REPORT.

THE number of resident students in Trinity Term, 1919, was 405, an increase of 15 on the highest number yet recorded. Seventy-three students were placed in the class-lists. One Research Certificate in Science was awarded. The Council records with much regret the deaths of Miss M. E. Doyle, Society of Oxford Home-Students, who was lost in the sinking of the *Leinster*, and of Miss J. A. de B. Luard, Scholar of Lady Margaret Hall, the first woman student who has died in Oxford during Term.

The Gilchrist Studentship was awarded to Miss D. A. Paton (Somerville College), who obtained a First Class in Modern Languages (French) and intends to study in Paris and Oxford with a view to obtaining a University post.

The Margaret Evans Prize was awarded to Miss K. E. B. Byass (Somerville College), *proxime accessit* Miss Z. F. M. J. T. B. L. Lindo (St. Hugh's College), and the Mathematical Prize to Miss G. Gaisford (Somerville College). The French Prize was not awarded. Mr. Stampa examined for the Margaret Evans Prize, Mrs. Norman McKeown for the French Prize.

Miss Burrows has ceased to be a member of the Council on her resignation of the Principalship of St. Hilda's Hall, and her place has been taken by Miss W. H. Moberly.

The Council also records with regret the death of Professor Haverfield, who had been a member of Council since 1911.

Mr. Nagel has again kindly acted as auditor.

On November 20, 1879, the Council (then styled Committee) presented its first report to the Association, which had been founded in June 1878. The number of lectures and classes available for students at that time was eight, and the largest number attending any one of them was eighteen. The lectures were given in a room over a baker's shop in Little Clarendon Street. The students did not attend any College lectures, and were not admitted to any of the degree examinations, but only to examinations (Pass

and Honour) specially arranged for women by the Delegates for Local Examinations. There were nine students resident at Lady Margaret Hall, twelve at Somerville Hall (now Somerville College), and twenty-five under the special care of the Hon. Secretary, Mrs. T. H. Green, and of the Committee. The reports of the last forty years are a record of educational development and progress which even the war of 1914-19 has not checked, and which have fully justified the venture of the early friends of Women's University Education in Oxford. Of these Mrs. Green and Mrs. Johnson have been continuously members of the Council from the beginning and Miss Rogers since November 1879. These reports have chronicled an increase in the number of students to over 400, the opening of University and College lectures to them, their admission to nearly all the examinations qualifying for degrees, the foundation of two additional Colleges, the development of the Society of Oxford Home-Students, the formal recognition of the five Societies by the University, the appointment of a Delegacy for the supervision of Women Students, the registration of the students under its authority, and finally the admission of women duly qualified by examination and residence to the University Parliamentary franchise. The Council looks forward with confidence to recording at no very distant date the admission of women to matriculation in the University and their admission to its degrees.

At the date of this report the total number of resident students is 548.

(A) REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

1. *Bertha Johnson Loan Fund and Poor Students' Fund* *Joint Committee.*

The Committee has advanced £170 to various students during the year and has had £217 1s. 4d. repaid to it. The money received from the Ethel Simon Fund and from Returned Fees has been equally divided between the five Recognized Societies to be given to students in need of assistance.

2. *Nettleship Library Committee.*

The Committee met six times in this year. About £130 has been spent on books as against £115 last year. The number of volumes has increased from 7,858 to 8,111. Thirteen duplicate volumes have been sold. In the three Terms 3,554 volumes have been taken out, but only about 1,800 taken away for Vacation reading owing to railway restrictions. The increased proportion of Somerville Students using the Library shows that it has to some extent bridged the difficulties arising from their temporary move to Oriel. The usefulness of the Library would be greatly increased if there were more accommodation both for books and for readers. The rather large balance is due to the delay in obtaining books which have been ordered. The Norham Hall collection lent by Mrs. Burch during the war has been returned. The Committee wish to express their thanks for gifts of books from Mr. R. L. Poole, Miss Ottley, Sir A. de Horsey, Dr. Watson, and Dr. Sanday.
