My dear little Lassie

How kind of you to write me
such nice letters. How pleased
Mrs. dear Mother came to see me
today, and brought me all kinds
of nice things - Cakes, jellies, neat
chocolates, I don't know what. So
you see I am not losing the hours
of food of which you spoke. I hope I
shall be sentenced such weeks & then

I shall not be able to have extra food
I shall have bread all day for
the prisoners - perhaps make
shirts for men who will not give us

the vote! We women in prison
too are not have a hard time
like the first prisoners. It must
have been terrible then. It is
being in a cell all by myself,
that I mind most. I shall have

to tell you all about prison when I
see you next.
