#### CONSTITUTION.

#### NAME.

The Women's Social and Political Union.

#### OBJECTS.

To secure for Women the Parliamentary Vote as it is or may be granted to men; to use the power thus obtained to establish equality of rights and opportunities between the sexes, and to promote the social and industrial well-being of the community.

#### METHODS.

The objects of the Union shall be promoted by-

- 1. Action entirely independent of all political parties.
- 2. Opposition to whatever Government is in power until such time as the franchise is granted.
- 3. Participation in Parliamentary Elections in opposition to the Government candidate and independently of all other candidates.
- 4. Vigorous agitation upon lines justified by the position of outlawry to which women are at present condemned.
- 5. The organising of women all over the country to enable them to give adequate expression to their desire for political freedom.
- 6. Education of public opinion by all the usual methods such as public meetings, demonstrations, debates, distribution of literature, newspaper correspondence, and deputations to public representatives.

Women of all shades of political opinion who approve the objects and methods of the Union, and who are prepared to act independently of party, are eligible for membership.

#### SUBSCRIPTION.

There is no fixed Subscription, but Members are asked to give all the financial assistance they are able.

### Report of the Committee.

In presenting the balance-sheet for the year ending February 28th, 1907, the Committee desire to set down a few statistics of the growth of the Union during the year.

Expenditure.—The expenditure has been progressive during the year. For the quarter March-May, 1906, it amounted to £124; from June to August, 1906, £350; from September to November, 1906, £768; and from December, 1906, to February, 1907, £1,252.

At the date of going to press, the expenditure is, roughly, on an average, £100 a week, or at the rate of £5,000 per year.

Income.—The support accorded to the movement followed the same upward tendency during the year. During the last two months special funds were created for Bye-Elections, the great London conventions, hospitality, and work in Scotland; these amounted to £68, £143, £11, and £19 respectively. At the date when this Report is published the Union is in debt to the Treasurer to the amount of £200, and funds are urgently needed if the work is to keep pace with the growing demand all over the country.

Branches.—At the commencement of the financial year, March, 1906, only three branches were in existence. At the end of the year the number amounted to 47, and is now 58. A full list of branch secretaries and addresses to date will be found on page 3 of cover.

**Organisers.**—Owing to the extraordinary demand for speakers and organisation all over the country it has been found necessary to add repeatedly to the number of organisers. The list now consists of the following:—

whose services are in constant demand all over the country.

Miss Nellie Kenney has also been appointed recently as an Assistant Organiser.

Premises.—For the first six months of the year all the work of the Union was done in rooms in the houses of friends, but when the work became too large this plan had to be abandoned and special offices were taken, consisting of three rooms in 4, Clement's Inn, and later, February, 1907, a further addition of four rooms was found necessary in order to enable the work to be carried on satisfactorily. These rooms are constantly filled with voluntary workers, whose services are most valuable in the furtherance of the agitation. Sympathisers with the movement are always welcome at these offices, which are open from 9 to 6 every day of the week, and in particular to the "At Homes" on Monday afternoons when they meet the leaders of the movement. During the past quarter these "At Homes" have been regularly attended by from 100 to 200 people.

**Literature.**—The rapidly growing interest in the question is evinced by the large sale of literature which is taking place. The literature department is now, since January 1st, 1907, on a separate footing, and the sales are not included in the general list of income and expenditure. During January of the present year they amounted to between £30 and £40 and during February to between £70 and £80. A more complete statement will be published in the next balance-sheet.

Bye-Elections.—One of the most successful features of the campaign has been the policy of visiting the scenes of Bye-Elections and taking a prominent part in the contest, not in favour of any one Candidate, but as an Independent Women's party, opposing the Government Nominee so long as the Government refuses to make Women's Suffrage a Government Measure. In this way the following Bye-Elections were fought during the year:—Cockermouth, Huddersfield, Aberdeen, and Hexham, and in every case the Government majority was considerably reduced from the figures in the General Election. In Aberdeen the reduction amounted to 4,000, and in Cockermouth the Government majority was turned into a minority.

Demonstrations and Arrests,—Prior to March, 1906, two women only, Miss Christabel Pankhurst and Miss Annie Kenney, had been arrested for standing firm to their principles; between that date and February 28th, 1907, the following arrests and imprisonments took place:—

Since the close of the year this number has been further swelled by 76 women who repeated on March 20th the offence of February 13th, and were brought before the magistrate, 67 being sent to prison and serving an aggregate sentence of about 132 weeks. Up to the present, therefore, since the beginning of the agitation until now an aggregate of over six years of imprisonment has been served by women in the cause of their enfranchisement.

Meetings.—The total number of public meetings addressed during the year by the leading organisers of the movement has exceeded 1,200. Many of these meetings have been extraordinarily large, the audiences frequently running into thousands, and in some cases into tens of thousands. Among out-door meetings special mention should be made of that at the Boggart Hole Clough, Manchester, which was attended by over 20,000 persons, and of Hyde Park meetings, audiences frequently amounting to 12,000; of indoor meetings, that organized by the Union at Exeter Hall on March 8th, when tickets for every seat in the huge hall were sold in advance, and some 500 to 1,000 people were turned away from the doors.

Conventions.—The Union has held two Conventions of Women attended by delegates from all parts of the country. These Conferences have on each occasion passed a resolution calling upon the Prime Minister and the Government to remove the disability of sex from the status of political citizenship; and have by a rider to that resolution appointed a deputation to carry the resolution to the House of Commons. On the first occasion the deputation was met by a strong force of mounted police, who failed in the attempt to terrorize the women by riding them down. On the last occasion far less barbarous police methods were used to disperse the women. On both occasions arrests were made, followed by imprisonments.

The Future.—The end of the Winter Campaign of the past seven months is to be celebrated by a Mass Meeting in Exeter Hall on May 30th, which will be addressed by the Organizers of the Union. The Summer Open-air Campaign has already begun. Meetings and Demonstrations in the parks, squares, and streets of those cities which are great industrial centres of population, will be organised all over the country during the coming summer. Cottage Meetings and Open-air Meetings will be held in rural districts. In Bye-Elections, the W.S.P.U. will continue its present Policy of Independence, entering the field as a Woman-Party, agitating for woman's enfranchisement and working against the nominees of a Government which opposes and obstructs this belated reform. Branches of the Union will be formed which will become self-supporting centres of local work and organization.

The Need of the Hour.—We must have the names and addresses of thousands of women who are prepared to give their time, their capacities, their influence, and their substance to effect the emancipation of womanhood. The help of every woman in the country

is needed now if the fetters are to be struck off that keep women a subject race, and the barriers broken down that bar the way to their development, and arrest the evolution of the race. If women will unite together now, regardless of class distinction and of all differences of political creed, and will make one long strong pull together, they will win their political right. This is the key of the whole position. The Women's Social and Political Union can organize the voluntary services of thousands of women.

We must have money to run this great political agitation—the greatest agitation of modern times, and the most significant. More than twenty thousand pounds must be raised, if the work is to be carried on at the present accelerating rate of expansion. Women must follow the lead of the Viscountess Harberton, who states that she will withdraw her subscriptions from every other society, and devote all that she can give to the Woman's Cause until it is won. We call upon professional women to follow the lead of the writer of the Play, "Votes for Women," Miss Elizabeth Robins, who, in contributing 25 per cent. of the profits of that Play to the Suffrage campaign fund, urges "women who have the enlightenment of earning what money they spend, to contribute money to help a cause we believe to be bound up with the finer issues of civilization."

The sums in the subscription list published herewith represent real sacrifices—holidays foregone, pleasures abandoned, dress luxuries curtailed, and in many cases encroachments made upon the very necessities of life. Enthusiasm and self-sacrifice are alive in the hearts of women to-day. We are confident that there are twenty thousand women prepared to see this thing through, that there are more than twenty thousand prepared to give all they can, both in life and in substance, in work or in money to free themselves and their children. Let each woman who loves justice and freedom, who knows that in the awakening of women is the hope of the future of the world, do what she can. There will be then no doubt of the result. We shall get twenty thousand pounds and as much more as we want—we shall get, at no very distant date, the Victory.

#### CONSTITUTION.

#### OBJECTS.

To secure for Women the Parliamentary Vote as it is or may be granted to men; to use the power thus obtained to establish equality of rights and opportunities between the sexes, and to promote the social and industrial well-being of the community.

METHODS.

The objects of the Union shall be promoted by-

- 1. Action entirely independent of all political parties.
- 2. Opposition to whatever Government is in power until such time as the franchise is granted.
- 3. Participation in Parliamentary Elections in opposition to the Government candidate and independently of all other candidates.
- 4. Vigorous agitation upon lines justified by the position of outlawry to which women are at present condemned.
- 5. The organising of women all over the country to enable them to give adequate expression to their desire for political freedom.6. Education of public opinion by all the usual methods, such as public
- meetings, demonstrations, debates, distribution of literature, newspaper correspondence and deputations to public representatives.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

Women of all shades of political opinion who approve the objects and methods of the Union, and who are prepared to act independently of party, are eligible for membership. It must be clearly understood that no member of the Union shall support the candidate of any political party in Parliamentary elections until women have obtained the Parliamentary Vote.

### Report of the Committee.

In presenting the Second Annual Report the Committee are pleased to be able to chronicle the extraordinary strides which have been made in the past twelve months. The question of Votes for Women has been brought into the very front rank of political issues, and the National Women's Social and Political Union is now recognised by opponents as a formidable champion of the woman's cause. Above everything the Committee have pleasure in noticing the large and rapidly growing sympathy and support which is being accorded by women of every class all over the country.

A year's growth.—Some idea of the growth of the Organisation may be gathered from the fact that the expenditure for the second year has been two-and-a-half times that for the first, the premises have been doubled, and the staff tripled in the period. These extensions have been rendered necessary by the demands made on the resources and abilities of the Union—demands which increase from day to day at a rate with which it is difficult to keep pace.

Synopsis of Work Done.—During the twelve months ending February 29th, 1908, the Union has held in different parts of the country upwards of 5,000 meetings, it has fought with success thirteen by-elections, it has sold £750 worth of literature and started a newspaper of its own. On three occasions during the year women have endeavoured to lay the case for their enfranchisement before the Government in the House of Commons and have suffered arrest and imprisonment to the number of 130. Many women also have faced rough treatment at public meetings in order that they might put questions to Cabinet Ministers. The Committee record with satisfaction the change of attitude towards the militant tactics of the Union which the general public are now for the first time beginning to understand.

Financial Statement. — The principal features of the accounts which are given on pages 12 and 13 are as follows:—The receipts are over £7,000 as against £3,000 the year before; the number of subscribers has risen from 600 to 2,000. The expenditure is £6,500 against £2,500 last year; this includes rent, £350; salaries, £1,500; printing, £500; meetings, £700; travelling, £700; and by-election expenses, £800. Writing on January 31st, the *Daily Telegraph* spoke in high praise of the economy practised by the Union and of the "knack that the women possessed of making the funds go a long way."

By-Elections.—One of the most effective weapons of political warfare has been the active part taken by the Union in thirteen by-elections. In Hexham, Stepney, Rutland, Jarrow, Colne Valley, North West Staffordshire, Bury St. Edmunds, Hull, Mid-Devon, South Herefordshire, Worcester, South Leeds, and Hastings the Union has been represented by some of the leading speakers, and has pursued its policy of opposing the Liberal nominee with remarkable success. Everywhere the women have drawn far greater crowds than the candidates; and their reception has been most enthusiastic. The most striking result was obtained in Mid-Devon, where contrary to the expectations of the party wirepullers, the Liberal majority of 1,300 was wiped out and an adverse majority of over 500 put in its place. Similar. if less noted, changes of votes took place in most of the other constituencies, and in every case the Liberal poll was reduced, the total reduction being 13,000 votes, or on an average 1,000 votes in each constituency. The whole of this effective work has been carried out by the Union at a cost of about £800, or less than the expense incurred by a candidate in fighting a single seat.

Meetings.—Upwards of 5,000 meetings in all have been held by the Union during the year, of which about 400 have included audiences of over a 1,000 people each.

Among the most important indoor meetings have been one in the Queen's Hall (London), two in the Exeter Hall (London), three in the Town Hall (Birmingham), one in the St. James' Theatre (Manchester), two in the St. Andrew's Hall (Glasgow),

one in the Synod Hall (Edinburgh), one in the Mechanics' Hall (Nottingham), one in the Victoria Rooms (Bristol), one in the Beverley Road Baths, and another in the Assembly Rooms (Hull), and one in the St. George's Hall (Bradford). An outdoor meeting, held every Sunday during the summer in Hyde Park (London), was attended by upwards of 5,000 people each week, and a similar meeting was held in Victoria Park. In South Leeds, during the elections, there were several gigantic meetings, one of 20,000 to 30,000, and another estimated by the police at 100,000. Other large meetings were also held in Preston, Bury Bristol, Portsmouth, Southampton, Leicester, and other places. Owing to the extraordinary interest which is taken in Votes for Women as the result of the activities of the Union, it has been found possible to make all the larger meetings a source of income instead of a drain upon the finances. Tickets have been issued the sale of which have more than recouped the Union for all outlay incurred in these cases. The Committee believe this experience to be unique in political propaganda, and hold it to be a striking testimony to the popularity and vitality of the

Demonstrations.—On four occasions during the year the Union has taken part in militant action, leading to the arrest and imprisonment of many of its members. On March 20th, 1907, 76 women were arrested for attempting to carrying a resolution to the House of Commons, of these 67 were sent to prison and served an aggregate sentence of 132 weeks. On January 17th, 1908, several women endeavoured to lay their case before the members of the Cabinet sitting in Downing Street, 5 of them were arrested, and served three weeks each in prison. On February 11th, 12th, and 13th, 1908, took place the Woman's Parliament in the Caxton Hall, and a resolution was passed with a view to being taken to the House of Commons by a number of women. On their way 50 were arrested, and subsequently 47 of them sentenced to six weeks' imprisonment for refusing to be bound over to keep the peace, and 2 others were sentenced to a month. These cases were dealt with under the Prevention of Crimes Act, but the solicitor for the prosecution threatened future suffragist offenders with an Act of Charles II, dealing with the presentation of petitions to Parliament according to which they

would be liable to three months' imprisonment. This would have meant the recognition of the demonstrators as political offenders, and in spite of the heavy penalty involved, it was decided to accept the challenge and to send another deputation to Parliament. Accordingly, Mrs. Pankhurst and Annie Kenney, and eleven others attempted to take a petition to the House of Commons on February 13th; they were almost immediately arrested, and although they made every effort, consistent with their purpose of going to the House, to comply with police instructions, they were charged with obstructing the police, and 8 of them were sent to prison for six weeks, and 2 for a month.

The aggregate sentences served by women in the cause of their enfranchisement during this year alone have been, therefore, over 350 weeks, or seven years in all, as against an aggregate of 191 weeks, or four years, during 1906-7.

Protests at Public Meetings.—Another form of militant action undertaken by members of the Union during the year has been that of making of protests at public meetings addressed by Cabinet Ministers against the refusal of the Government to grant votes to women. Undismayed by ejection, women have persistently availed themselves of these opportunities of drawing the attention of the public and of the Government to their political grievance. These effective protests have been made at 30 or 40 meetings addressed by Mr. Asquith, Mr. Haldane, Mr. Birrell, Mr. Lloyd George, Mr. Harcourt, and other members of the Government.

Literature.—Few developments have been greater than the increased activity of the Union in the matter of literature. During the whole of 1906 a sale of some £60 worth was effected; at the beginning of 1907, the literature was placed in a separate department and during the year these sales amounted to nearly £650 or more than ten times as much; this total has to be increased by a further £200—sales effected during January and February of the present year. When it is remembered that this amount is largely made up out of sales of penny pamphlets of which about 100,000 have been disposed of, and that in addition half a million free leaflets have been distributed, the value of the propagandist work achieved in this way will be

appreciated. The department pays all its own expenses, including wages and rent, and makes a slight profit. Since the close of the financial year it has been transformed into *The Woman's Press*, by which name it will henceforth be known, but its relationship to the National Women's Social and Political Union remains unchanged.

Votes for Women Newspaper.—After taking part for a short time in a joint newspaper promoted by the various suffrage societies, the Union decided to have a paper of its own, and in October, 1907, Votes for Women was started as a monthly paper, price 3d.; in addition a supplement, price  $\frac{1}{2}$ d., was issued each week giving the incidental news. The popularity of the monthly numbers and the supplements has been considerable, the circulation has grown very rapidly, and it is expected that before very long the general demand that a full paper shall be issued weekly will have to be conceded.

Premises and Staff.—The close of the last financial year saw an extension of the offices of the Union from three to seven rooms; on January 1st, 1908, a further extension was found to be necessary, and the premises now consist of 13 well-appointed rooms where a staff of 18 to 20 are kept busily employed. Meanwhile the number of Organisers of the Union, who are at work throughout the country, has been increased from 7 to 14, so that the total staff is now between 30 and 40. This figure has to be compared with the 11 members of the staff who were employed in February, 1907.

The Weekly "At Homes."—An interesting feature of the London work has been a weekly "At Home," held every Monday afternoon from 4 to 6. This was originally held in the offices at 4, Clement's Inn, where 150 people could be accommodated. In February, 1908, owing to the difficulty of finding room for all our guests, it was decided to transfer the "At Homes" to the small Portman Rooms; in a fortnight the numbers had risen to over 400, and a further move was made to the large Portman Rooms, Baker Street, where over 600 men and women meet each week to discuss matters affecting the movement. The "At

Home" on Thursday evenings from 8 to 10, which has hitherto been held at the office, is now so largely attended that it will be transferred on March 26th to the small Portman Rooms, Dorset Street, and will be held there on every succeeding Thursday evening. All friends and visitors are cordially welcomed to these gatherings, where they can come into direct touch with the leaders of the movement and can gain information as to recent progress and future plans.

The Women's Enfranchisement Bill.—The Government having refused to meet our demand by promising votes for women in the King's speech, a private member, Mr. Stanger, introduced a Women's Enfranchisement Bill, which is along the lines we advocated, viz.: the simple removal of the sex disqualification. The second reading of this measure was carried on February 28th by 271 to 92. The discussion was marked by far greater seriousness than before, every speaker but one recognising the political significance of the present movement for woman suffrage. There seemed also to be a feeling amongst most of the members that the leaders of our agitation, however mistaken in their course of action, were women of high character and disinterested political purpose. Mr. Herbert Gladstone, in his speech, which was in the nature of an explanation to the suffragettes of Government inertia, provided in fact, a complete justification of our militant methods, by explaining that political dynamics rather than argument are necessary in order to secure the passing of any suffrage measure. The present position of the Bill is that owing to the ill-advised action of its supporters it has been sent to a Committee of the whole House instead of to a "Standing Committee." It will, therefore, be blocked unless the Government provide time for its further discussion. This they are not likely to do unless compelled by pressure of our militant agitation, which must, therefore, go forward with this end in view.

Self-Denial Week.—On February 15th, the day following upon the imprisonment of the Founder of the Union, began a week of self denial for the members. During that week the

Suffrage movement took the first place in the thoughts of thousands of women, no matter how poor, nor busy, nor how full of care their every-day life might be. The sum total raised by these united efforts will be announced at the great meeting in the Albert Hall, on 19th March. Many well-known writers sent their books to be sold for the union; women sent lace, jewellery, and other valuables, and some of their gifts are still on sale at 4, Clement's Inn. Space forbids enumeration of the generous gifts and givers, but a special report to be issued later will tell many an interesting story of devotion and self-sacrifice. No great movement can fail to win its way to victory which can count on the love and enthusiasm that inspires the members of our Women's Social and Political Union. There is a gift more precious even than money: that is the gift of work and life. The acknowledgment and the thanks of all women are due to the devoted band of voluntary workers now numbering hundreds of women. The Committee herewith sets on record its very deep appreciation of their invaluable service. The Committee is also indebted to the local unions throughout the country who have zealously pushed forward the work; in particular it desires to acknowledge with gratitude the financial assistance, amounting in all to several hundred pounds, which it has received from them.

Prospect for the Future.—Never before was our prospect as bright as it is to-day. Never were the hearts of women lifted so high with hope and courage as now. We start upon the third year since the establishment of the National Headquarters in London with more than confidence—with glad certainty that the victory will be won in the immediate future. Now is the time for the outpouring of energy, service and money. Every woman must help. More vigorous and more effective methods of bringing pressure to bear upon the Government must be put into force. It is an immense task. The Government have told us quite plainly that they are going to make it as hard and as difficult as they possibly can. It is to be a fight every inch of the way. We are ready. We know that the coming campaign will need all the devotion, all the resource, all the

energy, all the money that the women of the country can bring into it. But women are coming into the ranks every day in great numbers. We on our part are determined to spare no effort which may hasten the day of enfranchisement.

The Albert Hall Demonstration.—By persistent hard work on the part of all concerned, the present report and balancesheets have been audited and passed through the Press, within a fortnight of the close of the financial year, that they may be presented to the public before the great meeting in the Albert Hall. For many reasons, this will be a significant gathering. This is the first time, in the history of the suffrage agitation, that the Royal Albert Hall has been taken for a Women's Suffrage meeting. In spite of the enormous size of the Hall, the seating accommodation will be taxed to the uttermost to provide room for the numbers of women who have applied for tickets. Every place, including standing room in the gallery, will be paid for. Upon the bills printed two months previously, it is announced that Mrs. Pankhurst will take the chair. The chair will be empty. For Mrs. Pankhurst is in prison. Her daughter, Miss Christabel Pankhurst, will take charge of the meeting, but the spirit of Mrs. Pankhurst will dominate the audience from that vacant chair. And the spirit of that great audience will respond to that silent appeal with even deeper feeling than it would have responded to the living voice of the leader of the women's movement. Not only will the amount raised during self-denial week be announced, but on this momentous occasion an appeal will be made to those present to complete the £20,000 Fund started in May of last year.

Hyde Park on June 21st.—For work lies before us on an immensely larger and more National scale than we have yet undertaken. Great meetings in London and the provinces during the next three months are to culminate in a monster demonstration on the longest day of the year, Sunday, June 21st.

We have been challenged by the Government to show numbers. We accept the challenge. We will bring hundreds of thousands of women from all over the country to demonstrate on that day in Hyde Park. Arrangements are already made, both with the police authorities and with railway managers. There will be twenty platforms, the chairman and speakers of each platform will be women. Special trains will be run into every London terminus bringing women from every great town in the country. There will be processions of women converging upon Hyde Park from every part of London. We will silence once and for all those who deny the strength of women's demand for the vote. Thousands of pounds are needed for National advertisement and National organisation of this great scheme, which is going to make History for the Women's Movement. Arrangements must be set in hand at once.

Militant Action.—It will be for the Government to decide whether or not they will force the women of the country to take stronger militant action than they have already done. For our part, we shall not flinch from our duty. We are trustees for the honour of the womanhood of this country. We shall be true to this trust. The members of the Government, if they persist in their reactionary course of resistance to the just demand of women for constitutional rights, will find out to their cost that they are fighting the strongest force in human life, the force of right and truth and justice. Strong though they be, it is they who will suffer defeat, and it is right, truth and justice that will win the victory.

- By Becoming Members. In addition to joining the N.W.S.P.U., women living in places where there are local Unions will be welcomed by the local Secretary as members of the local Union, and can so take part in local work.
- By Subscribing to the Funds. The National Women's Social and Political Union has already spent £10,000 in fighting the battle of women for the vote. It has used this money to hold several thousand meetings up and down the country, to take a prominent part in twenty by-elections, and to leave no stone unturned to bring the question before every section of the community. Funds are urgently needed to carry on and extend the campaign, and contributions towards this sum are invited.
- By Circulating Literature. The National W.S.P.U. carries on a flourishing literature business under the name of The Woman's Press. Much valuable work can be done by buying our books, pamphlets, or leaflets, studying them and passing them on to other women.
- By Getting Up Meetings. Women are requested to get up drawing-room meetings and public meetings at which the need for the vote can be discussed. The National Women's Social and Political Union will be glad to send speakers to meetings when requested.
- By Giving Time and Services. Women are wanted for speaking and lecturing, for secretarial work in the office, for canvassing, for organizing meetings at by-elections and elsewhere, and for many other things. The Hon. Sec. of the National Women's Social and Political Union will be glad to know of any women able and willing to help in any of these ways.
- By Missionary Work. Women can use their influence with the men and women of their aequaintance on this question. They can induce other women to become members, to subscribe, and help in various ways.

#### CONSTITUTION.

#### OBJECTS.

DEFINITION SECURE for Women the Parliamentary Vote as it is or may be granted to men; to use the power thus obtained to establish equality of rights and opportunities between the sexes, and to promote the social and industrial well-being of the community.

#### METHODS.

The objects of the Union shall be promoted by-

- 1. Action entirely independent of all political parties.
- 2. Opposition to whatever Government is in power until such time as the franchise is granted.
- 3. Participation in Parliamentary Elections in opposition to the Government candidate and independently of all other candidates.
- 4. Vigorous agitation upon lines justified by the position of outlawry to which women are at present condemned.
- 5. The organising of women all over the country to enable them to give adequate expression to their desire for political freedom.
- Education of public opinion by all the usual methods, such as public meetings, demonstrations, debates, distribution of literature, newspaper correspondence and deputations to public representatives.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

Women of all shades of political opinion who approve the objects and methods of the Union, and who are prepared to act independently of party, are eligible for membership. It must be clearly understood that no member of the Union shall support the candidate of any political party in Parliamentary elections until women have obtained the Parliamentary Vote.

# SELF-DENIAL WEEK.

#### REPORT.

The story of the Votes for Women Movement, like the story of a human life, can never be fully told. An incident here, an experience there, a hint, a suggestion of the inspiration, the faith, the courage, the devotion, that led to achievement of the end, is all that will ever be known.

Even the story of Self-Denial Week can be told only by suggestion—by the selection of an incident here and there which illustrates the spirit in which the members of the Women's Social and Political Union seized upon the special opportunity afforded them of raising a Campaign Fund for putting through

their sacred war of independence and freedom.

When the announcement of the plan of Self-Denial Week was first made, the Treasurer said: "The sum total must run into four figures." A smile, half dubious as though doubtful of the possibility, but wholly responsive, passed from one to another of her audience. Was it possible that our members, already giving all that they could afford, in a spirit of generosity rarely shown in any movement, could raise an additional sum of four figures by a week of ingenuity and endeavour? The Votes for Women Movement has been from the outset almost entirely supported by women. And women are poor. They seldom hold the purse strings. And the lives, especially of working women and professional women, who make up the bulk of our membership are full of careful economy and of continuous self-denial. I read two meanings in the smile: "Is it possible?" and "If it is possible it shall be done."

But before the week began something had happened which answered the question "Is it possible?" once for all. Sixty of our members were in prison, including the founder of our Union, Mrs. Pankhurst. They had set the supreme standard of self-denial, and all question or hesitation was swept away. It was felt that any effort, any sacrifice, was possible; and in this spirit the result was achieved—a fund of over £6,800 was

raised.

It will be seen by the appended list that a great part of the total was made up in comparatively small amounts, but nearly every collection card is itself an aggregate of a number of small contributions, and nearly every card has a story of its own to tell. "Denial of summer outfit, Savings from housekeeping expenses" is the story of one quite typical card. "Water and dry toast for breakfast and tea all the week" produces 4s. 6d.

and some such entry figures often upon the returns sent into headquarters: "Three-quarters of a day's pay"; "A whole week's allowance"; "By going without butter, meat, and flowers"; "Fasting"; "From dress allowance"; "By walking to business and saving 'bus fares"; "By going without cabs, porters, etc."; "A week's earnings as schoolmistress"; "A day's needlework"; "Two dinners"; "Going without cocoa and milk." Here is the story of one contribution: "Saved in butter, Is. Id.; coals, Is. 4d.; food, 4s.; flowers, Is.; books, Is. 7d.; 'bus tickets, Iod.;—total, 9s. Iod."

"Coaching fees for a week," "A term's fees for a course of instruction given in a school," are two typical extracts from cards sent in by professional women. Theatres, entertainments, social enjoyments were given up by many, not only for the one week, but for the six weeks of the imprisonment of our friends. The following is a characteristic letter from a working woman who has herself and a child to support.

DEAR TREASURER.

Enclosed please find P.O. for the small amount of 3/2 per Self-Denial Fund. Perhaps you would like to know that the contributions are from working people whose wages range from 10/- to 15/- per week, which has to keep a large family. I was able to save 1/- by walking to business night and morning, leaving home at 6.30 a.m.

Please accept this sum with all sympathy, and cordial greetings to our dear Leaders and Comrades who have gone to prison in our stead.

Money saving was however only a small part of the week's endeavour. Money was earned in all kinds of ingenious ways. By pavement artistry, by violin playing and singing in the street, by playing barrel organs, by sweeping crossings, by selling flowers, by sale of home-made cakes, biscuits, jam, jelly, marmalade, chutney, and sweets. One working woman had more orders for homemade soap than she could execute, another provided a Votes for Women stamp for the soap cakes. Blouses and other clothing made and sold for the fund produced a good sum. A great deal of laundry work was done at home that week, and money both saved and earned in this way was given to swell the total. One collecting card contains the signatures of nine well-known writers-Violet Hunt, Lawrence Housman, May Sinclair, John Galsworthy, George Paston, E. V. Lucas, Henry Nevinson, Clarence Rook, and Evelyn Sharp. Women sent their jewellery, lace, china, and silver to be sold. Writers sent their autographed books, composers their songs, artists their pictures and handicraft. Several well-known women novelists collected at the metropolitan stations in Kensington. A lady who happened to be travelling in Italy with invalid friends sent £200. A distinguished scientist sent £100. I put her letter and the cheque it contained beside another that came by the same post, from a woman poor and an invalid, enclosing a postal order—the amount saved by going without tea and drinking hot water for the week, 7d.; flowers, 3d.; tram fare to free library, 3d.; her railway fare to

attend Women's Social and Political Union Meetings and At Homes ("my greatest treat" she wrote), 1/6; making a total

contribution of 2/7.

One lady in the West-end was so moved by the sight of Mrs. Pankhurst's arrest that she made up her mind to let her house in the West-end, and sent a cheque for the rent, £250. She afterwards extended this contribution to a promise of £1,000 a year till women win the vote. This sum represents more than half her income. She has divested herself of her house and possessions so that she may be ready, as she says, "to serve on National duty when called upon"; in other words, she is prepared to go in the next deputation to the House of Commons and ready to accept imprisonment or any impending consequences.

A Liberal woman called at the office the day after Mrs. Pankhurst's arrest and left £100 in bank notes. She would not give her name, but instructed the treasurer to acknowledge her contribution under the anonyme of "Eiletto." Another lady

gave £200, but wished to remain anonymous.

Mrs. Bernard Shaw sent up her name at the Albert Hall with a promise to give £100. Three contributions of £100 have been handed in by women doctors whose generosity we deeply appreciate. Several other large contributions were given. But at least half the total is made up of small contributions representing as much devotion and as much generosity as the

larger subscriptions.

In all these gifts we recognise neither "the more" or "the less." They represent the same giving of self, the same determination to put this great struggle for the emancipation of our sex before every other interest and claim, and to push it forward to the breaking down of every obstacle, to the overcoming of every difficulty, to its sure and speedy triumph. Right gladly we pay down the price of freedom, be it in money, in durance, in expenditure of nerve and health and strength, in months, in years of concentrated energy and work. We are as those who run a race—we have but one single purpose. That is to reach the goal. The goal is Votes for Women.

Should this report of Self Denial Week fall into the hands of any who have hitherto borne no part of the burden and the heat of the day; of any who have remained outside this struggle let me earnestly ask you, what are you going to do now? Are you coming in? We need you. We need your service your sacrifice, your influence, your work, your heart, your whole

body and soul.

Let these be your willing gifts to your sex and to the human generations which are to come. Will you endure prison? Do you care for freedom enough for that? Will you give half your income? Do you care for right enough for that? Will you give your reputation, your social position? Will you give

your all as some of the leaders of this movement have done, because of their reverence and their love for women?

Do you say "I have so little to give?" Give all you can. Never mind whether it is much or little.

A new campaign is before us, more exacting, more strenuous than anything than has gone before. Changes in the Government mean a crop of significant by-elections. The date of Women's enfranchisement will turn upon our success in keeping out of office every Government nominee. The Liberal Government has to learn that tyranny and reaction does not pay, that opposition to the just, constitutional demands of half the people means defeat at the polling booth. We have to work harder than ever.

The great Women's Demonstration in Hyde Park on Sunday, June 21st, promises to be the greatest that has ever yet been held in the whole history of franchise demonstrations. It will be at least twice as great as the record demonstration in 1867, when the Hyde Park railings were pulled down—probably three or four times as great. We do not intend to pull down railings. On the contrary the utmost forethought and organizing energy is being exercised in order to make this not only the largest, but the most orderly and thoroughly well marshalled, and well disciplined demonstration ever yet held. Those at head-quarters who are responsible for the arrangements mean to work all the resources of civilization in order to secure a great triumph on this day. We estimate that the cost of carrying the thing through upon the scale already planned will be about £5,000. You can encourage us and strengthen our hands immensely by sending special contributions to the Demonstrations Fund. You can help us in other ways. Between the issue of this Report and June 21st, all London has to be aroused. You must come and help to do it. A few days later, a National Convention of Women will be held in the Caxton Hall, and if the Government remain still obdurate to our demand for constitutional rights, it will be our duty as women to resort once more to determined militant action.

The call will be given for volunteers to serve on danger duty and to give once more their liberty, and a portion of their life to the service of humanity and the freedom of womanhood. Every record of past achievement is but the call to greater endeavour. The splendid success of Self-Denial Week is but the summons of the bugle to all good soldiers of the "Votes for Women" cause to hold themselves ready for greater sacrifice and more arduous service.

#### CONSTITUTION.

#### OBJECTS.

To secure for Women the Parliamentary Vote as it is or may be granted to men; to use the power thus obtained to established equality of rights and opportunities between the sexes, and to promote the social and industrial wellbeing of the community.

#### METHODS.

The objects of the Union shall be promoted by-

- 1. Action entirely independent of all political parties.
- Opposition to whatever Government is in power until such time as the franchise is granted.
- 3. Participation in Parliamentary Elections in opposition to the Government candidate and independently of all other candidates.
- 4. Vigorous agitation upon lines justified by the position of outlawry to which women are at present condemned.
- The organising of women all over the country to enable them to give adequate expression to their desire for political freedom.
- 6. Education of public opinion by all the usual methods, such as public meetings, demonstrations, debates, distribution of literature, newspaper correspondence and deputations to public representatives.

#### MEMBERSHIP.

Women of all shades of political opinion who approve the objects and methods of the Union, and who are prepared to act independently of party, are eligible for membership. It must be clearly understood that no member of the Union shall support the candidate of any political party in Parliamentary elections until women have obtained the Parliamentary Vote.

### Report of the Committee.

Owing to the extraordinarily rapid growth of the movement, the Committee decided a few weeks ago to publish an intermediate report and balance sheet for the six months ending August 31st, 1907.

Expenditure and Income.—Exclusive of the purchase and sales of literature, the total expenditure for the six months has been £2,700, or slightly in excess of the expenditure for the whole of the preceding year. This sum has only been raised by the combined efforts of a very large number of women who have taken their share in the fight for women's liberty.

The subscription list which is contained at the end of this report shows a few large subscriptions, but also smaller amounts from over 600 women. The Committee set themselves in May last to raise a £20,000 fund, a special feature of which should be subscriptions of £1 a-year from a large number of women. How far the collection of these promises has progressed will be seen from the accompanying statement. At the time of going to press the balance in the hands of the treasurer is under £200, and funds are urgently required for the heavy programme of autumn work which is in progress.

Synopsis of Work Done.—While the expenditure during the six months has been, as pointed out, slightly in excess of that for the whole of the preceding year, the amount of work covered in the same period far exceeds all previous efforts.

The most important feature of all has been the campaign, which has been conducted in seven by-elections. Other important features have been the enormous number of mass meetings which have been held all over the country, the stall which has been opened at Earl's Court, the great propaganda by literature which has been conducted all through the period. In addition to these, the demonstration held outside the House of Commons on March 20th, was the largest ever conducted by the W.S.P.U. As a result, 67 women were sent to prison and served an aggregate sentence of 132 weeks.

The By-Elections.—During the six months the W.S.P.U.

has taken part in seven by-elections—Hexham, Stepney, Rutland, Jarrow, Colne Valley, North-west Staffs, Bury St. Edmunds; and every one of these has been conducted on a much larger scale than was possible during 1906.

In addition to several of the principal organisers, there has been a band of Volunteers numbering 30 or 40 in all, and in consequence from 100 to 200 meetings have been held in each constituency. The Union has pursued a consistent policy of opposing the Government nominee, while at the same time not directly supporting any of the other candidates. The results have been far greater than the Press would lead the public to suppose. In many cases the platforms of the candidates themselves have been deserted and the people have attended in crowds to hear the women speakers. The actual figures have a tale to tell which is significant. In every one of the seven by-elections the Liberal poll has been considerably reduced, the figures being as follows:—Hexham 231, Stepney 503, Rutland 202, Jarrow 4,573 (four-cornered), Colne Valley 1,204 (three-cornered), N.W. Staffs 271, Bury St. Edmunds 306—a total of over 7,000. It has been especially noteworthy that this achievement has sometimes told in favour of the Conservative, sometimes in favour of the Labour candidate, and it is not, therefore, attributable to any general change of national attitude on other political questions.

At Colne Valley the successful candidate openly declared that he owed his election to the assistance of the women's work; at Bury St. Edmunds the crowd refused to allow Mr. Guinness to claim the victory for Tariff Reform, crying out that it was the "suffragettes"; and at the N.W. Staffs election, the special correspondent of the *Morning Post*, writing on August 1st, stated that as an electioneering body the Women's Social and Political Union was unsurpassed. "Woman against man," he wrote, "they are better speakers, more logical, better informed, better phrased, with a surer instinct for the telling argument," and again, "the suffragettes are the politicians of the election."

A glance at the cash statement will show that the whole of this work has only cost the Union £467, or less than one-half of the average cost incurred by a candidate in contesting a single election.

3,000 Meetings in Six Months.—The total number of meetings arranged by the National Executive during the six months has been over 1,200, in different parts of the country. The Scottish Council has organised several score of others. And, in addition, the local branches all over the country are responsible for another two thousand local meetings, making a total of well over 3,000 in all. Many of these meetings have been attended by several thousand people, notably the great meetings in the St. James' Theatre, Manchester, that in the Town Hall, Birmingham, that in Exeter Hall, London, the enormous meetings every Sunday afternoon in Hyde Park, and many others. It is safe to say that over a million people have been reached in all.

It should be noted that the expenditure on advertisements of these meetings has been exceedingly small and that in the case of the largest demonstrations, the sale of tickets has more than covered all the expenses connected with the meeting.

Stall at Earl's Court.—A novel form of propaganda was commenced in May by the opening of a stall in the Earl's Court Exhibition for the sale of literature and for discussion of knotty points with visitors. This has proved a very marked success. Each week several thousand people have been brought into touch with the movement and several hundred pamphlets have been sold. The net expenditure incurred by the Union on this account has been very small, the figures in the cash statement not representing the true state of affairs, for while the expenditure includes the whole of the rent, etc., up to the 19th October, the receipts are only those which were taken up to the 31st August.

At Homes.—An important feature in London has been the weekly "At Home" every Monday afternoon at the offices, 4, Clement's Inn, where there has been an attendance of over 100 people every week. These "At Homes" have been the means of bringing a great number of additional women into the movement as well as of keeping friends in touch with what is going on. So great has been the success of this work that not only will it be continued through the winter, but it has been decided to give in addition an evening "At Home" on Thursdays from 8 to 10 p.m. All friends and visitors who wish to know more of the movement are invited to be present.

Literature.—In the beginning of 1907 it was determined to place the literature in a special department of its own, and the result has been very remarkable. Separate accounts are published for this department for the period January 1st to June 30th, 1907, and an exceedingly flourishing state of affairs is disclosed. Whereas during 1906 the total sale of literature amounted to some £60 in all, during the six months to June 30th, 1907, the sale has been close upon £400, representing an output of over 70,000 pamphlets, etc., and 5,000 books, in addition to some 150,000 leaflets; and on the financial side, the department, while meeting all expenditure and making all due allowances, is able to show a net profit of £30. This fact alone is enough to prove the rapid strides which the woman's movement is making towards recognition all over the country.

The Press.—Though the leading newspapers have not devoted a great deal of space to the Women's Social and Political Union during the latter part of the six months under review, owing to the absence of sensational events, the local newspapers up and down the country have given great prominence to the speeches delivered by all the principal women in the movement.

A new weekly paper, "Women's Franchise," was also started in July, 1907, which gave two or three pages each week to the doings of the Union. Now, however, commencing with October, a paper has been started, edited by Mr. and Mrs. Pethick Lawrence, which may be regarded as the organ of the Women's Social and Political Union. "Votes for Women," as the new journal is called, is published monthly, price 3d., and has already obtained considerable favour with the general public. In addition, a "Votes for Women" Supplement, price ½d., is issued each week on Thursday, which contains news of the Women's Social and Political Union movement all over the country, and is specially intended to keep those inside the Union informed of the progress that is being made.

The Outlook for the Future.—The present Government claim that in order to make the will of the people prevail, the veto of the House of Lords must be curtailed. The Women's

Social and Political Union will devote the coming months to proving that a more important way of giving effect to that principle is to extend the Parliamentary Franchise to women, so that the House of Commons may be made truly representative of the people. Between the House of Commons and the House of Lords there is nothing to choose from the woman's point of view. Both are equally unrepresentative. The only constitutional question to women is their own right to representation, and the Women's Social and Political Union will continue to oppose, by every means in their power, the Government which refuses to acknowledge this constitutional claim.

The autumn campaign which has already begun bids fair to be far larger than anything which has ever been attempted before. Some 300 meetings up and down the country will be addressed by the leaders of the movement before the close of the year. Of these the most important will be the following:—Leeds, October 29th; Keighley, October 30th; Brighouse, November 4th; Bristol, Victoria Rooms, November 8th; London, Queen's Hall, November 11th; Leicester, Free Trade Hall, November 14th; Birmingham Town Hall, November 20th; and Preston, November 23rd.

How all Women can help.—The movement has made such strides in the past that we are confident that it only needs a determined stand on the part of the women who are fighting for their emancipation to-day for the vote to be won during the coming session of Parliament. We therefore call upon all women to take their stand with us in this great fight. There are many ways in which they can help us. We will name two in particular.

In the first place we ask them to enter our ranks as *members* of the National W.S.P.U. To do this they will be asked to sign the following pledge:—

I endorse the objects and methods of the Women's Social and Political Union, and I hereby undertake not to support the candidate of any political party at Parliamentary elections until women have obtained the Parliamentary vote.

There is no definite members' fee, but those who wish to be kept constantly in touch with the central organisation by correspondence are requested to give is. a year to cover postage.

In the second place, as members, or if not as members, then as sympathisers and friends of the movement, we appeal for their help—for their service, their time, their money. We are fighting this battle to win. The honour, the welfare of the womanhood of this country is at stake. We women mean serious business. The great national campaign which is being organised this winter necessitates a great National Fund.

Appeal to Men and Women alike.—We appeal to men and women to come forward at once with a promise to give at least £1 a year till the day when the victory is won, and we promise to do our part to bring that day near. We ask them to come forward one by one till they number 10,000 persons. We appeal to those who can afford larger sums to give them to this work so that we may widen the scope of our plans for converting the country and bringing pressure to bear on the Government.

A great cause has emerged into the political life of to-day, a great constitutional principle is at stake, and the issues of it affect directly or indirectly all the women in the world. The victory can only be won if all who desire to see the triumph of the right are ready to play their part in the field and to bear their share of the financial burden.

### HOW WOMEN CAN HELP.

- By Becoming Members. Women are invited to join the National Women's Social and Political Union, and so place themselves in line with the many thousand other women who are working for the political recognition of the sex. The address and officers of the National W.S.P.U. and the condition qualifying for membership will be found set out upon page ii. of the cover. In addition to joining the N.W.S.P.U., women living in places where there are local Unions will be welcomed by the local Secretary as members of the local Union, and can so take part in local work.
- By Subscribing to the Funds. The National Women's Social and Political Union has already spent over £5,000 in fighting the battle of women for the vote. It has used this money to hold several thousand meetings up and down the country, to take a prominent part in twelve by-elections, and to leave no stone unturned to bring the question before every section of the community. Altogether £20,000 is being raised to carry on the campaign, and contributions towards this sum are urgently needed.
- By Circulating Literature. The National W.S.P.U. has a flourishing literature department, particulars of which will be found on the next page. Much valuable work can be done by buying our books, pamphlets, or leaflets, studying them and passing them on to other women.
- By Getting Up Meetings. Women are requested to get up drawing-room meetings and public meetings at which the need for the vote can be discussed. The National Women's Social and Political Union will be glad to send speakers to meetings when requested.
- By Giving Time and Services. Women are wanted for speaking and lecturing, for secretarial work in the office, for canvassing, for organizing meetings at by-elections and elsewhere, and for many other things. The Hon. Sec. of the National Women's Social and Political Union will be glad to know of any women able and willing to help in any of these ways.
- By Missionary Work. Women can use their influence with the men and women of their acquaintance, asking them to write to their Member of Parliament on this question. They can obtain from the W.S.P.U. offices forms for signature of women in favour of the franchise and ask their friends to fill them up. They can induce other women to become members, to subscribe, and help in various ways.
- By Getting into Closer Touch with the Movement. There may be women who are not prepared to do any of these things and yet would like to know more of what is being done. They are invited to get into correspondence with the Hon. Secretary, to come to some of the Women's Social and Political Meetings, in particular to come to one of the "At Homes," held every Monday from 4 to 6, and every Thursday, from 8 to 10, at 4, Clement's Inn, where they will have the opportunity of meeting the leaders of the movement and learning more about it.



#### CONSTITUTION.

#### OBJECTS.

To secure for Women the Parliamentary Vote as it is or may be granted to men; to use the power thus obtained to establish equality of rights and opportunities between the sexes, and to promote the social and industrial well-being of the community.

#### METHODS.

The objects of the Union shall be promoted by-

- Action entirely independent of all political parties.
- 2. Opposition to whatever Government is in power until such time as the franchise is granted.
- 3. Participation in Parliamentary Elections in opposition to the Government candidate and independently of all other candidates.
- 4. Vigorous agitation upon lines justified by the position of outlawry
- to which women are at present condemned.

  5. The organizing of women all over the country to enable them to give adequate expression to their desire for political freedom.
- 6. Education of public opinion by all the usual methods, such as public meetings, demonstrations, debates, distribution of literature, newspaper correspondence and deputations to public repre-

#### MEMBERSHIP.

Women of all shades of political opinion who approve the objects and methods of the Union, and who are prepared to act independently of party, are eligible for membership. It must be clearly understood that no member of the Union shall support the candidate of any political party in Parliamentary elections until women have obtained the Parliamentary Vote. There is an entrance fee of 1s. No definite subscription is fixed, as it is known that all members will give to the full extent of their ability to further the campaign funds of the Union.

### Report.

Every year brings new success, new strength, new fortune, to the Women's Social and Political Union. Since the hour of its formation, the Union has gone forward in a veritable march of triumph.

The reason of the Union's success is threefold. Firstly, it is independent of all the political parties, and cannot, therefore, be exploited in the interests of self-seeking male politicians; secondly, it is anti-Government in its policy, and therefore the pressure which it can exert is rightly directed instead of being wasted; thirdly, the Union is militant, thus employing the only political weapon available to the voteless, and appealing also to the innate dignity and self-respect of the highest types of women, who object to making themselves mere supplicants for that which is their right.

Developments of Policy.— The year ending February 28th, 1913, of which this Seventh Annual Report is the chronicle, has been marked by very important developments. Thus the political independence of the W.S.P.U. has been emphasised and pressed to its logical conclusion by the decision to oppose, not official Liberalism only, but the Coalition as a whole, including the official Labour Party. Militancy also has been extended in scope and increased in vigour, and from being merely symbolic, as in the old days, is now directed against property, the public as well as the Government feeling its effects, and human life alone being immune from attack.

These developments of policy, and the shameless treachery of the Government, which has taught the public that militancy is necessary, and therefore right, have made the W.S.P.U. more powerful and important than ever, and in this Seventh Annual Report we may congratulate ourselves upon having achieved a new and unprecedented success.

Before the history of the past year is told, there are some special departments of the Union's work that demand special reference.

Finance.—Great Increase in Subscriptions.—Money speaks! The fact that the total receipts for the year just ended amount to about £3,000 more than the total receipts for the previous year is eloquent of the great and growing vitality and popularity of the Union. Considering that the subscription list for the previous year included the proceeds of the big Fair and Fête at the Portman Rooms, which realised nearly £3,000, whereas in the year just ended, no fête on such a scale has been attempted, the increase in ordinary contributions to the campaign fund may be reckoned as £5,000. The auditors' account will be found on pages 20-23, and the subscription list on pages 24-58. The subscriptions amounted to the sum of £23,155 15s. 11d., and the total income to £28,502 19s. 6d. Outgoings and liabilities amounted to £25,731 is. iod., the various items of expenditure being shown in the cash statement on pages 20-21.

Special reference must be made to the finances of those local centres which raise and spend large sums independently of the national income and expenditure. No mention is made of these finances in the National accounts, but from the Annual Reports of such centres we find that many have a turnover of close on £1,000. It will thus be realised what an enormous sum of money is raised and spent by the W.S.P.U., together with its Local Unions. In London alone every district has its centre, and one is to be found in most of the provincial towns in the Kingdom.

Among the money-making ventures of the year, the Christmas Sale held at Lincoln's Inn House calls for honourable mention. The Hon. Treasurer tenders her thanks to the subscribers who have with so magnificent a generosity given to the campaign fund. Incalculable devotion and self-sacrifice are represented by this great sum of money offered so openhandedly by women, the poorer half of the community, for the good of the movement. Unbounded thanks are also given to the army of voluntary workers whose free gift of personal service has, by reducing expenditure, enriched the Union.

New Headquarters.—In October last the head office of the W.S.P.U., formerly at 4, Clement's Inn, was removed to Lincoln's Inn House, Kingsway, W.C. The new premises are

in every way an improvement on the old, endeared by long association as these were to every member. At Lincoln's Inn House the W.S.P.U. has a building devoted entirely to its use. Every department is well housed. A fine, general office gives the clerical staff more light, air, and space than they formerly had. The beautiful pillared entrance hall is available for receptions, welcomes to prisoners, meetings, sales, and other functions. The magnificent public situation in a leading thoroughfare, which is of daily-increasing importance, is very valuable to an organisation such as the W.S.P.U. Lincoln's Inn House is indeed a Woman Suffrage monument of which all may be proud—a material proof of the greatness of the Union which it shelters. The W.S.P.U. has certainly the finest and most imposing political offices in London.

"The Suffragette"—Since October last, owing to circumstances mentioned below, the Suffragette has been the official organ of the W.S.P.U. It is edited by Miss Christabel Pankhurst. The paper is a weekly one, and is obtainable on Thursdays at all newsagents and bookstalls. Though founded only four months ago, the Suffragette is already firmly established, and in the matter of circulation and of advertisements has made a most gratifying progress. Its success is in very large measure due to the efforts of W.S.P.U. members, who, by street-selling, by canvassing newsagents, and by bringing the paper to the notice of their friends, have done much to build up its circulation.

The Press boycott, as it existed in the old days, has been swept away by militancy, but the whole facts of the case, including the reasons for militancy, are rarely given in ordinary newspapers, and the importance of getting a big circulation for the *Suffragette* among the general public is very great indeed.

No reference to the *Suffragette* would be complete without a word of warm appreciation of the generous contributions given to its pages by men and women of letters.

The Woman's Press.—This branch of the W.S.P.U. publishes the *Suffragette*, and does a large wholesale and retail trade in literature dealing with the woman's movement, also

tea, chocolate, and other commodities. The department is now situated at Lincoln's Inn House, and there is every indication of its becoming a considerable source of revenue for the Union.

Educational Campaign.—The vigour and extent of the militant campaign is realised by everybody, but partly because the newspapers are not interested in it, and therefore do not report it, the educational side of the Union's work is sometimes ignored. This educational work is, however, done on an enormous scale, and no other political organisation in the country holds so many great meetings as does the W.S.P.U. The number of meetings, large and small, indoor and outdoor, held by the W.S.P.U. in the past year is upwards of 25,000 (twenty-five thousand). In the summer a vast meeting was held in Hyde Park, which was remarkable not only for the numbers who attended it, but for the beauty of the spectacle it presented. The largest hall in the country, the Albert Hall, London, has been filled to overflowing on three occasions during the year. Large meetings have been held in the following, among other, Halls:

Every Monday afternoon, in the London Pavilion, Piccadilly Circus, a meeting is held at 3 p.m., the speakers including Mrs. Pankhurst, Miss Annie Kenney, and Mrs. Drummond, and men and women of eminence in every walk of life. Every Thursday evening at 8 o'clock, meetings are held in the Essex Hall, Essex Street, Strand.

Part of the educational work of the Union consists in the issue of leaflets explaining why women want the Vote, and why militant methods are adopted. A list of these leaflets is obtainable at Lincoln's Inn House. The latest issued include the two entitled "Broken Windows" and "Burnt Letters."

Provincial Organisation.—Much of the influence of the W.S.P.U. is due to the magnificent and devoted work done by the organisers at work in various parts of the country. No movement can succeed which has not a firm hold both on London and on the country as a whole. During the coming year, and in view of a possible General Election, the provincial organisation will be further extended and consolidated. Applications from those who are desirous of seeing the W.S.P.U. at work in their district should be sent to the Hon. Secretary, Lincoln's Inn House. Reports of the work in various centres and announcements of meetings and other events appear every week in the Suffragette.

Local W.S.P.U.'S —In all parts of London and in many provincial centres, there exist local Unions which, while working in close and harmonious relation with the National headquarters, are independent in the sense that they elect their own committee, and administer their own funds. By their untiring work in their own particular district, and by their support, so loyally accorded to headquarters, the local Unions add incalculably to the strength of the movement as a whole. They elect their own officers, raise and administer their own funds, and arrange their own schemes of organisation and propaganda. The local Unions

are to be congratulated upon the fine work they have done for the movement during the past twelve months. The National Treasurer records her thanks for the generous spirit in which local Unions have this year handed the whole proceeds of their self-denial effort to the National funds.

By-Elections.—The anti-Government election policy has on several occasions during the year been put into force. Labour Candidates no longer enjoy the indulgence formerly accorded to them by the W.S.P.U. The Labour Party is responsible for keeping the Government in office, and therefore its nominees deserve attack just as much as do the nominees of the Liberal Party. The W.S.P.U. has in the past twelve months taken part in the following by-elections in opposition to Coalition nominees:—

In three of these, Crewe, North-West Manchester, and Manchester South the Government was defeated.

The Bow and Bromley election will for ever have a glorious place in Suffrage annals. Mr. Lansbury, who had already done magnificent service in the country, and (notably by his attack upon the Prime Minister) in the House of Commons, decided to resign his seat, and to seek re-election, in order to free himself from the official Labour policy of supporting the Government at the expense of women's interests. Owing to the coldness, not to say hostility, of the official Labour Party, and owing to the opposition of Liberal voters, Mr. Lansbury was not elected, but his self-sacrificing action and his brave fight have done incalculable service to the cause.

Arrests; Imprisonments; Forcible Feeding.—During the year there have been 367 arrests of Suffragists, and 311 imprisonments. The prisoners who resorted to the hunger strike numbered 131, and of these, 89 were fed by force until they had been reduced to a dangerous state of ill-health. A magnificent protest against forcible feeding and other cruelty and insult on the part of the Government was made by Mr. George Lansbury in the House of Commons on June 25th.

Standing face to face with the Prime Minister, Mr. Lansbury denounced him and his Government as torturers of women. The House of Commons debated the question of forcible feeding on June 28th. Strong condemnation of the practice came from the more enlightened men on all sides of the House. Mr. McKenna pleaded for support for the Government in their efforts to administer the law "under circumstances of unparalleled difficulty." The danger and cruelty of forcible feeding are now admitted by friends and foes alike. It is no longer seriously urged, even by the Government, that forcible feeding of Suffragist prisoners is medical treatment. In fact, it is generally recognised as torture, and has been thus described by a Recorder, Sir Forrest Fulton. The report upon forcible feeding and its terrible results, drawn up by three medical practitioners of the eminence of Sir Victor Horsley, Mr. Mansell Moullin, and Dr. Agnes Savill, was the final condemnation of this method of torture. To the unending shame of the Government, Miss Billinghurst, a frail, crippled woman, has been fed by force, and so have some others, since that report appeared, but this action is not defended either by their followers or the Press, and constant search is made for some alternative method of "dealing with" the Suffragettes. To clear up a prevailing doubt, it may here be explained that the hunger strike is not the official policy of the Union, but is a matter for individual decision. The Union applauds both the courage of the hunger striker and the courage of the woman who endures the long sentences meted out by the magistrates and judges.

Militancy.—The Government's refusal to yield to militancy in its milder forms has compelled recourse to more vigorous action. The parallel between Pharoah, visited by plagues of ever-increasing severity, and the Liberal Government, visited by militancy more and more drastic, is complete! The Manhood Suffrage Bill was a challenge to greater militancy. The attempt to break up the W.S.P.U. by the prosecution for conspiracy was yet another challenge, responded to by Mrs. Leigh and Miss Evans, Mrs. Baines, Miss Helen Craggs, and others, in the summer of 1912. The Government's latest betrayal has provoked the present fierce revolutionary action.

The men militants have again this year shown a fine spirit of comradeship and a great courage. Largely through their aid was it possible to silence Mr. John Redmond. Mr. McKenna at

the Queen's Hall, and Mr. Lloyd George at Carnarvon, and at the Kennington "Joy Day" meeting, have met with stern punishment by militant men. Other similar protests by these brave men are too many to chronicle here, but all are deeply appreciated by the women in whose cause they are made.

There have been impressive protests by men in the

Strangers' Gallery of the House of Commons.

W.S.P.U. Campaign in Canada.—The W.S.P.U. is Imperial in its ideals for women, and seeks to be Imperial in its scope. Australia and New Zealand, where women are voters already, have no need of any help in the matter of Woman Suffrage. In Canada, the urgency of such need is very great. Accordingly, the Union has sent to Canada a representative and missionary in the person of Miss Barbara Wylie, who has held meetings in many parts of the Dominion. The Hon. Secretary of the W.S.P.U., Mrs. Tuke, is at present in South Africa, on a journey of health, it is true, but her visit will without doubt pave the way for further work to be done in the future by representatives of the W.S.P.U.

The Cause in Parliament. -It will be remembered that the Government were driven by fear of a Suffragist disturbance at the Coronation to promise that facilities for the Conciliation Bill for Woman Suffrage should be accorded in the ensuing Session of 1912. No sooner had the Coronation crisis been tided over than the Government in general, and Mr. Lloyd George in particular, sought to break up the unity between Suffragist M.P.'s in favour of the Coalition Bill, and thus to make the promise of facilities nugatory. The scheme devised by Mr. Lloyd George, and adopted by the Government, was to torpedo the Conciliation Bill by means of a Manhood Suffrage Bill, to be introduced in 1912, and to be open to a private Member's Amendment for Woman Suffrage, which Amendment, the Government promised, if and when it was carried, to regard as an integral part of their Manhood Suffrage Bill. W.S.P.U. repudiated the pledge as fraudulent, and in consequence of the torpedoing of the Conciliation Bill and the offer of this fraudulent pledge, decided to revert to militancy. It was in accordance with this decision that the window-breaking protest of March, 1912, was made. The Conciliation Bill was, as predicted by the W.S.P.U., defeated on March 28th, 1912, in consequence of the Manhood Suffrage torpedo and the intrigues of the Government, who persuaded the Irish and several other Coalition M.P.'s, to oppose, or to abstain from supporting, the Bill.

The Women's Amendments to the Manhood Suffrage Bill have also been torpedoed, in the manner described on another

page.

#### IMPORTANT EVENTS OF THE YEAR.

Broken Windows. — The history of the year ending February, 1913, may be said to begin with the great window-breaking campaign in March, 1912. A skilfully planned secret attack on Friday, March 1st, took the police and all London by surprise, for the protest had been expected to take place on the following Monday, March 4th. This expectation was not wholly disappointed, for on that day another great window-breaking protest was made. Not all the London shop-keepers had at that time realised the futility and unfairness of laying the blame for window-breaking upon the militants instead of upon the Government. Therefore there was clamour for drastic punishment. The 267 arrested window-breakers, who included the Hon. Secretaries of the Union, Mrs. Pankhurst and Mrs. Tuke, were sentenced to terms of imprisonment varying from 14 days to six months.

Government's Attempt to break the Union.—The matter did not rest there. The Government, after foreshadowing their intention in reply to questions in the House of Commons, decided to institute a prosecution for Conspiracy against Mrs. Pankhurst, Mr. and Mrs. Pethick Lawrence, Mrs. Tuke, and Miss Christabel Pankhurst. Mrs. Pankhurst and Mrs. Tuke were already in custody, and warrants were issued for the arrest of Mr. and Mrs. Pethick Lawrence and Miss Pankhurst. The two first-named were duly arrested, but Miss Pankhurst received warning of what was afoot, and made her escape to Paris, where, by international law (her offence being a political one) she was safe from arrest. Though she did not at first disclose her whereabouts, thereby causing considerable inconvenience to the enemy as represented by the police, she at once assumed control of the political affairs of the Union, and without one week's intermission wrote the leading article and the editorial notes for the official organ of the Union.

The Conspiracy Trial.—Meanwhile, the Conspiracy trial proceeded. The Government had evidently expected, as the result of their raid upon the W.S.P.U. offices, to discover documents of a most incriminating character, but in this they were disappointed. Nevertheless, sufficient evidence was forthcoming to enable the magistrate to send the case for trial at the Old Bailey. Mrs. Tuke was, owing to her serious condition of health, discharged at the end of the magisterial enquiry. At the Old Bailey, Mrs. Pethick Lawrence was defended by Mr. Tim Healy, K.C., M.P., and the other two prisoners conducted their own defence. The proceedings were a great vindication of women's right to vote and of militancy. All the efforts of Sir Rufus Isaacs, who appeared for the prosecution, failed to throw even a shadow of discredit upon the accused. Very brilliant speeches were made by all three, and by Mr. Healy. The jury's verdict amounted, morally speaking, to an acquittal, for while finding the prisoners guilty, the jury testified to the purity of their motives, and asked for the utmost leniency and clemency of the Court.

The sentences passed was that of nine months' imprisonment in the second division. Then followed a successful agitation for the prisoners' transference to the first division. Afterwards came their adoption of a sympathetic hunger strike and the release, first of Mrs. Pankhurst, and then, after a brief period of forcible feeding, of Mr. and Mrs. Pethick Lawrence. The many other Suffragists in Holloway at that time displayed a cheerfulness in enduring the trials of prison life, and a courage in withstanding forcible feeding, that were beyond all praise.

The Conspiracy trial, and its sequel, did not, as the Government hoped, interrupt the work of the Union. Owing to their failure to capture all whom they had in view, and thanks to the wonderful resource, courage, and initiative of the headquarters staff and the organisers, the Union weathered the storm with perfect success.

Guerilla Warfare.—At that time began the policy of guerilla warfare, since extended and perfected. Ministers received various warnings of worse things to come. A mysterious compound was discovered in the Home Office. The remains of an extinguished fire were seen on the doorstep of a Ministerial residence in the country.

Then came the Dublin protest by Mrs. Leigh, Miss Evans and Mrs. Baines. This protest has been much misrepresented, and its violence greatly exaggerated, but the truth concerning it is pretty well known by this time, and so it suffices to say that no real danger to human life was involved. It was, indeed, more a warning than a reality. The charge of hatchet-throwing could not be proved, and Mrs. Leigh was acquitted in respect of that. On the charge of attempting to burn the Theatre Royal, she and Miss Evans were convicted, and sentenced to five years' penal servitude. This sentence did not break their courage. They adopted the hunger strike, and literally at the risk of their lives they fought their way back to liberty, and six weeks later were released.

In July, Miss Helen Craggs was arrested and charged with attempting to set fire to Nuneham House, the residence of Mr. Lewis Harcourt, the Anti-Suffragist Cabinet Minister. Mr. Harcourt has since maliciously and untruthfully described this act as "an attempt to burn the children's wing of my home." On October 19th, Miss Craggs was sentenced to nine months' hard labour. She adopted the hunger strike, and after some days of forcible feeding, was released on October 30th, owing to the dangerous condition of health which resulted.

In addition to militancy, the Union continued its educational work with unabated vigour, and held two Albert Hall meetings, at which sums amounting to £16,000 were raised.

Early in September it was announced that Miss Christabel Pankhurst was established in Paris, from which place she was acting as political editor, and conducting other work for the Union.

The Separation.—On the eve of the great Albert Hall meeting of October 17th it was announced that Mr. and Mrs. Pethick Lawrence, whose fine work for the Union in the past will always be held in remembrance, had parted company with the Union in consequence of a divergence of views between themselves and Mrs. and Miss Pankhurst. Votes for Women, until then the official organ of the W.S.P.U., has reverted to the sole control and ownership of Mr. and Mrs. Pethick Lawrence, and is now conducted by them as in independent Suffragist review and newspaper. The Suffragette came into existence as the official W.S.P.U. organ, its first issue appearing on October 18th. Mrs. Pankhurst assumed the office of Hon. Treasurer, and Mrs. Tuke that of Hon. Secretary. At the

Albert Hall meeting of October 17th, Mrs. Pankhurst announced the separation, and further announced vigorous militancy, which would stop short only at attacks upon human life. At the same time war was declared against the official Labour Party in consequence of its refusal to use its 40 votes in the House of Commons in such manner as would drive the Government to choose between defeat and concession of the women's claim to vote.

Working Women's Deputation.—Militancy on these lines continued until the much-trumpeted "opportunity" for women was at hand. It was decided that militancy should cease until after the Women's Amendments to the Manhood Suffrage Bill had been discussed and voted upon. The non-militant Suffragists, the Government, and the House of Commons would thus be obliged to take the whole responsibility for the fate of the Amendments, and would be precluded from blaming the militants for their defeat.

On January 23rd, a deputation of working women, organised by the W.S.P.U., and led by General Flora Drummond, interviewed Mr. Lloyd George and Sir Edward Grey. The speeches of Mrs. Drummond, Miss Annie Kenney, and the other spokeswomen, would have won the Vote outright if reason and argument would avail to do it, but they fell on deaf ears. The two Ministers made replies which in a few short hours were falsified by the event. Mr. Lloyd George's promise to accord another public interview to the working women after the fate of the Women's Amendments should be settled, has not yet been fulfilled.

Women's Amendments Torpedoed.—On the eve of the discussion of the Women's Amendments, the Speaker hinted that the addition of Woman Suffrage to the Franchise Bill would have the effect of making it a new Bill, and would necessitate its withdrawal and re-introduction. As a consequence of the Speaker's hint, the vote upon the Women's Amendments would be even less "free" than would otherwise have been the case. The opportunity was swept a vay. On the following Monday, the Prime Minister announced that the Franchise Bill would be withdrawn. Thus disappeared the famous "opportunity" which the W.S.P.U. had from the first known to be worthless, partly because of its inherently fraudulent character, and partly because the dishonest politicians who offered it cannot be relied upon to do anything but cheat and betray.

Government's New "Promise."—In lieu of the opportunity destroyed by the Government, in collusion with the Speaker, the Prime Minister offers another even more fraudulent, since it makes no provision whatever for any Government support for Woman Suffrage. That is to say, the Government have broken a worthless promise, and given in exchange for it another promise still more worthless.

Thus have the prophecies of the W.S.P.U. been fulfilled, and thus has been vindicated its policy of demanding a Government measure, of opposing the Government, and of militancy.

It is now admitted by all in the Suffrage movement that no unofficial measure of Woman Suffrage can be carried, and that the Government must be held directly and fully responsible for giving or withholding the enfranchisement of women.

War Renewed.—The Government's betrayal of women was followed by an announcement by Mrs. Pankhurst that militancy would be resumed, and would be more drastic than ever. Guerilla tactics would be pursued; the militants would henceforth be concerned to produce the maximum of effect while retaining their liberty as long as possible.

Since this declaration, militancy on a scale hitherto undreamt of has raged. Letter-box protests have continued more vigorously than before; golf greens have been destroyed; telegraph and telephone wires have been severed; a house that was in preparation for Mr. Lloyd George has been wrecked. Buildings in Regent's Park and Kew Gardens have been burnt to the ground.

Mrs. Pankhurst's Arrest.—On February 24th, Mrs. Pankhurst was arrested and charged with inciting to the destruction of the Lloyd George villa. She was committed by the Epsom magistrates for trial at the Guildford Summer Assizes. As the magistrates refused to allow bail except on the condition that she would undertake to refrain from all incitement to law breaking, Mrs. Pankhurst, who refused to give such undertaking for so long a period, was remanded in custody. She protested against this long delay in bringing her to justice, and announced her intention of adopting the hunger strike. Within twenty-four hours, the authorities had

reconsidered the matter, and arranged that the trial should take place at the Central Criminal Court on Tuesday, April 1st. Having gained her point, Mrs. Pankhurst gave the required undertaking, and was released from prison.

#### POSTCRIPT.

Recent Militancy.—Since February 28th, the last day of the financial year, militancy has raged more fiercely than ever. In connection with the more serious of the attacks upon property, no arrests have been made. Never before has the spirit of rebellion been so strong in women's hearts. Every day gives them fuller understanding of the importance of the Vote, and knowing that human life and happiness are at stake, the sacrifice of property as the price of women's freedom seems to them a a moral duty. That private citizens should be affected is inevitable, for this is war, and in all wars it is the private citizen who suffers the most. It is, in fact, by means of pressure upon the private citizen that an opposing force finally achieves its victory. Moreover, in this women's war for the Vote, the private citizen cannot reasonably complain of suffering the pains and penalties of warfare, because there is nobody who can plead innocence and irresponsibility where the question of Votes for women is concerned.

Torture in Prison. — The question of forcible feeding has, since the close of the year, come to a head. The cruelty and danger of this operation are now universally admitted. After a single application of forcible feeding one prisoner, Miss Lenton, was, as the Home Secretary has admitted, in imminent danger of death, and had suddenly to be released. Owing to the lurid light thus thrown upon the horrors of forcible feeding, the whole matter has been discussed in the House of Commons. As M.P.s' speeches showed, the House recognises that forcible feeding is literally torture. Even the Home Secretary made no denial of this, but assured the House that his experience has shown him that torture will fail to break the indomitable spirit of the militants. Soon after this debate, Miss Sylvia Pankhurst was released, and has given a graphic account of the dreadful suffering which forcible feeding involves. Those still under torture include Miss Olive Wharry, whose sentence is one of 18 months' imprisonment.

A New Form of Persecution.—The repression of militancy is exercising the minds of the Government, and instead of giving women the Vote, which is the only way available, they have devised a new method of persecution in the shape of the Cat and Mouse Bill. This Bill will be an utter failure, but it is significant that the existing laws which have served to suppress law-breaking amongst men have failed to reduce women to submission.

Three Urgent Matters.—There are three matters of urgent, practical importance to which the attention of all W.S.P.U. members and friends is asked. These are as follow:

I. The Suffragette Summer Festival and Sale of Work, to be held in the Empress Rooms, High Street, Kensington, W., from June 3rd to the 13th.

Full particulars of arrangements will be given later on, but members are asked to begin working for this without delay, in order that success may be assured.

2. The Suffragette, the W.S.P.U. official organ. It is impossible to overstate the advantage of having an enormous circulation for *The Suffragette*. Owing to the Press boycott, this paper is an indispensable means of communication between the Union and the public.

Militant action excites the curiosity of the public. The Suffragette comes in to supply the information and argument which are needed to satisfy that curiosity. Not only does The Suffragette convert and enlist new supporters, but it is a link which holds together all the Union's members. All are urged, day by day, and week by week, to build up an ever-increasing circulation by getting new subscribers, by selling the paper, and by having posters shown at newsagents and elsewhere. A week has been set apart for the purpose of a very special circulation effort. Suffragette Week will extend from Thursday, April 24th, to May 3rd.

3. Albert Hall Meeting, Thursday, April 10th. All members whose circumstances allow of it will be present at this great gathering of the Union's forces in order to rejoice in the triumphs of the past year, to express their admiration and reverence for the women in prison, to renew their vows of service to the women's cause, and to repeat their message of defiance to the Government. A great collection will be raised to finance

the campaign of the coming year, and to prove to the Government and to the world that the Union is stronger than it has ever been. With a view to raising the biggest collection in the history of the W.S.P.U., everyone into whose hands a copy of this report may come is asked to send money or a promise of money to be announced as part of the great Albert Hall collection on the 10th of April. Those who have subscribed in the past are urged to send, at this crisis, a largely increased contribution.

Some women have, by withstanding torture in prison, convinced the Government that the militant spirit is unbreakable. It is for others to show by raising a great sum of money at the Albert Hall that the movement cannot be broken even on its material side.
