than a shilling shall be Members, and entitled to vote.
- (B) Non-subscribers shall be Associates.
- IV.—The officers of the Society shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Chairman of Committee, Local Hon. Secretaries, and a Secretary.
- V.—The current business of the Society shall be conducted by an Executive Committee, consisting of the President and Treasurer of the Society, and eighteen other persons elected by ballot at the annual meeting. The Committee shall elect its Hon. Officers, the Vice-Presidents, and the Local Hon. Secretaries of the Society annually at its first meeting. It shall also appoint its paid officers.

- VI.—The Ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held monthly, on a fixed day, to be determined at its first meeting, which shall be called by the Secretary, as soon as convenient, after the annual meeting of the Society.
- Special meetings shall be called at the request of not less than four members. Five shall form a quorum at all meetings.
- VII.—The ballot papers for the election of the President, Treasurer, and other Members of the Executive Committee shall be given to each Member of the Society, in exchange for the counterfoil of his or her ticket of admission to annual meeting, at a polling station within the precincts of the hall. The voters will be required to mark their ballot papers, when they receive them, inside the polling station, and to place them at once in one of the sealed ballot boxes provided. The polling station shall be open from 3 to 8 p.m. on the day of the annual business meeting.
- VIII.—Any person may be proposed for election or re-election as President, Treasurer, or Member of Committee, on the nomination of two Members of the Society, to whom the Candidate is personally known, such nomination to reach the Secretary at least twenty-one days before the annual meeting. Lists of nominations of President and Treasurer and Members of the Executive Committee of the Society, together with names of proposers and seconders and a table of attendances of Members standing for re-election, shall be sent to each Member of the Society at least fourteen days before the annual meeting.

IX.—An annual general meeting of the Society shall be held as soon as convenient after September 30th in each year:—

- (1) To receive the report, and the financial statement, which shall be duly audited.
- (2) To elect the President and Treasurer of the Society and the Executive Committee.
- (3) To appoint the returning officer and tellers for the ballot voting.

Not less than twenty-eight days' (preliminary) notice of the meeting shall be given to each Member.

X.—Special general meetings of the Society may be called at any time by the Executive Committee, and shall be called by the Secretary within twenty-eight days, on the requisition of not less than twenty-five members of the Society. A special general meeting shall discuss only such matters as are mentioned in the notice calling such meeting. Fourteen days' notice shall be given of general meetings to all Members.

XI.—The Rules shall not be altered except at a general meeting of the Members of the Society. The nature of the proposed alterations must be stated in the notice calling the meeting.
