Joseph name, taken to

Police Station, from there to  
Westminster P. Station,  
remanded to Sessions.

The shopman who witnessed  
against them got into a  
muddle - at one moment  
said Mr. Motter hadn't  
done anything - then that  
it came out quite plainly  
that she had & she didn't

deny yet he couldn't  
unlearn his first statement,  
so they say she will probably  
get off. She was the only  
one of the lot (with many  
others) who was allowed  
bail, but she wouldn't  
take it as the others  
hadn't a chance of it.  
Wasn't that splendid of  
her. They all got sent  
to Holloway (in cabs). But

of course she has nothing at  
all with her tonight - I shall  
send her things the very  
first thing in the morning  
I am posting letters to  
her tonight. I ought to be  
allowed see her, but they  
are forbidding all visitors  
because there was a strike  
amongst the "remanded" but  
I shall try. I know she is  
ever so happy now at her  
job being over & well  
brought off! Now tomorrow.  
She is remanded till today

I had been given so  
many jobs I couldn't  
get to Brompton till 7.30  
then wearing expecting to  
find her there (Walter  
Street) but she would  
be bailed out at  
about 11 tonight - by  
the time I got to  
Clement's Inn for further

nothing w<sup>d</sup> be taken  
in at Holloway so  
late, therefore have to  
wait till the morning.
