Open to all persons, age 16 and over, of either sex and any nationality.

THE CAFETERIA, on the American "help yourself" system, is open on weekdays, excluding Saturdays, between the hours of 11 a.m. and 6 p.m. for lunches and teas. Club supper is served on Thursdays at 7 p.m. (2/-). Places must be ordered before 2 p.m.

THE READING AND SMOKING ROOM, with library of books on international subjects and foreign and other newspapers, is open weekdays, excluding Saturdays, between the hours of 11 a.m. and 6 p.m., Saturdays 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

THE GARDEN.—A quiet spot where meals can be taken out of doors.

DISCUSSIONS are held on Thursday evenings at 8 on the international topics of the day. Other lectures, concerts, and entertainments are arranged from time to time. These are frequently held in the garden on warm evenings.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.— Full membership, 7/6 per annum; membership of cafeteria only, 2/6 per annum. Application should be made to the Secretary and will be considered by the House Committee.

Large rooms which seat up to forty and eighty respectively, with use of garden if desired, can be hired for receptions and meetings.

Special meals can be served for large or small parties to order.
