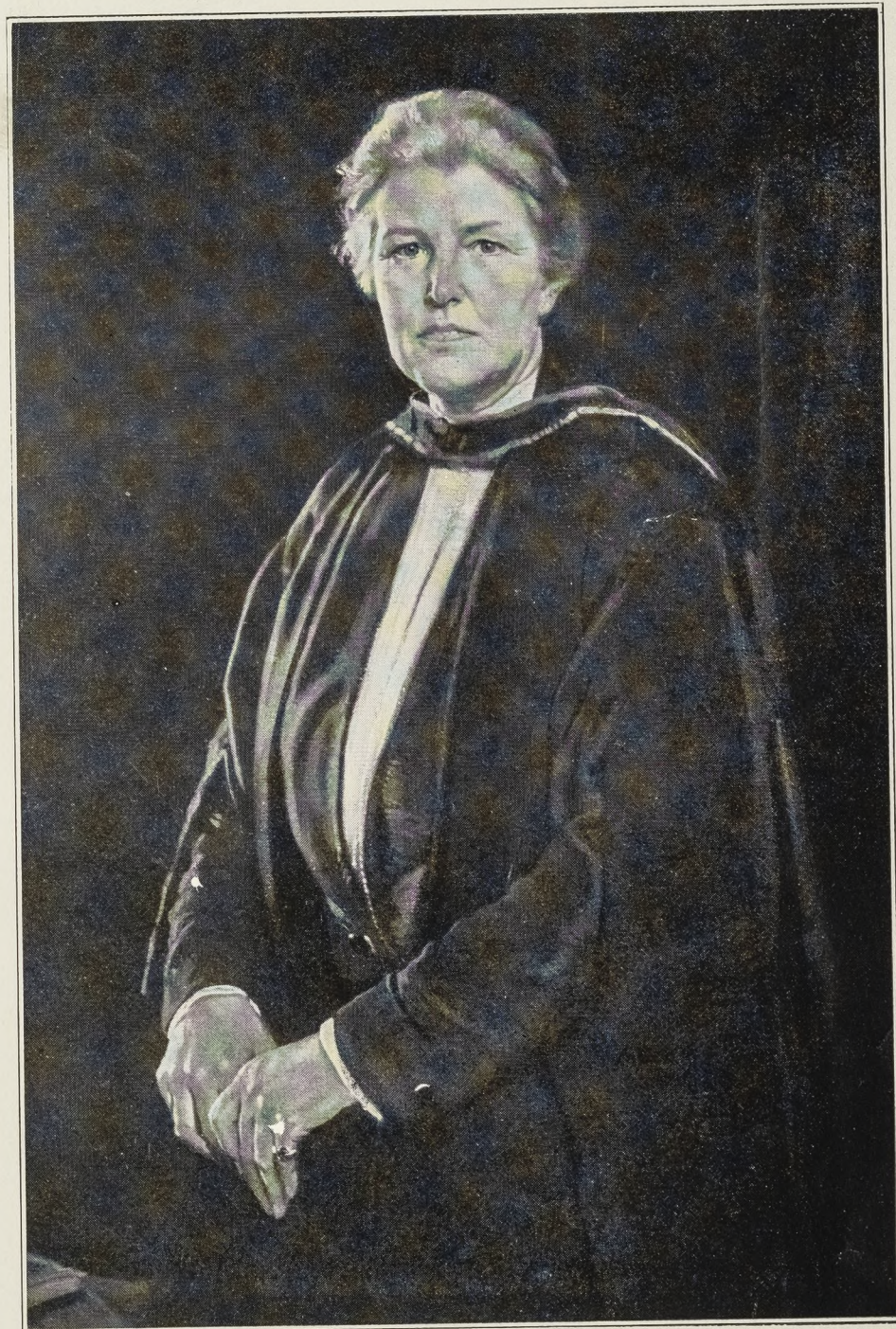

## RULES.

Every donor of £21 in not more than two payments is a Governor of the Hospital for life.

Governors are empowered in each year to recommend ten out-patients to the Hospital, free of the entrance fee, provided that such recommendations are given *only to persons who are legitimate objects of medical charity.*

Annual Subscribers of two guineas and upwards are Annual Governors, and may, subject to the same limitation, recommend ten out-patients, and Subscribers of not less than one guinea may recommend five out-patients, free of the entrance fee, during each year of their subscription.

N.B.—*No further recommendation is needed to admit the Bearer of a Hospital Letter as an in-patient provided the nature of the case require that she be treated in the Hospital. Persons who are too ill to attend first as out-patients, or who live at a distance, should apply for admission by post, enclosing a medical certificate, to the SECRETARY at the HOSPITAL.*

The letter of recommendation for patient must be renewed every month, and no in-patient can remain in the house longer than two months, except by the sanction of the Managing Committee.

No infectious cases can be admitted as in-patients.

The Hospital is open for the relief of out-patients every day except Sundays, public holidays and certain other days, of which due notice is given beforehand. In-patients are admitted as vacancies occur.

All patients and their friends have the right to lay a complaint before the Managing Committee personally, by deputy, or in writing.

In-patients are required to contribute a small sum weekly towards the cost of their maintenance while in the Hospital. This sum is fixed by the Almoner with reference to the position in life, etc., of each patient, and ranges from 7s. 6d. upwards per week.

It is in the power of the Almoner to admit cases of serious illness without any payment, if, on enquiry, it appear desirable to do so.

There are three small separate wards. The terms of admission to these wards are £4 4s. per week. A smaller ward at a charge of £3 3s. per week.

### RULES FOR IN-PATIENTS.

Patients coming into the Hospital are required to bring a change of linen, soap, towel, comb and brush for their own use.

They are required to provide themselves with clean linen twice a week.

Every patient is required to pay a weekly sum according to her means, and to provide her own butter and tea. Payments are to be paid in advance on entrance, and on each succeeding Friday during her stay.

Visitors to patients are allowed on Wednesdays and Sundays from 2.30 to 3.30.

No wine or spirit allowed to be brought into the Hospital by patients or their friends.

BY ORDER OF THE COMMITTEE.

### RULES FOR OUT-PATIENTS.

Patients are admitted by payment of a fee of 1s. per attendance, or by a subscriber's letter, which must be renewed once a month.

Patients insured under the National Insurance Act are only seen at the written request of their Panel Doctor.

Sixpence towards medicine is charged every week.

Out-patients are admitted daily at the following hours:—

## THE ELIZABETH GARRETT ANDERSON HOSPITAL.

### FIFTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT.

*Extension of Hospital.*—The year 1924 has been made memorable by the initiation of the Extension Appeal. Following upon the acquisition of the site of the Hospital and its annexes, Sir Brumwell Thomas, as announced in the last Report, prepared plans of extension which would utilise all the land at disposal, to the fullest possible extent, without unnecessarily impeding the daily life and work of the Hospital. Details of these plans were reported last year, and they have been submitted to and approved by King Edward's Hospital Fund. The King's Fund has, indeed, promised a grant of £1,000 towards the cost of carrying out the Extension Scheme. It has, however, been found necessary to increase the original estimate of £50,000 to £75,000, owing to the considerable enlargement of the plan for improvement of Out-Patient Department and Basement accommodation, with the addition of a recreation room for the nurses under the Out-Patient Waiting Hall, and the provision of a new Pathological Block.

An Extension Appeal Committee was elected early in the year, and Lady Plender kindly consented to act as Chairman. The Committee gladly take this opportunity of expressing their appreciation of this Act of Service on the part of the Honorary Treasurer, whose devoted work for the Hospital is so well known. Lady Plender's first step was to



give, in July, a very successful tea-party, at which the nature of the Extension Scheme was explained, and offers of assistance invited. In August the Committee appointed Miss Adeline Bourne Organising Appeal Secretary, and installed her in an office of the Army-hut type, which was erected in the fore-court of the Hospital, and which can be used at the Rosa Morison House of Recovery, as additional garden-shelter accommodation, when the Appeal has been closed. Miss Bourne, with a staff of able helpers, supported by an enthusiastic Council and Committee, has initiated many schemes for raising the £75,000 required. Dramatic performances, Concerts, Card-parties, Dances, Tea-parties and kindred activities, all of which our friends are urged to remember can be organised privately with very good results. The central idea is perhaps the Tea Party Scheme, and the Appeal Committee earnestly hope that everybody who reads the Report, and who has not yet helped the Appeal, will undertake to give a subscription tea-party, or other private effort, and will send the result to Lady Plender as a token of interest in, and sympathy with the work of the Hospital, of which they have so long been supporters.

The Committee desire to express their heartfelt thanks to all who are working so hard and so hopefully for the Extension, whose work will be fully acknowledged when the Report of the Extension Appeal Committee is made. The Committee wish to draw attention to the fact that the Hon. Mrs. Fletcher Moulton has most generously undertaken to be responsible for raising £5,000 of the Extension Fund which is to represent that part of it which provides an adequate Maternity and Labour Ward.

A list of donors to the Extension Appeal will be circulated when the Fund, which is at present being kept separate, is audited.

The Committee also desire to state that contributions towards a Ward to be named after our Chairman, can be sent to Lady Hall, who has kindly undertaken to act for this object, or to the Secretary of the Hospital, who will work under her.

*Memorial Scheme.*—The Committee have the honour to report that Her Royal Highness the Duchess of York has graciously allowed her arms to be used for the stained glass window which commemorates the endowment of the Duchess of York Bed. The beautiful design was carried out by Mr. Christopher Webb, after consultation with the Heralds' College, and the Garrett Anderson Ward is now enriched by this lovely window. It will be remembered that Mr. Webb designed and executed the smaller stained glass panels which commemorated the completion of each bed under Lady Hall's Memorial Scheme. The Committee congratulate Mr. Webb upon his fine work, which adds so greatly to the brightness and attraction of our Wards.

*Eastbourne Schools and Queenswood Beds.*—The Eastbourne Schools Bed and the Queenswood Bed were both completed during 1924. The Committee heartily thank all concerned in this happy achievement, especially Miss Carruthers Wilson of Laleham School, Eastbourne, and Miss Ethel Trew, Headmistress of Queenswood, without whose unfailing interest and encouragement the objects could hardly have been attained.

*Burlington School.*—The Burlington School Bed has not yet arrived at completion, but the Committee refer to it because they desire to place on record their sense of the great loss the School has sustained in the death of Miss Wigg. Miss Wigg was a most devoted friend and enthusiastic helper of the Hospital and her loss is deeply regretted. The girls are fortunate in their new Headmistress, Miss Burgess, who

has already shown her interest in the link between School and Hospital, by allowing her students to continue their very useful annual gift of needlework to the Guild, and to send their usual Christmas donation to the Fund for their Bed.

*The Cheetham Endowment.*—Apart from the Memorial Scheme a further bed was named last year by Mrs. Charlotte Cheetham in memory of her husband Mr. Robert Cheetham, and Mr. Webb is now at work upon a design for the memorial panel.

*The Guilds.*—Both the E.G.A. Guild and the Guild of Rosa Morison House have continued throughout 1924 their valuable work for the parent hospital and its Country Branch. The Pound Day Sale, organised by the former, held on the 26th October, increased its fund for the Hospital, and added to Matron's Store Cupboard 1100lbs. of Stores. The usual grant of £70 for the upkeep of the cot was forthcoming in November, together with an additional grant of £74 8s. to assist with the Hospital linen bill, provide a set of dilators, feather pillows, hot water bottles and Christmas turkeys.

The Rosa Morison House Guild, with its devoted helpers Lady Anderson and Miss Rosamund Spencer Wigram, is to be congratulated upon the result of the Garden Sale held in June, which realised over £210. Some of the Guild Fund is to be invested for future extension purposes, in accordance with the admirable intention of the Committee described in our last Report, and some of it was used in providing Christmas presents for the patients and a grant of £45 for linen.

(Statements of the Accounts of the Guilds will be found on pages 68 and 69.)

*The Patients' League* goes quietly upon its wonderful way. It has again given its annual subscription of £100 to the Hospital, and the sum of £200 towards the upkeep of the League Ward at Rosa Morison House. A Sale was held at

the Hospital in November, which was very successful, and much enjoyed by all who attended it. The Committee warmly approve the intention of the League to make the first Bed in the proposed Extension their third named Bed.

*Christmas.*—Thanks, once more, to the Guilds and many other devoted friends, Christmas both at the Hospital and the House of Recovery passed very happily for the patients. The Committee in thanking all concerned would specially mention the Committees of the Guilds both in London and at Barnet, the President and Treasurer of the Patients' League, with Dr. Macdonald and all the Members. They are sorry to report that, owing to bereavement, Miss Dorothea Webb was unable to give her usual Christmas Concert. In offering her their sympathy they are glad to know that she intends, all being well, to resume this much appreciated kindness next Christmas.

*Handicrafts Workshop.*—At the end of 1923, Lady Hall, Miss Spencer Wigram, Miss Thomas and Mrs. Hilliard started a Handicrafts Working Party, with the object of making and selling handicrafts in aid of the Hospital funds. An enthusiastic band of workers has met twice a week throughout the year, who make a great variety of beautiful things. A Sale was held in November, at Lady Plender's house in Kensington, which raised the maximum amount possible, as the goods for sale were literally sold out! The Committee have the honour to report that Her Majesty the Queen graciously accepted a file, the work of Lady Hall, a music box made by Miss Wigram and a leather calendar by Miss Thomas. The Handicrafts Party is now one of the established activities at work in the Hospital interest, and the Board desire to thank and congratulate the promoters of the effort, as well as each and everyone of the individual workers.

*Annual Meeting.*—The Governors' Annual Meeting was held on the 13th March. The Right Honourable Lord Riddell presided, supported by Mrs. Fawcett, LL.D., now Dame Millicent Fawcett, to whom the Committee offer their warmest congratulations.

*Medical Staff Changes.*—At the end of the year Miss Aldrich-Blake, M.S., M.D., resigned her post of Senior Surgeon, after service on the Honorary Staff of the Hospital extending over 30 years. The sense of almost irreparable loss, caused by Miss Aldrich-Blake's decision to retire, which was felt by the Committee and all connected with the Hospital, can be best expressed by quoting the following Resolution of the Board of Management on receiving her resignation :

“ The Board of Management receive with deep regret  
 “ Miss Aldrich-Blake's resignation of the post of senior  
 “ surgeon to the Elizabeth Garrett Anderson Hospital.  
 “ During her thirty years' tenure of her position on the  
 “ Honorary Staff her brilliant surgery, her judgment and skill  
 “ have enhanced the reputation and usefulness of the Hospital,  
 “ and contributed greatly to the status of medical women.  
 “ Her wise counsels have been greatly valued, her work has  
 “ been an inspiration to all who have come into contact with  
 “ her, her influence for good has been profound. The Board  
 “ of Management are fully conscious that she has never spared  
 “ herself, that she has given freely of her time, and that she  
 “ has with forethought and generosity realised the need of the  
 “ Hospital for enlargement; they wish to place on record  
 “ their sense of the inestimable service she has rendered to the  
 “ Hospital, and the great loss sustained in her resignation.”

The Committee are glad to take this opportunity of congratulating Miss Aldrich-Blake upon the recognition of her services to the Community by His Majesty the King, who in the New Year list of Honours made her a Dame Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire.

The Committee report with pleasure that Dame Louisa has consented to serve upon the Consulting Staff.

Miss Hedda Alstrom, M.B., B.S., resigned her position as Physician-in-charge of the Mechano-Therapeutic Department last June, and Mrs. Kellgren-Cyriax, L.R.C.P. and S.Ed., has been appointed in her place. Miss Alstrom had served upon the Honorary Staff since 1920, but her tenure of her post had extended over a much greater period, and the Committee gratefully acknowledge her long and admirable service.

Miss Bolton, M.D., B.S., succeeds to the post of Senior Surgeon, and Miss Rawlins, M.B., B.S., has been appointed to Miss Bolton's late position. Miss Mocatta, M.D., F.R.C.S., has been appointed as Assistant Surgeon to fill the vacancy created on the Junior Staff by the changes among the Seniors.

*Almoner's Department.*—The work of the Almoner's Department has steadily increased during the past year. Many more patients from the wards have been referred by the Medical Staff for help of various kinds when they leave the Hospital. Convalescent treatment and the provision of surgical appliances is a matter of routine, but many other forms of after-care are required. Help in the housework, extra nourishment, clothing, payment of fares to Hospital, care of the unmarried mother, regular visiting to all incurable cases, may be mentioned as examples. Radium treatment has been arranged in many instances.

In the out-patient department, as in the wards, the work has also increased, and from the dental department all patients requiring artificial teeth are sent to the Almoner.

The result of another year's work has been satisfactory, as it seems to prove that social service and after-care are required to complete the medical and surgical treatment given in Hospital.

It is greatly regretted that Miss Johnson, who kindly undertook to visit special cases, had to give up the work on account of leaving London. The Committee is much indebted to Mrs. Marshall-Smith, who now comes once a week to check the accounts of the Samaritan Fund.

(A statistical report of the work of the Almoner's Department will be found on pages 34 and 35.)

*Numbers of Patients.*—During the year, 1,497 patients were admitted—110 more than in 1923. Of these 1,012 were surgical, 356 medical, 58 maternity, 49 infants and 22 special cases. The number of patients sent on to Rosa Morison House for completion of treatment was 588. New Out-Patients numbered 10,447, of whom 438 were patients attending the Evening Clinics—202 V.D. and 236 Skin Departments—and 514 ante-natal cases. The number of Out-Patient attendances registered was 56,564, as compared with 51,770 in 1923. Of these 4,416 attended the Evening Clinics—2,633 V.D., 1,380 Skin and 403 Dental Departments—and 3,192 were attendances upon Maternity cases on the District.

*Maternity Department.*—The number of Maternity patients attended on the District was 296 as compared with 302 in 1923. The total numbers for the Department show a decrease. There were 514 patients seen at the Ante-natal Clinic, of whom 218 were consultation cases—as against 617 in the previous year. It is significant that the decrease in the numbers for the Department has been gradual but continuous, and would serve to shew that the Hospital is beginning to suffer from the frequent inability of the Obstetricians to admit cases, even cases in labour—who have been booked and expect admission—owing to the inadequate and unsuitable accommodation at their disposal. All who are interested in this essential feature of the work of a Woman's Hospital are urged to do their best to help the Hon. Mrs. Fletcher

Moulton in raising the £5,000 necessary for providing adequate Labour and Maternity Wards in the improvement of the Hospital.

*Accounts.*—The adverse balance shown on the Income and Expenditure account is not so alarming as it appears, and has, indeed, been wiped out during January of this year. It was due to the temporary diminution of income caused by the conversion of some £20,000 of 5 per cent. War Stock into 4½ per cent. Conversion Loan, dividends upon which are payable in January instead of December.

Annual Subscriptions were maintained, £1,296 17s. 0d. as against £1,295 14s. 2d. in 1923. The Committee desire to thank Miss Ethel Stevenson of Stoke Poges, who compounded her Annual Subscription this year, by sending a sum which enabled them to invest £100 in Southern Railway Preference Stock at 5 per cent., which will bring in the yearly sum of £5 in perpetuity. Donations were slightly increased, £791 as against £714. £108 16s. 0d. was collected in Hospital Boxes and the Legacies received amounted to £2,655. In addition the Committee gratefully acknowledge the following grants :
