## Women Febbows of the Royal Society

On Friday Miss Norton looked out the information for which you asked.

It was in October, 1944, that the Council of the Royal Society amended its statutes so that women could be elected to the Fellowship of the Society. The President then was Sir Henry Dale.

The first women to be elected were Kathleen Lonsdale, D.Sc. (now a member of the Fawcett Society) and the late Miss Marjory Stephenson, the Cambridge bio-chemist. That was in March 1945. The President of the Royal Society for 1945-50 was Sir Robert Robinson, but I do not know when the Society's year begins. But Sir Henry Dale was obviously responsible when the statutes were amended to make their election possible.

When the change in the statutes was reported the Manchester Guardian referred to the attempt made, unsuccessfully, in 1902 to get Hertha Ayrton elected a Fellow.

It was reported that the change in the statutes was made to make it clear that, since the passing of the Sex Disqualification (Removal) Act there is no barrier to the admission of women. But it took them 25 years to do this!
