### C. W. S. A.

The Cambridge Women's Suffrage Association belongs to the National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies. This Union is formed of about 561 Societies and Branches scattered over the Kingdom, with a membership of upwards of 52,000, and, in addition, 40,000 enrolled "Friends."

The various Societies are knit together, organized, and directed by an Executive Committee which has a permanent Office in London—Parliament Chambers, 14, Great Smith Street. The Executive is elected annually by a Council of Delegates from the Societies constituting the Union. The Council meets twice a year; in London in February, and once in some large provincial town, according to invitation, its business being to receive reports of the work done in the various localities, to control the finance, to discuss ways and means of furthering the cause, and to pass resolutions directing the movement, and determining the details of policy.

For the furtherance of co-operative work among the Societies, Federations have been formed of those occupying given areas. Of these there are now nineteen. Our Association belongs to the Eastern Counties Federation. Provincial Councils of these Federations are held twice yearly in the intervals between the meetings of the General Council, each Federation being represented by one of its Officers, and two elected members, in addition to members of the N.U. Executive resident within the area.

The National Union is a strictly non-party organisation: and for the promotion of its object, the Parliamentary Enfranchisement of Women, it relies upon constitutional methods, upon free public discussion, and upon the spread of education. It appeals to all who are in favour of its policy, and all willing to assist it financially, to send contributions to the Hon. Treasurer at the Office above-named.

The work of our Association consists chiefly in the holding of meetings for the advocacy of Women's Suffrage in Cambridge and the neighbouring towns and villages, and in disseminating by all possible means sound information in regard to the movement.

Anyone who wishes to join the Association can do so by sending his or her name, with a subscription, to the Hon. Treasurer, Mrs. Rootham, 4, Huntingdon Road; or to the Hon. Secretary, Miss G. M. Johnson, 37, Eltisley Avenue.

Members of the Association who wish to send in Resolutions to be brought before Council Meetings of the National Union, are reminded that these Resolutions should reach the Secretary of the C.W.S.A. for consideration by the Committee, at least six weeks before the date of the Council as published in the Common Cause, as the Headquarters Office requires five weeks' notice of such Resolutions.

### **Report of the Executive Committee**

The circumstances under which the Association enters upon its fourth decade are such as to render unnecessary any apology for presenting the Report for 1915 in an abridged and concise form. The character of the year's work has been determined, to a great extent, by national and international exigencies during the present crisis.

The year opened with the usual Annual Council of the National Union in January, which was attended by six Delegates from our Association. Our own Annual Meeting followed on February 22nd. After the business of this meeting was concluded an address was given by Councillor Margaret Ashton, of Manchester, her subject being "The Cost of War."

In connection with the Educational Scheme of the National Union, two lectures were arranged for by the C.W.S.A. Committee early in the year. The first of these was given by Mrs. Henry Fawcett, who addressed a crowded meeting in the Downing Street Assembly Rooms on March 13th, her subject being "The Congress of Vienna." The second lecture was given by Mrs. Hamilton, of the Economist, on "Some Economic Effects of the War." This was given at the Women's Training College, the chair being taken by Miss Wood. A further educational effort was the distribution to our members of a useful leaflet entitled "The War and

Women's Suffrage." This was sent out with the Annual Report.

During the spring the National Union was invited to assist the Board of Trade in registering women for War Service. The Cambridge Society, and thirty-two others within the National Union, decided to adopt the Union's Census Forms for this purpose. Over five hundred of these Forms were issued to our members with the Forms of the Board of Trade; and though only seventy-five replies were returned, some important information was obtained for the National Union, the work of Registration being assisted at the same time.

In June, the Special Council of the National Union was held in Birmingham. Our Society was represented by six Delegates. We also had the honour of providing the Chairman, for Mrs. Rackham, as Chairman of the National Union Executive, presided over the assembly.

A successful meeting was held at Newnham College in July in aid of the Scottish Women's Hospitals in France and Serbia. Professor Sims Woodhead presided, and the address was given by Miss V. Thurstan. As a result, the sum of  $\pounds 48$  was handed over to the Scottish Women's Hospitals, a bed being endowed and named. A grant of two guineas was subsequently made by our Committee to the fund collected by the Eastern Counties Federation for the same worthy object.

In the autumn the Association's educational work was continued by a series of lectures and demonstrations on Economy in Cooking. The lecturer was Miss Morse, from the Office of the National Food Fund in London. This course was much appreciated. The Women's Co-operative Guild had the advantage of evening addresses from Miss Morse and the Home Nursing Class received a special invitation to the lecture on Invalid Cookery. Expenses were partly defrayed by collections taken at the lectures.

It is impossible to enumerate all the forms of patriotic work undertaken during the year by individual members of the Association, but mention must be made of the help given under the National Registration Act in August, and of Mrs. Rackham's appointment as one of H.M. Inspectors of Factories for the period of the War.

The Committee has met regularly during the year. Grants have again been made for the supply of wool to certain schools and to inmates of the Unions for "Comforts" for our soldiers. Grants of clothing have also been made.

The Press Secretary's work has been, as before, in the hands of Miss F. Johnson. Her report shews that the work of the Association has been kept well before the eyes of the public in the local press by means of notices and accounts of the various meetings as they have taken place. In this connection it has been made evident that some of the best work done locally for the public good during the year has been done by Suffragists. Miss F. Johnson's own valuable articles on domestic subjects may be included under this head.

Mrs. Tennant has continued her work among the "Friends of Suffrage," of whom there are some 560 in Cambridge. She has had the assistance of several members of our Association, but could well find work for more helpers. A new leaflet (No. 7) was circulated among the "Friends" in November, and the *Common Cause* has been regularly distributed among them. They received special invitations to the cookery lectures in the autumn.

Mrs. Hersch reports that the *Common Cause*, with its excellent accounts of Women's War Service, has had a ready sale in Cambridge during the year. Copies of this paper have been placed where they are likely to meet the public eye, in addition to those sold or given away. Several hundred copies of the special Hospital number were sold, thanks to the efforts of Mrs. Hersch, Miss Varley and others.

The year has brought with it the loss of several friends who could ill be spared.

We have to record with deep regret the loss of Prof. Howard Marsh, late Master of Downing, a valued Vice-President of our Association, and a staunch supporter of the Women's Suffrage cause in Cambridge.

Mrs. Magnússon, who was for many years a member of this Association, has recently passed away at Copenhagen at an advanced age. She was a convinced and enthusiastic supporter of the demand for women's enfranchisement; and it is a source of satisfaction to her friends to reflect that she had the pleasure of knowing that the parliamentary vote had been given to the women of Iceland, her native country, and to those of Denmark where she found a home towards the close of her life.

We have sustained a further loss in the death of Miss Parry, an active worker of our Society. She was with us at the Annual Meeting of 1914, and took part in its business.

The death of Mrs. Marseille made yet another gap in the ranks of our active helpers.

This Report must not conclude without an expression of our indebtedness to Mrs. James Ward, who has been obliged, since our last Annual Meeting, to resign her post as Hon. Secretary, owing to pressure of work connected with her great scheme of Belgian Soldiers' Comforts. We are fortunate in keeping Mrs. Ward still with us as a member of our Committee. To her zealous and devoted labours our Association owes much of its present vitality, and the regret felt by her colleagues at her retirement from the Secretaryship will be shared by every one of our members.

#### RULES.

1. The object of the Association shall be to obtain for women the right of voting for Members of Parliament on the same condition as it is, or may be, granted to men.

2. An Annual Subscription (the minimum being 3d.) shall constitute membership. Subscriptions shall be due on January 1st for the current year, and may be paid either annually or every five years in advance.

3. A General Meeting of the Association shall be held once a year, in the Lent Term, to receive the Report and Statement of Accounts, to appoint the Committee, and to transact any other business which may arise.

4. A General Meeting shall also, whenever possible, be summoned to consider the Agenda for Council Meetings of the National Union, and to elect Delegates.

5. The Committee shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting from among the members, and shall have power to add two to its number, and also to co-opt members of the Association to fill vacancies caused by the retirement of members of Committee during their year of office. The Committee shall consist of not more than twenty persons in all. The members elected at the Annual General Meeting shall not be more than eighteen in number, and each member of Committee in order to be duly elected must obtain the votes of at least ten members of the Association. Vice-Presidents shall be elected from time to time by the Committee. The Officers of the Association shall be elected by the members at the Annual Meeting. 6. Members of the Committee who between the date of their election or co-optation and the next Annual General Meeting have made less than half the possible number of attendances at Committee Meetings shall not, at such next Annual General Meeting, be eligible for re-election (or election) to the Committee. They may, however, be elected to the Committee at a subsequent Annual General Meeting; and the Committee may, at discretion, co-opt them.

7. That three be considered a quorum of the Committee, one of them in each case being the Secretary or the Assistant Secretary.

8. No alteration shall be made in these Rules except at the Yearly General Meeting. Any Member wishing to propose an alteration shall give notice in writing to the Secretary seven days previous to the General Meeting.

#### THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

The Annual General Meeting was held at 20, Green Street, on January 28th, 1916, at 8 p.m. The chair was taken by Mrs. Heitland.

The Minutes of the last General Meeting were read and confirmed.

The adoption of the Treasurer's Report was moved by Mrs. Bowes, seconded by Mrs. Vulliamy, and carried.

The Officers of the Association and the Committee for 1916 were declared duly elected, on the motion of Mrs. Murray, seconded by Mr. T. T. Anderson. No ballot was held, the number of vacancies being in excess of the number of nominees. Delegates to the Annual Council Meeting of the National Union were elected as follows, the mover being Mrs. Ramsey, and the seconder Miss Varley: Mrs. Bethune-Baker, Mrs. Heitland, Mrs. Hersch, Mrs. Tennant, and the Secretary.

The Committee's Report for 1915 was read and adopted : proposer, Miss Pertz; seconder, Miss Yates.

The chairman briefly surveyed the public work done by women during the year 1915, and referred more particularly to the important posts filled by Mrs. Rackham, Miss Sargant and Miss Durham.

Certain alterations were then made in the Rules of the Association: Mrs. Rootham proposed and Mrs. Bethune Baker seconded that the following words be added to Rule 6: "and the Committee may, at discretion, co-opt them." This was carried. A new Rule was proposed by Miss F. Johnson, to read as follows:

"That, whenever it is possible, a General Meeting of the Association shall be summoned to consider the Agenda for the Council Meetings of the National Union, and to elect Delegates."

This was seconded by Mrs. Ramsey, and carried,

Mrs. Dutt moved and Mr. Adams seconded that the Cambridge Association ask for urgency at the forthcoming Council, for the following Resolution : "This Council urges the Government not to accede to any demands now being made to lower the standard of education." This was carried unanimously.

It was then proposed by Miss Varley, seconded by Mrs. Stevenson, and carried "That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Education Committee of the Cambs. County Council."

Short Reports were read by the Press Secretary; by Mrs. Tennant on the work among "Friends of Suffrage"; by Mrs. Vulliamy on the work of the Eastern Counties Federation; and by Mrs. Hersch on the sale of the Common Cause during the year. .

The business of the Annual Council Meeting was then considered, and this occupied the remainder of the sitting.
