I am deeply touched & humbled
by your kind letter which I have

will stand. A gigantic step
has been made through

and goodness. Your work

Rebecca Jarrett. I even fear

that you may have to see her

sent to prison while you are not.

Iago said of Othello "I know his ^{own} ~~own~~

nature", and your enemies may
know yours well enough to see that

you might be made to suffer more that
way than any other. Even under
this I hope your high courage may
be kept up; under the sense that the
pain is part of the price you have to
pay for the great good which has
been accomplished.

I have thought a great deal of your
wife. I have drawn myself her sustaining
power of sympathy in trouble; therefore
let me tell her how hundreds & thousands
of women's hearts are going out toward
her in deepest sympathy and gratitude.
I cannot call the present circumstances

for doing it. I really ~~am~~ ^{am}
you as much as I admire
and honor you: very few
people, even among heroes
and martyrs, have had
the happiness of seeing their
faithful work so immediately

crowned with good results.

Everything I have written sounds
so cold compared to what

I feel: but if gratitude &
honor from myself and many
hundreds and thousands of
our country women can help
you at this stress, I want you
to have that help.
