 mility acknowledging the unwearied paines, care and great charge, befides hazard of health and life, which you the noble worthies of this honourable and renowned Affembly have undergon,for the fafety both of Church and Common-wealth, for a long time already paft; for which not onely we your humble Petitiones, and all wellaffeeted in this Kingdome: but alfo all other good Chriftians

Chrinians are bound now and at all rimes to acknowledge; yet notwithtanding that many worthy doeds have beene done by you, great danger and feare doe ftill attendus, \&ewill, as long as Popifh. Lords \&x fupertious Bimops are fuffered to have their voice in the Houfe of Peeres, \& that accurfed and abhominable Idoll of the Maffe fuftered in the Kingdome, and that Arch-enemy of our profperity and Retormation lyeth in the Tower yet not receiving his deferved puni hmment.

All thefe undercorrection, gives us a great caufe to fufpea, that God is angry with us, and to be the chiefe caules w'iy your pious indeavours for a further Reformation proceedeth not with that fucceffe as you defire, and is moftearneftly prayed for of all that with well to true Religion, and the florifhing eftate both of King and Kingdome; the infolencies of the Papitts and their abbettor's, raifeth a jult feare and furpition of fowing fedition, and breaking out into bloody perfecution in this Kingdom, as they have don in Ireland, the thoughts of which fad and barbarous events, maketh our tender hearts to melt within us, forcing us humbly ro Petition to this honourable Affembly, to make fafe provifion for your felves and us, befire it be too lafe.

And whereas we, whafe herrts have joynted cheerefully with all thofe Petitions which havebeene exhibited unto you in the bebalfe of the purity of Religion, and the liberty of our Hufbands, perfons yand entates, recounting our felves to have an interen in the common priviledges witl them, doe with the fame confidence aflure our felves to find the fame gracious acceptance with you, for eafing of thofe grievances, which in regard of our fraile condition, do more neerly concerne
as, and doe deeply terrifie our foules: our Domefticall dangers with which this Kingdome is fo much diftraeted, efpecially growing on us from thofe treacherous and wicked attempts already are fuch, as we find our felves to have as deepe a thare as any others

Wecannot but tremble at the very thoughts of tie horid and hideous facts which modefty forbids us nor to name occafioned by the bloody Warres in Germany, his Majelties late Northerne Army, how often did it affright our hearts, whilit their violunce began to break out fo furiounly upon the perfons of thofe, whofe Hufbands or Parents were not able to refcte: Wee wifh we had no caufe to fpeike of thole infolencies, and favage ufage and unheard of rapes, exercifed upon our Sex in Ireland, and have we not juft caufe to feare they wil prove the fore-runners of ourruine, except Almigh ty God by the wifdome and care of this Parliament de pleafed to fuccor us,our Husbands and children, which are as deere and tender unto us, as the lives and blood of our hearts, to fee them murthered and mangled and cut in pieces before our eyes, to fee our chitdren dath. ed againft the fones, and the Mothers milke mingled with the Infants blood, running down the ftreets; to fee our Houfes. on flaming fire over our heads: oh how dreadfull would this be! weethought it mifery chongh (though nothing to that we have jutt caufe to feare) but few yeares fince for fome of our Sex, by unjuf divifions from their bofome comforts, to be rendred in a manner Widdowes; and the children Fatherleffe, Hulbands were Imprifoned from the Society of their wives, even againft the Lawes of God and Nature, and Hittle Infants fuffered in their Fathers banifhments:
thoufands of our deereft friends have been compelled to fly from Epifcopall perfecutions into defert places among ft vild Beafts, there finding more fivour then in their mative foyle, and in the milit of all ther forrowes, fuch lith the pity of the Prelates beene, that our cryes could never enter into their eares or hearts, nor yet througli multitudes of obeructions could never huve aceeffe or come nigh to thofe Royall marcies ofour mont gracious Soveraigne, which we confidently hope, woald have relieved us: but afer all thefe preffures ended, we humbly fignifie, that our prefent feares are, that unleffe the blood-thirfty faction of the Papifts and Prelates be hindred in their defignes, our fe'ves here in England as well as they in reland, thall be expofed to that mifery which is more intollerable then that which is already pint, as namely to the rage not of men alone, but of Devilsincarnate, (as we may fo fay) befides the thraldon? of our foukes ind confeiences in mitters concerning God, which of all things are moft deareunto us,

Now the remembrance of all there fearefull accidents a forementioned, doe forongly move us from the example of the womin of Takoa to fall lubmiffively at the feet of his Majeltie, ourdreid Soveraigne, and cry Help O King, help $C$ yee the noble Worthies now fitting in Parliament : And we humbly befeech you, that you will be a meanes to his Majeftie and the Houfe of Pceres, that they will be pleafed to take our heartbreaking grievances into timely confideration, and adde Itrength and incouragement to your noble indeavours, and futher, that you would move his Myjeftie with our humble requefts, that he would begracioully

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pleated according to the example of the good King Ala, to purge both the Court and Kingdome of that great Idolatrous Service of the Maff, which is tollerated in the Queenes Court, this fine (as we conceiv) is able to draw downe a greater curfe upon the whole Kingdome, then all your noble and pious indexvours can prevent, which was the caufe that the good and pious King Asa would not fuffer Idolatry in his one Mother, whole example if it Shall pleafe his Majefties gracious goodneffe to follow, in putting downe Popery and Idolatry both in great and fall, in Court and in the Kingdome throughout, to fubduc the $\mathrm{Pa}_{\mathrm{A}}$ pits and their abetters, and by taking away the power of the Prelats, whole government by long and wofull experience wee have found to be againft the liberry of our conscience and the freedome of the Gofpell, and the sincere profeffion and practife thereof, then hall our fares be removed, and we may expect that God vil powre down his bleffings in aboundance both upon his Majeftie, and uponthis Honourable Affembly and upon the whole Land.

## The Reafons follow.

I may be thought frange, and unbecleeming our fex to Chew our felves by way of Petition to this Honourable Affembly: but the matter being rightly confidered, of the right and inpereft we have in the common aud publique caufe of the Church, it will, as we conceive (under correction) be found a duty commanded and required.

Firlt, becaufe Chrift hath purchafed us at as deare a rate as he hath done Men, and therefore requireth the like obedience for the fame mercy as of men.

Secondly, becaule in the free enjoyning of Chrift in his own Laws, \& a flourifhing eftate of the Church and common wealth, confifteth the happineffe of wo. men, as well as men.

Thirdly, becaule women are fharers in the common Calamities that accompany both Church and Common Wealth, when oppreffion is exercifed over she Church or Kingdome whercin they live, and an unlimited power hath bin given to the Prelats, to exercife authority over the Confciences of Women, as well as men, Witneffe Newgate, Smithfield, and other places of perfecution, wherein Women as well as Men have felt the fmart of their Fury.
Neither are weleft without example in Scripture, for when the flate of the Church, in the time of Ring Ahafuerus, was by the bloody enemies thereof fought to beurterly deftroyed, we find shat Hefiey the Queen, ant her Maids fafted and prayed,and that Hefler peritioned to the King, in the behalfe of the Church, and though the enterprized this dury with the bazard of her owne
life, being contrary to the law to appeare beforethe, $K$ ing before fhewere fent for, yet her lose to the Clurch carryed her thorow all difficultes, to the performance of that duty.

On which grounds we are imboldned to prefer $t$ our humbic Petition unto this Honourable Afembly, not weighting the reproaches which may and are by many caft upon us, who (doe well weighing the prénifes, ) fcoffe and deride our good intent. We doe it not out of any felfe conceit, or pride of heart, as feekphg to equall our felves with men, either in Authority or tiff dome: But according to our places to difcharge that duty weowe to God, and the caufe of the Church, as farre as lyeth in us, following herein the example of. she Men, which have gone in this duty before us.
